
Welcome to the third annual Midwest Seminar-Clinic for Practitioners of the Sartin Handicapping Methodology.

IN PRESENTING THIS EXPANDED CHICAGO SEMINAR WORKBOOK WE EDITED OUT NOTHING FROM THE ORIGINAL. SOME OF THE MATERIAL IS OF NO PARTICULAR BENEFIT TO IMPROVING HANDICAPPING SKILLS, SUCH AS THE DAILY AGENDA AND THE WELCOMING MESSAGE. They were left in to give you a sense of the ambiance of a seminar and the activities that are included. To compensate for a few pages of fluff we have added a number of pages that should be of real value. These added pages represent some of the text of remarks made by the principal speaker and some follow-up data that the attendees found very helpful in improving their skills

Some of the heretofore unpublished materials include Richard Quigley's color-coded form cycle, Converting the stretch call to a viable handicapping tool, The Bregar Regression Form to be used in conjunction with the Brohamer Model and the picking of the Preakness winner and Exacta-done two days before the fact and committed to paper. (a dangerous excursion)

In answer to your oft-asked questions of how to convert distances over a mile and 3/16th into useable pace-lines, we have done so by hand with the contenders in the 1985 PREMIER HANDCIAP(HOLL). We also demonstrated that the process was unnecessary, since we were able to select the exact order of finish in the Kentucky Derby by taking all the contenders off a common distance UNDER a mile and 3/16th.

On (original) page 29 we have a race exemplifying a handicapping procedure most often overlooked by many clients. i.e, using a pace line that is two back from today BECAUSE A CONTENDER FLASHED EARLY PACE THROUGH THE SECOND CALL (or beyond) IN ITS LAST RACE AND THEN DROPPED BACK..Correctly analyzing the pace line selection for the horse, BEAUFORT, in this lesson will yield you some high returns.

SEMINARS HAVE ALWAYS PROVED TO BE ENORMOUS CATALYSTS TO THOSE IN ATTENDANCE- as witness countless letters to that effect from clients throughout North America.

We trust that some of the seminar benefits can be passed along to YOU through this manual.

WHEN WE BEGAN OUR SAFARI INTO THE DARK JUNGLE OF HANDICAPPING BACK in 1975, our friendly native guides were Ray Taulbot, Hugh Matheson, Huey Mahl and Tom Ainslie. Even then, Mr. Ainslie was known as THE DEAN OF HANDICAPPING WRITERS. A slick writing style and a highly regarded publishing house contributed to the acquiring of DEAN status as Ainslie was less an innovator than he was an historian-editor chronicling the contributions of others. His Encyclopedia, for example, was a far more useful tool than his PRIVATE METHOD.

Still, he is a venerable figure in our esoteric world. So it ~~came~~ as a flattering surprise to me when he gave us favorable, although anonymous, mention in his latest book. We know that he is referring to us because we are the only 'group' doing what he makes reference to, and because 'the friend' who gave it him was Dr. William Quirin who told us about it.

One thing about the "IN GROUP" who headed up Handicapping EXPO '83 and '84, and directed in its inception by Ainslie, they are independent thinkers, immune from pirating the works of others, yet respectful of the contributions of anyone, regardless of fame or status. The group is now spearheaded by Quirin, James Quinn, Bonnie Ledbetter and Andy Beyer. To have been included in such auspicious company, even for three days, at EXPO '84, was for me both a surprise and a genuine thrill.

Now we have made the DEAN'S LIST.

YOU are a vital part of the group to which he refers. You are ONE of (at this writing) 619 persons who are applying the concepts of feet-per-second velocity in relationship to the win energy factors demanded by individual tracks. Most of you are taking good advantage of Institute and Pirco research and instruction and are winning consistently. A few of you have yet to get a full handle on the material but WILL before this seminar ends. All of you want to improve. That's why ALL OF US, INCLUDING MYSELF, are here: to grow through interpersonal contact with each other.

Together we will grow in stature but, as I promised, never grow in number beyond the arbitrary limit I have imposed, One Thousand.

TOM AINSLIE On The SARTIN METHODOLOGY Feet Per Second: Pace

A friend recently showed me some pace-handicapping literature by a group that obviously had given the matter a lot of thought. They favor algebraic pace and final-time formulas that vary with their notion of whether the track favors early speed or late speed or is comparatively neutral. They program the equations into hand-held calculators* which print out the ratings on demand.

On a speed-favoring strip, the calculators attach greater weight to the early-pace numbers and less to the final time. At the opposite extreme, more weight goes to final(FRACTION) time and less to early speed. The calculations are in feet per second. As observed before, I think that feet-per-second figures may have a real future in handicapping.

THE PRIME PURPOSE OF THIS SEMINAR IS NOT SO MUCH TO INSTRUCT YOU IN THE ART AND SCIENCE OF HANDICAPPING, *per se*, but rather to engage you in an interpersonal group relationship that will ultimately make you, in fact, WINNERS! The process is necessary but the end-result is the quintessential goal.

Handicapping Lessons abound. There are as many procedures for SELECTING winners as there are ways of skinning a cat. Some of them even work. But winning a few races and winning AT the races can be two entirely different matters. Winning more races than you lose is a first step. But ours is not a numbers game. It is an investment program. Making consistent and DEPENDABLE profit is our true goal. Investing in horse racing for PROFIT goes beyond the selection process. It happens only when the selector him/herself is in harmony with the realities of ALL the notes and instruments involved in orchestrating the symphony of handicapping successs. First we manage the selection process, then we manage our money. Uppermost, we must learn to manage OURSELVES! WINNING CONSISTENTLY requires an emotional, psychological protocol that does NOT come naturally.

We are sprung from a social ethic that declares we "are conceived in sin and born of iniquity." None of us are immune to this message. None of us have failed to receive it in one form or another. It is both our curse and our crutch of salvation, excusing our shortcomings through the medium of original sin.

We are a part of a social structure wherein a book entitled BORN TO WIN sold but a few thousand copies,while a song called BORN TO LOSE sold many millions.

We are born neither to win nor to lose.

Both processes must be learned.Unfortunately children learn NEGATIVE lessons far more readily than POSITIVE ones. WHY? Because despite positive verbal injunctions from our environment the true, underlying message is more often the opposite. We are told that truth and goodness are right but the society telling us this seems bent on self-destruction in an atmosphere of chicanery and deception.

While the proverbial 'mom' is telling us to "BE GOOD" -be kind, be gentle, she may, at the same time, be re-enforcing the message with a slap or a spanking while crying out her woes, fighting with dad and spreading malicious gossip about the neighbors. The have-nots are always the decent, honest-but-poor folk while the 'haves' are greedy pirates unscrupulously using others for their own benefit. The 'be good' message is somehow lost in the face of so much contrary reality.

"Children should be seen, not heard.....

"don't touch.....Not for kids.....Don't ask....Don't ask...
Becasue I said so, that's why.....How dare you talk back to me!
Just do as you're told and don't ask question. (do as I say,
not as I do) Try...try...try hard...try harder....(seldom DO.)
Don't drink (don't think)(guzzle, guzzle)

Don't touch it..you'll go blind.....But where do babies come from?

Don't ask....not for children....."

Message after message....but the example and the message seldom coincide. We learn not from verbal messages but from example. We are the ambivalent by-product of contradiction; subscribing to the verbal message but yielding to the example.

Isn't it a bit tragic that at a time in our lives -youth- when we seek so many answers, they are not forthcoming. Yet when we grow older we lose our insatiable thirst for answers even though they are so much more easily available?

The human product of our kind of social environment is a person whose capacities are what we refer to as vertical, as opposed to lateral or linear. Vertical success is pre-eminance in a single line of endeavor. Specialization in a given area, sacrificing the broad scope of life. Gone is the Renaissance man. With us is the plumber who does sinks but not toilets, the dentist who fills but does not extract, the Eye, Ear,Nose throat man who cannot diagnose in-grown-toenails, the cardio-vascular specialist who cannot(will not) deliver babies. Etc, etc. More pronounced in this monophyletic structure are examples of persons singularly prominent in a given field who are completely - naively- ignorant in the liberal arts or of the 'street smarts' common to the masses.

Vertical success implies the channeling of energy into a narrow tube and directing toward a single target. A bullet as opposed to buckshot. To be effective this personality harnessing must begin at an early age; tunnel vision is an acquired thing, not a natural phenomenon. Advocates of monomania declare that the rest of us are dilettantes. Their battle-cry is against those who know a little bit about everything but ALL about nothing.

What does all this have to do with successful handicapping? To begin with learning to be a truly successful handicapper requires a sense of logic and proportion uncommon to our environmental training. It demands self-re-programming, casting aside the demons of conventional myths and fallacies. While dedication and direction are certainly needed, it is not an avocation for the vertical minded. There is no single factor that if totally absorbed will bring success. One must be linear and use a wide-angle lense to view the total picture at all times. Ours is a dilettantes paradise. Tunnel vision not allowed. It is a Mecca for those who always suspected that their parents, teachers and preachers were lying to them. Without malice, of course, but lying - if only a little bit (for your own good)

Having rebelled against falsehood at an early age you will find it easy to discount the falsehoods that have been -and continue to be- promulgated among handicappers. Ours is a field abounding in myths. Many of them were authored by bookies in the pre-totalizator days. Others were spawned by the contagion of ignorance. Others come from the pulpits of moralists defaming Horse Racing as gambling even as a wheel of fortune or shot in the dark. If all of life is a gamble then horse racing qualifies. Of course if one wishes it so horse race investment can always be a gamble. Just as driving a car and crossing a street is a gamble, some people are hell-bent to make them even more so by the manner in which they drive or by crossing the street against the light.

I had a client who was crying out for help - but with the admonition that I give him none of my "pep talks", which, he declared, turned his stomach . By pep talks he meant these excursions into the psychological and moral aspects of human behavior. He disdained my therapeutic, religionist approach to the problem of losing.

He wanted -or so he declared- only factual, step-by-step procedural progressions. Notwithstanding the fact that he had had all these via manuals, seminar, tutoring from some of the best, HE WANTED MORE OF THE SAME. More and more until he became a winner. He failed to grasp the fact that he needed not handicapping instruction but self-esteem, self-determination therapy - the very things that turned his stomach. The prospect of being re-parented, of altering his persona through new affirmations was abhorrent to him because of symbiosis, or a refusal to allow the severing of the emotional Umbilical Cord. His perception of his well-being demanded that it remain in tact. So he could not-would not- break the bonds with ancient injunctions and myths, with bogey-men and demons. They have become his constant companions. He is a very depressed, insecure person in dire need of re-programming but he fears the world he knows not more than the tragic world he knows. For him successful handicapping is self-delusion: an excursion into a never-never-land of easy wealth and insulation from reality. It is a world he will never find, at least in a sane state, unless he forsakes his crutch and takes his chances with reality.

My most successful clients are those who DO benefit from the so-called pep talks and who constantly take stock of themselves, their attitudes and evaluations. They know that while one may never forget how to ride a bicycle, once learned, it takes regular practice to be an affirmative, self-determined human. This comes from constant doing - not remembering.

We hear a lot about "handicapping secrets." There are no secrets. Everything you need know to be a successful handicapper is contained in the Racing Form. And I DO mean EVERYTHING. Being able to view the tote board and observe the body language of horses are (or can be, properly used) added bonuses; but nothing more. So-called inside information is more of a hazard than a boon. What some refer to as a secret is merely dissemination and compounding or isolating of the information in the Racing Form. Any secret thus derived lies in the ability of a given person to synthesize such information into a factor that when activated at the betting window shows a profit.

Though I'm fascinated by the personalities and conversations of trainers and jockeys I've met, I never look at their names where they appear in the past performance lines of horses I am handicapping. Were the horse I'm evaluating not adequately trained and ridden it would not have a pace line worthy of consideration. So, in that sense, I've already eliminated the bad trainers and/or jockeys. How you approach the subject is up to you. I'm not on a crusade in the matter.

I am, however, intrigued by certain persons I know whose sole basis for wagering is TRAINER STATS, fortelling trainer "maneuvers," intent, et al. Trainers themselves put little stock in such stats and they laugh at some of the cunning moves ascribed to them. By and large these professionals have a true perspective of their part in the scheme of things. Not so their chroniclers. To them trainers and jockeys are in complete control of racing. This conviction stems from factors in their own nature. Almost without exclusion, such persons are either manipulators or believers in the supreme power of manipulation. HUMAN MANIPULATION. Anything that cannot be controlled by humans is a threat to them. The thought that some dumb animal might, through its own ability, determine the outcome of a horse race, offends their sense of human superiority.(personal superiority) I've never met one of these people, and I know most of them, who could handicap worth a damn. They write excellent books, methods and studies, but they fail at the wagering window because they refuse to accept the fact that they should be betting on horses rather than people.
So when I hear fans shouting at jockeys...blessing or cursing them, usually the latter, I know I'm hearing the pent up outrage of a believer in the manipulation conspiracy flaying away at a world that dared violate his cherished mythology. Cursing the jockey and admonishing the trainer are common last resorts for those who lose because they failed to handicap the real athletes in the contest:
The horses themselves.

While on the subject of Trainers/Jockeys,
Here are some figures that might be of interest:

Whenever we are tempted to bet on Jockeys and/or Trainers as opposed to Horses, we should consider the facts made glaringly obvious by the "LEADERS" data in the nationwide stats contained in the following item: (through Aug. 11, 1985)

The "leading rider" was Pincay with 23% winners. Next was McCarron with 19.8%. However Randy Romero had the highest percent of winners: 23.2%. The "leading trainer" was Wayne Lukas with 20.1%. Our friend, the venerable Charlie Whittingham, was second with only 14.5%. These are monies won stats. Actually the best percentage trainer was BROTHERS with 31.8% - and that's truly the kind of trainer we should take note of. Lukas, with 691 mounts to the gate in seven and a half months must be looked upon as an executive chef - not the cook. I would suspect that he wouldn't recognize most of his charges if he were to meet them walking down the street.

NOW LOOK AT THE TOP HORSES! The LEAST successful of these has a win percentage of 33.3%; the best: 77.7%. The average is: 44.57%!

So which is the better bet?

While I realize that it can be argued that the Trainers and Jockeys were called upon far more often to perform than were the horses, it can also be argued that this gave them that much more opportunity to demonstrate their skills.

I mean no denegration of Trainers or Jockeys —but I'll STILL BET on the best HORSES!



IN THE DISTANT PAST, ALL OF TWO YEARS AGO, PROSPECTIVE CLIENTS Were often dubious about the prospect of winning the 63% of the races that we assured them was our minimum standard with the Methodology. Even playing two horses they felt this was an astronomical goal. Even today a few have failed to reach that goal. In most cases it is because they hold out for much higher mutuels. Some clients receiving average mutuels of from \$14 to \$17 are more than happy with 57% winners. They are also conditioned to accept longer losing streaks than most people are comfortable with. Losing streaks are the biggest single factor in upsetting the emotional equanimity of any investor, but especially the pari-mutuel fund investor. Losing streaks are largely responsible for the rash of mostly worthless systems that flood the market. When he was editor of Systems & Methods, Huey Mahl determined that the average life of a system was 4.7 days. Why? because most of us are unable to sustain more than three consecutive losses without straying from the system or method we are using. Because the spectre of Thantos lurks darkly in the sub-conscious of virtually every "horseplayer" it takes but little adversity to bring it to the surface. For this reason we advocated from the beginning playing TWO horses which, except for the very inept, became ~~a~~ solution to losing streaks in excess of three in a row.

Winning but 63% of the races played - wagering on two horses- is in reality a very small advantage over the general public. One should not be content with this percentage. 70% and over is not unrealistic.

Let us examine the record:

The public, en masse, manages to win a universal average of 32% of all races with ONE HORSE. We refer to this as the public favorite, comparable to our number ONE figure horse. The public's 2nd choice wins an average of 17% of the time, year in, year out. This-comparable to our 2nd numerical horse. Hence the public's top TWO win 49% of the time. And that's MINIMUM.

NOW let's consider some FACTS concerning that general PUBLIC.



In recent months the newspapers and television have been doing some rather sensationalist stories revealing facts that psychologists and educators have known for decades:

OVER 25% of the American A D U L T population is Illiterate.
Totally, functionally illiterate.

Of the remaining 75% who are considered literate 66.6% cannot meet minimal College Entrance standards because of an inability to reason cogitatively. Cogitative reasoning is essential to successful handicapping. Now, fortunately the 25% who cannot read or write and the 66.6% who can't cogitate are not inter-related. In fact most illiterate people reason very well. Perhaps it is a compensatory factor. No matter how generously we might view these facts, the general public's track record has a very shaky intellectual base. ALL WE HAVE TO DO is become 7% more effective with each of our top TWO selections. 7% better than a public plagued with illiteracy and reasoning problems. That is not much to shoot for. We are actively searching for TWO contenders, the public is not. As the graph on the opposite page shows, a 7% per contender improvement over the public record gives us a two-horse win proficiency of 63%.

Perhaps you will now understand why I say this is our MINIMUM STANDARD.

In a forthcoming book, author Dick Mitchell explores TEN MYTHS that horseplayers live (and die) by. We have examined most of these in the past but never in such depth or painstaking detail. In exploring the nature of the poison, Mitchell also provides the antedote. He supplants each myth with a counterpunctual fact.

So, while taking away a cumbersome, non-supportive crutch, he provides his readers with new legs that they can run on.

Although a brilliant philosopher, Mitchell's primary field is most practical. MONEY MANAGEMENT. This is an art and science that is completely ignored by the general public and semi-ignored by even the more astute members of the handicapping fraternity.

If any of US cannot surpass the ability of the general public by AT LEAST 7% per contender (top two) it is quite probable that the explanation lies in the adherence to one or all of Mitchell's Ten Myths.

Another brilliant author, James Quinn, has explored another of our pet themes (totally independent of any inspiration by us, incidentally) That being insight and/or intuition; both of which are by-products of cogitative reasoning. If we know the facts and are capable of applying them with minimal deviation, our subconscious will, in its own time, absorb them and make certain judgements autonomously. Our subconscious- a third eye- will recognize factors in past performance lines that previously may have taken as long as an hour for us to consciously deduce. But it will accomplish the task in seconds. We wrote several years ago about this phenomenon in relationship to pace-line selection. Many who refused to believe it then, now confirm that it DID happen-but only when the mind was ready.

DO NOT try to rush it.

QUINN's Book, "High Tech Handicapping in the Information Age" will be published by Wm. Morrow.(Jan 1986 release)

Yet a third pundit, Mark Cramer, horse racing Editor for GAMBLING TIMES, explains our -or any- advantage over the general public's, through the term Information Gap. He maintains that at one time Beyer-Jones, et al speed handicappers had a big edge because there was a gap between the knowledge conveyed by these Speed (final) time experts and the public's general knowledge. When their information became wide-spread and garnered by the masses, the concept lost its punch. Horses that formally paid in double digits were now being made odds-on favorites. Cramer feels that our method, disseminated to a mass audience, as was Beyer's and Gordon Jones's, would suffer the same fate. According to Cramer, for each person buying the method there are five who get it through friendly sharing, piracy or perhaps even osmosis. We sensed this long ago which is why we purposefully made our manuals complex and difficult to immediately absorb. It is also the reason why we never relent in our on-going research; constantly developing new and improved manuals and programs at least five years in advance of ourselves. This also explains our vow to hold our membership to the limit of 1,000.

Clients whose sense of Generosity inclines them to be profligate with their copies of the Method should realize that they are only diminishing the size of their own prospective mutuels.

On the brighter side of this same picture we refer back to our discourse on America's propensity to vertical mindedness: the isolation of a single factor. Speed-final time- handicapping lends itself to this predisposition; so does Class Handicapping. Our method never employs less than six distinct components, and as many as eleven. So it should take the public at least six to eleven times as long to catch up. The pirates will never be more than a year behind. One nice thing about pirates in the computer age, they all have the kind of egos that compel them to make little changes in our material. They will add or subtract or alter our programs just enough to make them impotent. Even some of our own well-intentioned people like to dicker. This is an admirable trait and only becomes dangerous when they pass along the results of their tampering to others who are not aware until it's too late that they had a maverick edition. If I spent as little time developing the method as these people have "re-developing" it I would be out to pasture in a moment. I have yet to find a pirated or "improved" version that works.

If handicapping success were a product of information in itself the public would be winning at least 55% of the time with ONE HORSE. Look at all the information available. Hundreds of GOOD public handicappers writing for the newspapers. (a few bad ones, too) A panel of experts writing selections for the Daily Racing Form. I met the man who is SWEEPS for the Western Edition. He's a GREAT handicapper -though overworked. He uses incremental fractional times along with final time as his selection criteria. Then there are daily seminars conducted by some formidable experts: Two time Nevada Handicapping contest winner, Lee Russo in Southern California, Ron Cox in the San Francisco Bay area, Scott Mc Mannis in Chicago. Just a FEW of the experts sharing their skills and daily selections for a pittance. There are many more I failed to mention. Then there are the Tipster Cards sold in front of the entrance to most tracks. Laugh at BOB or LAWTON, et al if you will, but their Top Three are a lot more reliable than hat pins. No, it is not a dearth of information that keeps 96.5% of the race-goers in the red.

THEN WHAT IS IT?

N-14

The answer lies in the fundamental nature of man. The inclination to misinterpret reality, to endow any set of facts with unreasoning subjectivity and an uncanny ability to, when given a 50-50 chance, choose the wrong side of the coin. Public and private selectors alike tend to give out THREE selections per race. The statistic showing that the public 1st choice wins about a third of the races is testimony that the public chooses in direct proportion to the odds in their favor - one of three. These are the same odds we get playing the dozens or columns in Roulette, but with a guaranteed 2 to 1 payoff and with absolutely NO information. In analyzing the statistics for public prowess we see absolutely no weighting for judgement, intuition or 'further selectivity.' They may as well be playing Roulette where the odds are dictated by the house and not by them -the public. To give a SINGLE example of typical 'horseplayer' response I cite a day when I weakened from my standard position and responded to the eternal question "who do you like?" with six winners in seven races,(two horses in each race.) At the end of the day the persons who asked the question each had but two winners, NOT SIX. Why? They either ignored my selections or picked the OTHER horse in a field of TWO...because betting TWO horses meant betting "against yourself." Phooey. I won several hundred dollars that day. They lost about as much. So, even with MY information they wound up giving me my profit since, in effect, it was THEIR MONEY I had won.

No, it is not Information, or the lack of it, that prevents the public from winning. It is INSPIRATION. Inspiration is the mother of aspiration. Aspiration leads to dedication. Dedication is the hand-maiden of concerted effort which is what it takes to win-at anything.

This is why we temper the information in our manuals and seminars with motivational intrusions. **It** is why we regale you with tales told by our winners. To inspire you that IT CAN BE DONE. IT IS BEING DONE. AND IT WILL BE DONE...BY YOU!

THE MARTIN-SARTIN ACID TEST

In 1981 Darrell Martin, then Research Director for the institute, and I decided to Put the Phase III Methodology to the Acid Test. Armed only with a TI-59 and two hand-held calculators and a ONE HUNDRED DOLLAR bankroll, we went to Calexico, Calif. with the resolve to triple our bankroll before returning home. To make the test more interesting we took only \$20 each in expense monies. We shared a cheap motel room but arbitrarily set the hotel fee at \$300 in our fancy so that by our own ground-rules we HAD to triple our bank or be jailed for defrauding an Innkeeper. For five days we ate nothing except hot dogs and take-out chicken by the bucket which we stored and savored. No booze, no frills; even our coffee drinking was confined to the little packets of instant provided by the motel.

Our first bet was five dollars: \$3 on the low-odds and \$2 on the high odds horse. At one time our bankroll was down to \$16. But by the end of the fifth day of Play we had a total of \$328 and five pieces of leftover cold chicken. We were Playing the Mexican Foreign Book at Mexicali, an easy walk across the border with five tracks to choose from. At a single track, Paying admission, et al, we could never have done it. The Point of this story is that if ALL of us would impose stringent goals on ourselves that we were honor-bound to achieve, we would fare much better than we will "taking a flier" at the track. If you HAVE to do it you won't be making bets on negatively playable races, daily doubles and wild exotics. Allow yourself a Gambler's luxury of losing by "Playing" the horses and your sub-conscious will take full advantage of that luxury. Make no mistake about it.

Union coach switching to four-legged fillies

Jim Bradshaw will be jumping tracks — from girls' high school to horse racing — when he retires sometime in the next eight months after coaching for 28 years.

Bradshaw, 54, has received national recognition as the girls' cross country track coach at Union High School, where he has won six state cross country championships.

He plans to retire in May, at the completion of the school year, or in December following another semester at his current teaching-coaching duties.

"SINCE I WAS 5 years old, people have been telling me what to do," Bradshaw said Friday while watching his Union team compete in the Central Bill Lantz Memorial Track and Field meet at Webster High School. "They've told me what to do, where to go. Finally, you just get to the point where you want to do what you want to do, and that time is now."

Bradshaw plans to use that time doing what he enjoys the most — watching

horses run and handicapping the races at horse racing tracks instead of schools run and handicapping the races at schools where high school athletes compete.

"I view racing is like an athletic event," Bradshaw said. "When I first came to Broken Arrow, we had a 'force' racing team set a pattern in the distance races. Athletes I think my being around track and field athletes for so long will help in teaching this methodology."

"I'm sure I will miss not coaching next year, but I think my other interest will keep me more than busy."

"I first got intrigued with (retired California psychologist) Dr. Howard Sartin's methodology on handicapping races when I attended one of his seminars in New Orleans in February of 1984," said Bradshaw, who was principal for 15 years at Union elementary and junior high schools before going into coaching full-time.



Dick Quigley's Condition Factors

POSITIVE FACTORS:-----

1- EARLY PACE: First Fraction

Velocity, more than any other fraction, represents a horse's ACTUAL condition. When a contender's FIRST CALL velocity is the highest in the race - or within .69 f/P/s of the highest in the race, AND is no more than .45 f/P/s behind the highest 2nd CALL velocity in the race, it qualifies under EARLY PACE. ALLOWING for Possible GATE Problems, accept a contender within .66 f/P/s of the FASTEST contender at the 2nd CALL, IF it was within .36 f/P/s of the fastest time in the race at the STRETCH CALL.

(see: FIGURING THE STRETCH CALL, Next.) 2-When a contender maintains its Early Velocity ranking to the Stretch Call it is an even MORE Positive sign. (Note, all velocities should be adjusted by applicable variant figure.)

The stretch call is 1/8th of a mile from the finish AT ALL DISTANCES. The formula for determining velocity to this call is as follows:

Distance in feet of total race divided by the PACE OF RACE time. = ?

Distance in feet of race minus 660. Enter this as Race Distance. Figure horse beaten lengths to the stretch call:

Example:

5 furlongs=3960 feet

less 660 feet = 3300 ft.

3300 feet = 5 furlongs.

Enter as a 5 furlong race. Follow the exact procedure you now use in entering a horse BUT instead of using FINAL BEATEN lengths, use the STRETCH CALL Beaten lengths.

3: GAIN: When a horse GAINS VELOCITY over the PACE OF THE RACE in the Second or third fraction - or both, PROVIDING the gain in f/P/s

Example:

1st Frac. Loss = 5.0 2nd Frac. Loss=.40
POR 60 57.80 52.80 3rd Frac. Gain, only = .20
POH 57 57.40 53.00 THIS IS NOT GOOD. The horse was 3 f/P/s
behind at first call; gained but .20 at finish.

Example 2: 2nd Frac. Gain = .16
POR 60 57.80 52.80 3rd Frac. Gain = .44
POH 57 57.96 53.24

This is GOOD. The horse started gaining on the PACE of the RACE early and continued to gain thereafter.

4: RECENT WORKOUT: Regular interval workouts are the most significant, but a RECENT (within 6 days) workout of 5 or 6 furlongs is meaningful when a horse has shown little in last two races.

5: CLASS DROP: When a horse is returning to a Claiming or Allowance level at which it did well (win, Place show or 4th) beware. If no such race is showing, look for a 40% drop in claiming value or Purse (AN) PROVIDING the animal shows AT LEAST one other Positive Factor.

6: DISTANCE SWITCH: ROUTES last and 2nd call (.75 Mi.) was within 3 5ths of a second of the best of today's Sprinter's FINAL TIME, apply Alternate Sprint to Route Procedure. (See Manuals)

SPRINT LAST, Route Today: True Speed is at least 2.10 f/P/s GREATER than today's best Router's final true speed, AND contender SET or GAINED on the final Fraction PACE OF RACE. OTHERWISE ask for a final sprint velocity at least 2.45 Greater than today's best Router.

7: CLOSE UP: When a contender stays within .25 f/P/s of the PACE OF THE RACE at no less than 2 of 3 calls in last race, REGARDLESS of PACE times or of final time.

8: PEAKING: when a contender's fractional velocities are equal to, better or within .20 of the f/P/s velocities of its last GOOD EFFORT (Win or Place) regardless of the Pace of its last race.

9: PACE RACE: Horse set or forced the Pace in either of its last two races and maintained this condition to the stretch call but did not win. (See #2, Stretch Call.)

10: WIN:led or was within .25 f/P/s at stretch call. Wins by 2 or more. Most likely sign of repeat win. PROVIDING 2nd call velocity was within .45 f/P/s of the best of today's competition.

11: 2nd Place Finish (or 3rd if within 3/4 length of Place Last.): Gained on Pace of Race from Second FRACTION to finish and was within .45 f/P/s of winner last or next to last. PROVIDING today's Class Level is acceptable.

NEGATIVE FACTORS

When a contender does not show at LEAST one Positive Factor. Two Positive factors are Preferable and since the Positive Factors are inter-related, most "in-form" horses will show two or more.

ELIMINATIONS

- #1 - ELIMINATE CLASS RISER SUCH AS MDN CLM TO STRAIGHT RACES - MDN CLM TO MSW - MDS TO ALW
- #2 - 50% CLASS RISERS UNLESS EQUAL TO OR HIGHER THAN TODAY'S PURSE
- #3 - A.P.V. UNDER 54% OF TODAY'S PURSE.

SUE SEDGWICKS SIMPLE ELIMINATORS

Parenthetically, we insert these here for your consideration. While, in fact, incredibly simple, they have proved effective for two decades:

- 1: Looking at the LAST THREE RACES OF THE CONTENDER,
 - 2-Races were run in the last 65 days. 3- TO QUALIFY, a horse must have finished first, second, third, 4th OR Within 6½ lengths of the WINNER in TWO of those three races.
You can go back more than THREE Races IF: Trouble Line (s)
Horse has been running at a class level substantially over its head and is returning today to a level WHERE IT CONSISTENTLY DID WELL - or to a Track Class Level where it did well.
If its last three races were at a Distance where the horse showed no ability and TODAY IT IS RETURNING TO A DISTANCE WHERE IT CONSISTENTLY DID WELL.

TIME-DATE CONSIDERATIONS

- #1 - ELIMINATE LOW CLASS OR MED CLASS HORSES NOT OUT WITHIN 30 DAYS.
- #2 - HIGH CLASS HORSES CAN WIN IF NO RED CYCLE BUT OUT WITHIN 60 DAYS
- #3 - STAKE HORSES WIN OFTEN FROM WORKOUTS SO NO DATE CONSIDERATION NECESSARY. YOU CAN GO TO THE BLUE CYCLE FOR A PACE LINE.

WHAT CONSTITUTES LOW OR MEDIUM CLASS AT YOUR TRACK? ASK DICK.

LONGSHOTS

LONGSHOTS COME FROM EARLY SPEED WAKE UP TYPE RACES, LASTOUT IN RED CYCLE & PACE LINE FOUND IN GREEN CYCLE, WITH JOCKEY COME BACK OR SIGNIFICANT JOCKEY-SWITCH.

EXAMPLE-LAYOFF OR OFF FORM IN RED CYCLE GOOD RACE AT A TRACK OF ABOUT THE SAME CLASS OR BETTER IN THE GREEN CYCLE.

Saturday, March 30, 1985 was a banner day for Glenn Smock, beginning with this first race at Santa Anita. It had been raining and the track was a trifle off. However it showed little early or late bias. It was in fact running what we used to call average. Under such circumstances 3 is an ideal ranking, Early and Sustained. Our old 3-3-3 and 3-3-X line scores that produced so many long-shots, reflected this condition. You will note that the winner had a Early Pace Ranking of 4 and Sustained: 3. Eliminating Adrianus, which the computer ultimately did, the winner was a 3-3 Early/Sustained and number 1 in Ultrascan. Glenn won this quinella because he has learned that when seeking the Place horse one does not eliminate contenders because of lower class. Neither does he eliminate extremely HIGH class ranked horses because of a slower Pace. It is from these two categories that most of the high Priced Place horses come.

Pizzolla, Purdy and Sartin, thinking about WIN HORSE eliminations, discarded SAVOUR. We had the winner but NOT the quinella. Smock left SAVOUR in, believed his numbers and collected the maximum Las Vegas Quinella Payoff, 100 to 1.

EXPLORING THE OPENING DAY MYTH

It happened to three of us on opening day at Hollywood Park, 1985--April 24.

The culprits were Stede George on a California business trip, Glenn Smock and myself. It was opening day and we decided to have a festive time. Box seats -- Pavilion of Stars, a luxury lunch and little application of sense.

On a few occasions, by accident, we had the winners -IN FACT! But mostly we were betting against the Method-taking FLYERS. After each race we lost money on, Glenn Smock would comment: "The computer had that horse in the top two." Or, "The winner was third top figure but had the best Sustained Pace." (Sustained was the decided bias)

About the seventh race I decided to shape up so we actually won the final three races with Glenn and Stede sharing an Exacta on the 9th. But the lesson of that day will be this Next lesson/assignment: Pick the winner in at least five of the six non-maiden races on the card!

An interesting sidelight on this opening day afternoon: Stede George was entertaining a business client and his wife. She proclaimed that she had NEVER won at the races and would give anything to win just once. So Stede gave her all the logical choices..NOT the ones he bet. The result: She ended up winning money in EVERY SINGLE RACE. She is convinced that Stede is a handicapping genius. Which, of course, he is--especially on those occasions when he bets his choices instead of his hunches. Even as Glenn and I who were equally guilty.

LESSON/ASSIGNMENTS

- 1-Pace Line Selection -April 24th races, HOLL.
- 2-APPLY the Internal Fraction Route to Sprint technique to Sonrisa George, Hawkley and Party Leader in the 7th Race.
- 3-Do a Sprint WIN ENERGY Profile for the second, fourth and seventh races.
- 4-Do an energy analysis-- One Mile TURF, using the Sixth and eighth races.
- 5-Get out your hand calculator. Figure the f/P's fractional velocities of the top contenders in race # 8. First WHO are the top contenders.
- 6-Ignoring my margin figures, do a quick study A.P.V. on all the horses in the seventh race.

SOME NOTES ON CLASS

(Purse Value = Earnings)

- 1- 2 year olds often show high Purse value ratings that are not duplicated at three—or possibly ever again. Three year olds often reach maturity overnight. Earnings figures are likely to show the most dramatic increases within the 3 1/2 to 4 1/2 year old cycle.
- 2-A.P.V.'s peak at about 4 1/2 on the average and slowly decline.

CONCLUSION: A.P.V. is at its strongest as an indicator in MAIDENS, TWO-YEAR OLDS and over 3 1/2 Year olds, but UNDER 3 1/2 year olds. However, when ALL the contenders are over 4 1/2 or UNDER 3 1/2, the A.P.V.'s are relative.



THE HABIT OF WINNING

A MESSAGE FROM THE LATE VINCE LOMBARDI

Winning is not a sometime thing. You don't win once-in-a-while. You don't do things right once-in-a-while. You do them right all the time.

Winning is a habit. Unfortunately, so is losing. There is no room for second place. There is only one place in my game and that is first place. I have finished second twice in my time at Green Bay and I don't ever want to finish second again. There is a second place bowl game—but it is a game for losers played by losers. It is and always has been an American zeal to be first in anything we do, and to win, and to win, and to win.

Every time a football player goes out to play, he's got to play from the ground up. From the soles of his feet right up to his head. Every inch of him has to play. Some guys play with their heads. That's okay—you've got to be smart to be number one in any business, but more important, you've got to play with your heart. With every fiber of your body. If you are lucky enough to find a guy with a lot of head and a lot of heart, he's never going to come off the field second.

Running a football team is no different from running any other kind of organization—an army, a political party, a business. The problems are the same. The objective is to win. To beat the other guy. Maybe that sounds hard or cruel. I don't think it is.

It is a reality of life that men are competitive and the most competitive games draw the most competitive men. That's why they're there—to compete. They know the rules and the objectives when they get in the game. The objective is to win—fairly, squarely, decently, by the rules—but to win. And in truth, I have never known a man worth his salt who in the long run, deep down in his heart, did not appreciate the grind—the discipline. There is something in good men that really yearns for...needs...discipline and the harsh reality of head-to-head combat.

I don't say these things because I believe in the "brute" nature of man, or that men must be brutalized to be combative. I believe in God and I believe in human decency. But I firmly believe that any man's finest hour, his greatest fulfillment to all he holds dear, is the moment when he has worked his heart out in a good cause and lies exhausted on the field of battle victorious.
