IN THE BEGINNING, when we combined the feet-per-second velocities of the second call and third fraction to produce SUSTAINED PACE, we ceased handicapping with pure velocity and became a SYNERGISTIC Methodology. The subsequent evolution of EARLY PACE, together with FACTORS X and W established our break with contemporary concepts of speed handicapping.

Ours has incorrectly been described as a PACE handicapping procedure. In truth, it is a SYNERGISTIC method based on ENERGY EXERTION.

In developing SYNERGISM, Bob Purdy, in concert with The Inland Empire Institute and PIRCO, has raised SYNERGISTIC ENERGY to its highest level as a thoroughbred handicapping tool, offering the user the potential of results far beyond normal expectation.

SYNERGISM is the consummate PHASE III procedure.

FOREWORD

by Dick Schmidt

Just before I sat down to write this foreword, I dug out my old Synergism manual and re-read what I had written for the original version of the program. It's amazing how your attitudes can change even though you aren't aware of it. When I look back at what I wrote, and reflect on the mind set and point of view it reflects, I can see that I have come much further in the past 16 months than I was aware of traveling.

When I wrote that introduction, I still thought that there was such a thing as a Perfect Adjustment, a number that somehow would allow you to win all the races. I was still in hot pursuit of this mystic process and the perfect numbers it would produce. I knew that I couldn't produce such numbers by any process that I was aware of, and I knew that Synergism didn't do it either. Today, the whole idea seems slightly outlandish and rather naive. I have come to accept that the Perfect Number does not exist, that it is a chimera that leads handicappers on, always promising outstanding results but never attainable.

I have come to accept that there is no such thing as a Perfect Adjustment. Instead, there are Good Enough Adjustments. Numbers that work well enough that they don't get in your way when you handicap a race and maybe even help a bit. Synergism won't make you a winner,

but it will not stop you from becoming a winner either. That's saying a lot about any computer program.

So many computerized handicapping systems try to replace thinking and insight with number crunching. The underlying concept is that if enough factors are juggled in a complex enough way, a way that no human being could reasonably duplicate in a rational time period, the results must be superhuman. Such programs deny that insight and intelligence are required of the user. Just crunch them numbers and bet the overlays. Art reduced to paint-by-the-numbers.

When I first examined Synergism, I thought I saw a superior number making program. One that would keep more numbers in the air at one time and thus produce superior results. I was wrong. What Synergism offered was freedom from the numbers, freedom to concentrate on the truly important aspects of the art of handicapping. In producing Synergism, Bob Purdy has in essence liberated us from the daily drudgery of number making and allowed us to see for the first time the wonderful, ever shifting patterns of racing.

With the advent of Synergism II, both Bob and Howard feel they have taken the concepts of Velocity Analysis of racing as far as it can go. By this, they do not mean that the Perfect Number has been made at last, but rather that they have gone far enough. Another five years of tinkering and testing could undoubtedly produce a slightly Better Number, but it would not produce any better results. At last, we have not just Good Enough Numbers, but Really Damn Fine Numbers. Perfectly Adequate Numbers. Numbers that will allow you to become a winner.

At last, you can climb out of the rut of Number making and move on. Learn to use new concepts like the Match-Up, secure in the thought that your computer program will be there to cushion any errors and gently guide you towards a more complete understanding of the true dynamics of a horse race. We didn't stop improving Synergism because we ran out of ideas to try, but because we realized that it was good enough to do the job and that any further improvements would be meaningless. This works just as it stands.

Bob Purdy worked on Synergism II at a time in his life when he was in great emotional pain and turmoil. He fought his grief in part by trying to make this program perfect, by giving each one of us who would ever use it a gift of independence and happiness that a tragic accident had denied him. His caring and love are in every line of the program. As you use Synergism II to achieve your goals, take a moment once in a while to remember that it was forged for you with love.

Bob's son Sean wasn't a perfect boy and this isn't a perfect program that makes Perfect Numbers. But Sean was a Damn Fine boy. And this is a Damn Fine Program that makes Really Damn Fine Numbers. If you let it, it will set you free.

The rest is up to you.

Obviously my sentiments on this subject are going to be viewed as biased by anyone who disagrees with me. However, much evidence has been gathered from many Sartin Methodology users from a wide geographical area encompassing several major and minor league race tracks. This body of evidence overwhelmingly supports the view that automatic variants and adjustments, like those calculated in the original Synergism program and now in the more advanced Synergism II, consistently provide better results, leading to substantially more profits. These results include both higher win percentages as well as higher mutuel prices.

Since this data covers more than a fourteen month period; numerous race tracks, north, south, east and west; several individuals of various levels of skill; and every conceivable kind of horse race; it would be foolhardy for any individual to suggest that man made adjustments afford a greater opportunity for profits.

It has always been my contention that horses in any race on any given day at any race track, do not compete against "Par Times", but rather compete against the the other horses they are facing today. The power of the Synergism adjustment process, (automatically applied only to horses that need adjusting for one reason or another), lies not in "Par Times", but in the way it adjusts these horses to todays' expected "Pace of the Race".

And so, now that a preponderance of bona fide evidence substantiates our claim, we can say with full confidence, that at least as far as Synergism and Synergism II are concerned, the Automatic Variant process is far superior to any man made adjustments yet developed for use within the Sartin Methodology.

This is a very strong statement, but one you can depend on and feel confident to risk your bankroll with.

IN PARTIAL APOLOGY

All the example races in this manual are from Southern California. This is regrettable in one sense, but highly justified in another. Most workouts proving the viability of systems or methods are taken from random races where the procedure was successful. It has always been our theses that success in CONSECUTIVE races was more efficacious. What could be more consecutive than a full card? Especially when handicapped NOT by a Charter Member, but a client like yourself.

In choosing the two races that I used as examples, the criterion was routes on the turf, so I used a pair of races I had actually wagered on using Synergism II.

Suffice it to say for all of those of you not playing the Southern California circuit, Synergism II has been thoroughly tested and proven at tracks throughout the Midwest, South, Northwest, Canada and the East Coast; including New England, New York, New Jersey, Penn., Maryland and Florida. And in Oklahoma on Equitrack.

I N T R O D U C T I O N

In my years of association with Dr. Sartin and PIRCO, I traveled throughout the United States, meeting many Sartin Methodology users at seminars. It was obvious to me that I was not the only user of the method having difficulty dealing with "adjustments". When I speak of adjustments, I include all necessary adjustments required to equalize the past performance lines of our contenders. These would include Daily Track Variants, Sprint to Route, Route to Sprint, distance changes and shippers, either from another surface or another race track.

It was my opinion that, for users of the Phase III Methodology who had progressed to at least the 63% win proficiency level, adjustments still remained the largest single obstacle to climbing the win percentage ladder. In 1984, I decided to attack this problem and the roots of SYNERGISM were born. Extensive research and development continued for the next three years until August of 1987 when SYNERGISM was released.

Though my name appears on the front cover of the SYNERGISM manual, the program was not a product of my effort alone. Nor is it even my original material, but rather a synergistic combination of the genius of the Sartin Phase III methodology. Countless hours were contributed by Pirco Charter Members, as well as others and of course, the one and only Dr. Sartin. The success of this program will forever be a tribute to their generous contribution and efforts. Through a combined effort, we now have an advanced Phase III program eliminating, for all time, the requirement for all user calculated adjustments. We included the ability for the user to make "class adjustments" only as an available option.

Even before SYNERGISM was officially released, I was working on SYNERGISM II. The subject of this manual is not just an upgrade of the original SYNERGISM program, but is truly a new and superior program. The automatic adjustment formulae have been completely changed and I have added two additional factors which are very strong predictors of the outcome of the race.

SYNERGISM II is our most advanced Phase III program and will be the last velocity program of its kind to be produced by Pirco. Use it wisely and share the fruits of your labor with those close to you.

**REFLECTIONS IN A
MIRROR
SYNERGISM

Sitting here in front of my desk top computer working races with Synergism, I cannot help but reflect back to the beginning, to 1975.

Thoroughbred handicapping was in the throes of a revolution of sorts. Andrew Beyer had reformed speed handicapping to the point that with accurate par times for making daily variants, his devotees could arrive at predictive figures. Speed was king. In the New York area especially, where Beyer's par charts were available, many losers were being transformed into winners. But making par time charts was a lot of work. Most handicappers refused to do it. So Beyer's magical elixir, diluted with user laziness, produced long term cures only for the diligent.

In the same year, a former NASA engineer named Huey Mahl wrote a short 68 page book called The Race is Pace. He too had been a speed handicapper and acknowledged the regal powers of final time; but ONLY WHEN ACCURATE VARIANT FIGURES WERE APPLIED.

But pace, he said, properly utilized, could minimize the need for accurate variant figures because it used at least three elements of speed which, when correctly combined, might produce figures that ABSORBED the need for elaborately prepared par time based variants.

He supported his thesis with graphs, charts and illustrative examples. He explored form cycles, the match-up, surface and

distances changes, race conditions AND an abstraction of variant formulated by the pace of the race under consideration. Having done all this in 68 pages, he rested, leaving his readers to their own devices.

But it was enough. He had, in effect, tripled the potential power of Beyer's innovations while substantially reducing the user effort involved in the process. In short, if Mahl's hypothesis could be systematized, it might well overcome the chief stumbling block of handicappers; LAZINESS.

For reasons better explained in a psychology textbook, the overwhelming majority of self-proclaimed handicappers are in reality "horseplayers" looking for a magical number that will lead them to a pot of gold without the requisite of effort on their part. Neither Beyer nor Mahl were in the magic business.

In the late 70's and now the 80's, other sages appeared. Each, with a degree of brilliance and erudition unknown to previous generations, produced works designed to enlighten and elevate the art and science of accurately predicting the outcome of a thoroughbred race.

Steve Davidowitz, Fred Davis, further advances by Ainslie, more by Beyer; all helped stretch our horizons. Academician like Quirin, with computer-based studies that superseded all previous subjective approaches, and James Quinn, putting race conditions and class in general into universal perspective, appeared in print. A brilliant attorney with a passion for handicapping, William Scott, isolated on the relative prospects of the betting favorites. Ray Taulbot was revised and Hugh Matheson revived. William Ziemba and Donald Hausch

proved that thoroughbred racing was a positive expectancy event. Bonny Ledbetter took the first literate look at the physiology of the horse itself, followed by racing's first really useful video. Mark Cramer gave viable substance to the horse racing section of a periodical dedicated largely to casino and sports betting. James Quinn put the entire movement into two volumes of history (the second to be released soon): The Literature of Thoroughbred Handicapping, an eloquent synthesis of all that was good in handicapping.

Together these, and precious few others, served to elevate the subject of thoroughbred handicapping to its highest literary level while providing a mass of valuable information and data. They also spawned a remarkably computer literate generation of pirates.

With this 20th Century handicapping renaissance, many people who could never win before started to win with a degree of regularity. But while the raw number of winners increased, the percentage of winners did not. As always, people were dying and new generations were being born. The number of race tracks increased and year round racing within circuits increased. Many who had become momentary handicappers via the renaissance reverted back to being horseplayers, trading in their new-found objectivity and statistical knowledge for subjective theories. Recidivism took its toll and stasis set in.

At the dawning of this new age, and throughout its ongoing course, I embarked on a personal mission. Dissatisfied with contemporary psychiatry's view that losing horseplayers are all pathological gamblers, I was determined to supplant accepted "problem gambler" treatment procedures, which were based on total and perpetual abstinence from all gambling activities, with a therapeutic concept

based both on client-centered therapy AND education. I perceived that if there was pathology (or disease) involved, its etiology lay not in gambling, per se, but in LOSING. And, that the cure for losing was WINNING.

While adequately prepared for the therapeutic direction of my designated task, I had no background for the educational aspects. I devoured the works of the aforementioned authors in print at the time, searching for a thread that might combine them all into a systematized procedure.

Beyer was already systematized and the specific tasks of implementation prescribed. But since his work was becoming so well known, it did not lend itself to my therapeutic aims of self development. Taulbot's name, if not the true essence of his work, was kept alive by American Turf Monthly. Matheson was never published in book form. Only his long forgotten notebooks could be found. Huey Mahl's work, on the other hand, was available to a popular readership and his invitation that "someone else take the ball I have passed and run with it for a touchdown" had yet to be accepted. Since Mahl's work encompassed and expanded on the basic tenants of Taulbot and Matheson, I chose him as my mentor for the educational part of what I would call "Win Therapy."

Before I could teach others to win, I had to learn myself. But, I had never in my entire life made a wager on a racehorse. I was a monument to ignorance and as such appeared in no position to be helping others. Ignorance, however, proved to be my salvation. I had nothing to UN-LEARN.

With no myths, aphorisms, fables, old wives tales and, thanks to Huey Mahl, no false prophets to lead me, the map to the win window took a surprisingly short time to find. However, I cannot minimize the motivational inspiration provided by a potentially violent group of problem gambler patients/clients, all under indictment for gambling related felonies and high misdemeanors. Murder (MINE!) was not beyond their capabilities. So, I quickly raised George Bernard Shaw's dictum of "Those who can, do. Those who cannot, teach," to new heights. And through the magnetism of the group process, I learned to DO.

Field trips to the Mexican Foreign book, with me as the prime selector, taught me proper decision making techniques in a hurry. Anyone thinking that the concept of wagering on two horses to win is intellectually based, should read the statistics on Anglos getting away with killing each other in Mexico. On that first field trip, I only wished that I had come up with a method in which ALL the entrants could be profitably bet.

Most people, possibly YOU, think that the educational aspect of Win Therapy is the most difficult. It is not. Achieving a positive selection proficiency of 63% or higher, wagering on two horses per race, is relatively easy when psychological resistance is absent. But therein lies the rub. The "horseplayer" mentality is cluttered with logic tight compartments that block, through resistance, the normal learning processes. Often this resistance is unconscious; even disguised as an eagerness to learn. But it remains as the single most reason why only one tenth of one percent of all those at the track can make or augment a decent living through handicapping.

While similar codes exist in virtually all cultures, we are endowed with what is called "the Judeo-Christian work ethic," known only in America in its most vicious form as "the Puritan work ethic." It imposes, through an artificially designated religious connotation, the edict that socially accepted work occupations are noble endeavors and that all forms of gambling is play, and hence evil. Success or failure in a work endeavor receives the same moral reward. Thus the stock, commodities or real estate speculator is investing, and hence working. The handicapper, by this arbitrary moral definition is playing. Losing is penance, and redemption comes through abstinence. All winning is instrumented by the devil and persistent winning demands a residence in Lucifer's domain throughout eternity.

There are those who would counter that in an enlightened society, such notions are extinct and have no bearing on those living in contemporary America. That view is rational and logical, but if it were true, writing this chapter, along with Synergism itself, would not be necessary. Everyone with successful handicapping as their goal would have achieved it long ago and now be self-employed and autonomous. The word horseplayer would be forever banished from such a person's vocabulary, replaced by worker, and every major university would have graduate schools in Handicapping Arts and Sciences. Instead of being scattered through the huge mass of "lucky" patrons, the billions of dollars put through the parimutuel machines each year would be shared by a substantially larger segment of elitists who rejected the gambling is evil hypothesis and properly prepared themselves for the handicapping "work ethic."

The information is there. The human brain, with no special, inordinate capacity, is capable of receiving it, along with a goodly portion of those billions of dollars going through the windows every day. But the psychological hazards remain deeply rooted in the horseplayers psyche, and no amount of information, however brilliantly disseminated by the greats we have mentioned, has been able to eradicate them.

So in this enlightened, computer enriched year of 1987, the percentage of players who earn enough to be called professional remains at one tenth of one percent, a number that has held true for several generations. It has ever been thus, and will thus remain until the psychological barriers are lifted. Therefore, the major function of Win Therapy lies in the therapeutic process itself. Subtle, counterpunctual, it pursues the erroneous social implantations that say NO to our dreams and works ever gradually to cleanse us of negativities spawned by a thousand generations of insidious myth.

Each act of winning in itself helps in this long term process. The more often and consecutively the act is duplicated, the greater the therapeutic value.

For this reason, Synergism masterfully employs the computer to perform many of the operations that should properly be the function of the user. In so doing, it offers relief for many of the burdens imposed by the Information Age, which may be regarded as regrettable, but expands the function of the High Tech age proportionately. Through computer science, it reduces user application of science, but increases the demand for user ARTISTRY.

HANDICAPPING AS AN ART VS. A SCIENCE

Under Bob Purdy's taskmaster direction, Synergism evolved over more than three years of painstaking research, trial and error and long testing throughout the United States and Canada. Even more painful than this evolutionary process was my accepting the fact that trying to teach the techniques of making and keeping proper variants, daily and other, was largely an exercise in futility. It was the same dilemma faced by Andrew Beyer and all the other great handicapping innovators. A war of attrition ultimately lost to horseplayer lassitude and the availability of "sure fire, easy, no work systems" waiting in the wings.

James Quinn has accurately described the average horseplayer as passive: a vessel for informational output, but without sufficient aggressiveness to perform the many tasks essential to gaining full benefit of that information.

In our own experience, we dedicated, under Tom Brohamer's expert direction, many hours of classroom time to several hundred clients. We attempted to teach the making of a projected daily variant and the use of Par Energy times. The end result was that only a handful undertook the process, the rest subscribed to our variant service directed by Brohamer. We have manuals and audio tapes dedicated to adjustment and variant making procedures gathering dust on the Institute's shelves. At the same time, manuals and audio tapes on pace line selection, match-up identification, making win and place models and pattern recognition are constantly going into reprint. The message was loud and clear. We finally got it. Hence, Synergism.

We have concluded that our time and energy will be far better spent teaching the Handicapping ARTS. We will direct our SCIENTIFIC efforts to more perfect computer algorithms and improved services of the kind now provided by Tom Brohamer.

In a way, this is a sorry state. The information age seemed to hold great promise. But it could not resist the High Tech juggernaut. The end result is that with the proliferation of valid information that began in 1975, the average mutuel has risen and the percentage of people winning with regularity has declined.

This phenomenon has one historic parallel in the Industrial Revolution; another in the Age of Reason and Enlightenment. In the first, economies became more subject to catastrophic fluctuation leading to socio-political upheaval. In the second, moral values disintegrated, leaving sociological cluster groups in deep fear and mistrust of each other and mankind in general.

The handicapping experience is but a microcosm of life itself.

BACK TO THE FUTURE

Synergism will be heralded as a consummate advance in handicapping implementation. In reality, it is a luxury ticket for a journey back to a darker age on a vehicle piloted by a robot. New leisures and a larger share in the pot of gold await the traveler at the destination. Just don't ask the pilot how he got you there. He is a replacement for the tour guide who tried to explain it all, but got fired because nobody listened.

The word Synergism has theological roots. Its original definition was that in the doctrine of regeneration, there is a cooperation of human activity and cosmic intervention or divine grace. As man evolved into the ages of Reason, Nuclear Energy and High Tech, the cosmic and divine elements of Synergism were discarded in favor of higher levels of reasoning stemming from the discrete actions of physical forces interrelating in such a way that the total effect became greater than the sum of its parts.

In chemistry, the combination a certain relatively benign compounds can produce a reaction of utmost potency. Thunder and lightning are examples of synergistic action, as is the explosive power of dynamite. The most dramatic of synergistic forces is, of course, atomic weapons. Harmless little atoms that have been around forever get split up by fission, and the course of history is abruptly changed. A frightening new era dawns. Whereas once mankind feared the gods or cosmic forces more than anything else, now man himself has become the ultimate fear.

This expanded definition of the word is given not as an exercise in semantics, but as both a comparative description and a WARNING. Even as the Surgeon General's warning appears on the label of each package of cigarettes, so must this one precede the manual of instruction for Synergism.

IT CAN BE DANGEROUS!

While comparing a computerized handicapping procedure to cosmic forces and atomic energy may seem grandiose, it is the best way I know to prepare you for both the power and the danger of the adventurous journey you are about to take.

To handicapping purists who already feel that the Sartin Methodology elevates implementation above cognition, Synergism will be an extreme affront. Those delicate areas of handicapping expertise involving distance changes, vagaries of track surface, track to track adjustments and other variables have been reduced to computer algorithms that can almost duplicate results derived from the arduous labors of the most sophisticated handicappers in North America.

Please note my emphasis on the word almost.

In his text, Bob Purdy reveals the exacting benchmark he tested Synergism's automatic adjustment procedures against. The all encompassing daily Energy Dynamic variants supplied by PIRCO's Tom Brohamer, available now only for California tracks. While the computer can emulate human intelligence, it cannot exactly duplicate or supplant it. For this reason, Synergism gives users the choice between its automatic adjustment and those derived through personal cognition. You must employ one or the other. NOT BOTH.

One of the great elements of human genius is the recognition of human frailty. All progress has stemmed from failure. One of the principle areas of potential failure in applying the Sartin Methodology is adjustments. The problem lies not in the Methodology itself, but in user interpretation. No amount of instruction or supplemental material has been universally effective in overcoming completely the mental blocks of many clients. Bob Purdy himself suffered from many of these and Synergism was born of his personal frustration in dealing with the resultant problems.

The person who invented the sleeping pill was an insomniac. The originators of body development were weaklings. Weight loss diets

were formulated by fat people. Memory courses were designed by the forgetful. And, as you undoubtedly know, most psychiatrists entered the field because of their own psychoses.

The late Alfred Adler, M.D., of the Freudian Trinity, postulated that the majority of famous persons were motivated by inferiority feelings supplanted by over-compensation. Tamerlane was a cripple, Edison and Beethoven were handicapped by degrees of deafness, Napoleon was short, Roosevelt suffered the effects of polio and Winston Churchill was the much maligned goat of a monumental British military failure in the First World War. The list goes on. Synergism is Bob Purdy's compensation for every race he lost through errors in adjustments and improper weighting of variables.

Although Synergism is the consummate Phase III procedure, it employs certain potent aspects of both Ultra Scan and Energy, but in a Phase III format. For all of its power, it still demands that the user have a keen sense of judgement both in pace line selection and in the interpretation of readouts. While minimizing the problems of adjustment, it still requires that the user have those judgmental capacities stressed in all our supplemental manuals, classroom workbooks and audio tapes.

Had Synergism been our first program, the Methodology may well have died in its infancy. It is deceptively easy. The deception being that one must know how truly difficult successful handicapping is before it can come easily. I stress this point for the benefit of those who would start using Synergism before thoroughly digesting the celebratedly "difficult to understand" yellow Phase III Basic Manual. Those attempting to handicap with Synergism before paying their dues,

so to speak, will find that gaps in their handicapping education in the Methodology may hurt them.

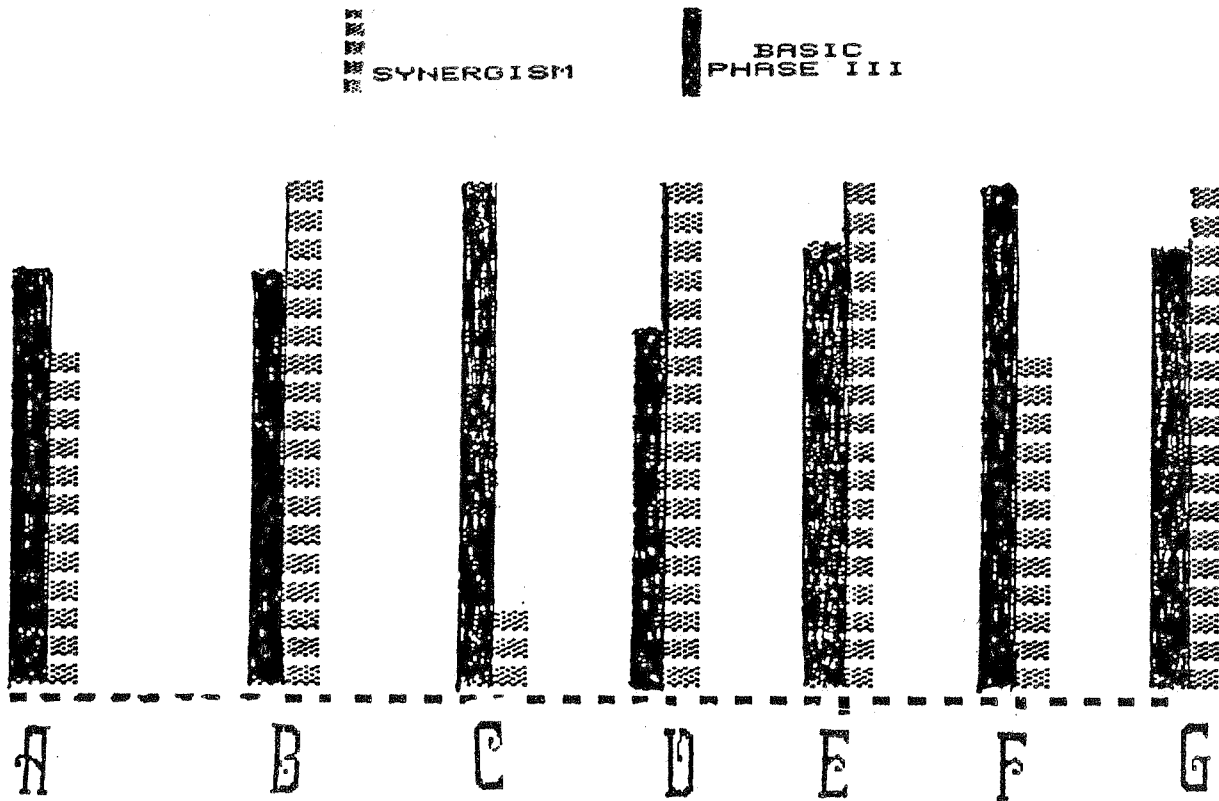
James Quinn, one of the most celebrated handicappers in America, has stated emphatically that regardless of one's expertise in conventional handicapping, for THIS Methodology to be profitable, it must be implemented within the precise framework of the creator's orientation. This is a most astute observation on his part. When testing the Methodology, he applied none of his own skills or interpretative powers. He forced himself to be a beginner again and in so doing gave us the fairest test ever by an outside authority. The result was that he showed an excellent profit and gave us highly gracious reviews. If one of the recognized "greats" in the field can do it, it should not be asking too much that others follow suit.

PREVENTIVE MEDICINE

The human body is a superb mechanism. Yet it is subject to ills. Many of these can be avoided through preventive medicine. This is also true of Synergism.

Let's take a graphic look at the prescriptions that need filling to avoid any possible malignancies or negative side effects from using Synergism.

A: QUALIFYING CONTENDERS

Because it uses the Contenderscan format that measures each horse against an optimal dream race, Synergism is far more forgiving when you enter non-competitive horses than Ultra Scan. You will need to spend some time learning to analyze these figures.

B: PACE LINE

On the other hand, Synergism is very sensitive to pace line selection and is optimally effective when logically predictive pace lines are used.

C: ADJUSTMENTS

Because Synergism dramatically reduces the need for user judgement and skill in making adjustments, it makes it possible for you to concentrate more effort in pace line, match up and the analysis of energy bias.

D: ENERGY BIAS

Synergism asks that the USER choose the appropriate bias, Early, Sustained or Factor W. This is a VITAL aspect of the program because the how you chose will weight the ensuing readouts. When in doubt, use Factor W.

E: INTERPRETATION OF READUTS

This is a most important aspect of using Synergism. By freeing the user from drudgery in other areas, concentration here is important.

F: CLASS

Synergism's algorithms reduce user requisites for class evaluation to a minimum. Certain minute adjustments are suggested in the body of Bob Purdy's text. Be sure to absorb and fully understand them.

G: NEW READOUT

Synergism II offers three readouts that are unique. Turn Time and Late Pace have been seen before, though not in conjunction with the new Synergism II adjustments. The Doctor Factor is totally new, and promises to lead us all out of the darkness and into the light. This one factor is capable of making winners. These three combine to produce a unique category of information that is missing from all other contemporary handicapping sources.

AN INFORMATION AGE DILEMA & HYPOTHESIS

Over the past decade, a number of prominent authors have posed an interesting hypothesis: What if - all tracks had uniform artificial surfaces, not subject to the vagaries of surface and weather, and on which all distance change adjustments could be made uniformly?

Such a condition, they postulate, would elevate the handicapping process to a level whereby the practitioner could give full attention to competitive evaluation and interpretation. Through High Tech support, the need for ancillary information would be reduced to a minimum and analytic skill raised to a high art.

First, a Word of caution to those of you who like to run the example races contained in our manuals to see if your printouts will come out exactly the same. This manual is being written in the month of November, 1988, but the program you receive may have been published after that date, and if so, may have some minor changes in it. In that case, your printouts may not compare exactly. Also, various computers will give slightly different readouts depending on how their version of BASIC handles math in general, and rounding in particular. The example races shown herein are printouts from the IBM version of SYNERGISM II.

This manual is written for use with all computers supported by PIRCO and The Inland Empire Institute. The first set of operating instructions contained in this manual are specific to the SHARP hand-held computers (must reading however, regardless of what type of computer you have), followed by instructions for the IBM, and other computers using the MS/DOS operating system. The program discs or tapes for the Apple, Commodore and Radio Shack Color Computer will each come with their own operating instructions.

Operating instructions for
Sharp PC-1350 or PC-1360

To start SYNERGISM II type the key marked "DEF" followed by the letter H. The first prompt "New or Old Race" defaults to "Old Race" by pressing the Enter Key. To enter a race for the first time, enter the letter N for "New Race". If you already have a race in the computer, it will remain in memory. This allows you to make changes to the race still in the computer. The race will stay in the computer until you type N in answer to the prompt "New Or Old Race". You are given the opportunity to change the set up times when re-doing an old race. You will see the prompt "New Race Setup" if you are re-working the race still in the computers' memory. The default setting to this prompt is N for no.

When starting a new race, you will be prompted to answer some questions about today's race. Several questions throughout the program have defaults pre-programmed requiring you only to press the Enter Key which accepts the default setting as input.

The first prompt "Print Hardcopy is self explanatory and defaults to Y.

The second prompt "Calculate Class" will send the program to a subroutine (later in the program when entering your paceline selections) defaults to N. Most users prefer to run the Class & APV before entering their pacelines. The program allows you to do this simply by pressing the "DEF" Key followed by the letter "D". This lets you run the Class & APV subroutine to help you with determining contenders or for whatever reason you use these readouts.

The third prompt "Auto Adj Variant" defaults to Y. This is the "switch" that turns SYNERGISM II on and gives you the power of an automatic variant for all required adjustments. For those of you who still use your own adjustments, you may use this program as an enhanced Phase III program by answering N to this prompt. Just remember, if you choose to use this program as an enhanced Phase III program, you will be required to enter all required adjustments into the "open adjustment" when prompted for it.

The fourth prompt "Setup Distance" defaults to the distance of 6.0 Furlongs. You may use any distance you choose from 4.5 to 9.5 Furlongs as your setup distance by entering the distance here. However, when using the Mile and Forty Yards or Mile and Seventy Yards distances, always enter these distances as 1.4 or 1.7. The computer will make the proper conversion for you.

Your decision for "Setup Distance" requires quite a bit of thought and the answer to this question should have been resolved long before you turned the computer on.

The process to determine what distance to use for your "setup" begins after you have selected your contenders, but before picking pacelines. After you have your contenders, you should browse through their past performances, looking for good performances at or near today's actual racing distance. After you have done this, choose representative pacelines for these horses with as many like distances from the same race track as possible. For example: In looking at the past performances of your contenders, you see that four of them have good performances at 6.0 Furlongs (all at Santa Anita) and one of them has a good performance at 7.0 Furlongs at Belmont. Your

Racing Form tells you that today's distance is actually 6.5 Furlongs at Del Mar. When using SYNERGISM II, just remember that the majority rules. In this case, you would enter the "Setup Distance" as 6.0 Furlongs because you have four pacelines at that distance, from the same race track, representing a majority.

The next prompt asks for "Track Record". Enter the track record for the setup distance and race track chosen. In this case, enter 107.3 the track record for 6.0 Furlongs at Santa Anita.

Now you are prompted "Shipper This Race?". This prompt defaults to N for no. If you have any paceline with the same distance as your setup distance, but from another race track or from another surface (turf to dirt or vice versa), you would answer this question Y. Shippers from any other distance are automatically adjusted as shippers whether they are from another race track, another surface or from the same race track and surface. In other words, the computer will automatically adjust any paceline with a different distance than that of your chosen setup distance.

The next prompt displays the setup distance chosen and asks you to enter the 2nd call and final times. The times that you enter here, are the pace of the race times of the pacelines you have chosen

for your contenders, that are from the same race track and distance as the setup distance. In our example above, you would enter the 2nd call and final times for all four of our 6.0 Furlong pacelines from Santa Anita. Here is what what is happening in the computer while entering this data: When you enter the second call and final time of a paceline, the computer calculates a daily track variant for that paceline and adjusts the times accordingly. If you enter more than one paceline, as in our example, each of the paceline times are adjusted before they are averaged. A "Par Variant" is derived from the averaging of the adjusted paceline times. Later in the program, any paceline identified by you as a "shipper" or any paceline with a different distance from that of the setup distance, will automatically be adjusted to this "Par Variant". After each of the setup times are entered, you will be prompted "Average Another Line" and this prompt defaults to N for no.

When you are finished entering the setup times, the following prompt "Enter Ranking Choice" appears and defaults to number 1. Your choice here is simply to tell the computer by which factor you want to see the rankings displayed. This can be a very valuable tool for you, not only just to see rankings displayed in a certain order, but because one of the factors in the printouts is weighted by

your ranking choice. This factor is the "Doctor Factor" (so named by Jim Bradshaw and I for Dr. Sartin). The Doctor Factor does not appear on your printouts as a velocity figure, but appears only in the ranking section of your printouts under the letter "D" of "W E S T L D". By keeping a "Betting Model" of your track by distance and surface, you will know what factors are most predictive for you and make your ranking decision from that information. This will enhance the power of the already potent Doctor Factor by adding the proper weighting to it.

If you choose your ranking as "F.W." (Factor W) just press the Enter Key or the number 1 and then the Enter Key. Until you are confident you can predict how this race will run, always choose F.W. as your ranking choice. If you feel that the race will be won by horses strong in Early Pace, then enter the number 2 and press the Enter Key to select "E.P." (Early Pace) as your ranking choice. If you feel that the race will be won by horses strong in Sustained Pace, (acceptable early position and a good third fraction) then enter the number 3 and press the Enter Key to select "S.P." (Sustained Pace) as your ranking choice.

Now we are ready to enter our paceline information. First, the name of the horse.

Abbreviate the name to five letters. The computer will ignore any letters beyond the first five.

Next enter the paceline distance. A message on the screen tells you that you can hit the Enter Key and the paceline distance will default to the setup distance, saving you the time of typing it in.

Now, enter the times for your paceline selection. Be sure to use the times as they appear in the Racing Form, i.e.; 22.1 45.3 110.1. In other words don't change the minutes to seconds or the fifths to tenths. The program makes the conversions for you.

After input of the times, enter the beaten lengths for the first and second call as well as for the finish. Example: 1.25 2.75 1.50.

If you entered Y to the prompt "Shippers This Race" earlier in the program, you would now be prompted "Horse A Shipper ?" only for pacelines you enter with the same distance as the setup distance. Remember, a paceline with a distance other than that of the setup distance is automatically adjusted for the distance switch. The default to this prompt is N.

Note: If your setup distance is a sprint distance less than a mile, and you have decided to use the internal fractions of a route race as a paceline for one of your contenders, enter the

entire route paceline just the way it appears in the Racing Form. The program will automatically extract the six furlong element of the route paceline, using the exact same procedure as described in the yellow Phase III manual.

Now the computer prompts you for an "Open Adj.". This is where you would enter the optional class adjustment, if any. If you want to try using class adjustments my suggestion is that you use .08 for each level of class a horse is moving up or down; up two levels = -.16; down two levels = .16. Caution: Do not give a class adjustment of more than three levels either way, up or down. If a horse is shipping from a minor to a major race track or vice versa, use .15 for one level of track class, .27 for two levels and .35 for three levels. Do not use a track class adjustment of over .35 either way. Reminder: These class adjustments are optional. Personally, I have almost totally abandoned using class adjustments of any kind with Synergism II. Warning: The prompt "Open Adj." is not a question to be answered Y or N. This prompt is asking for a numeric input. Pressing the Enter key accepts the default amount of zero.

A further reminder: If you are not using the automatic variant but are using the program as an advanced Phase III, the "Open Adj." is where you

enter all required adjustments.

Now you are prompted "Data O. K.". This is a question and defaults to Y for yes. If you made a mistake during the input of the paceline, you should enter N here, giving you the opportunity to re-enter the paceline.

O. K., a complete paceline has been entered into the computers' memory. The computer reminds you of the number of the next horse to be entered and prompts for "Horses Name" again. When all your pacelines have been entered, leave the name blank and press the Enter Key. This is how you tell the computer you have no more pacelines to enter.

The next prompt "Any Scratches" defaults to N. By entering Y and the Enter key, you will direct the program to a subroutine allowing you to scratch one or more horses. This routine will take you through a list of each of the horses entered in the computer, asking you if you want to scratch the horse. Pressing the Enter key defaults to N for no. When the subroutine is completed, a self explanatory prompt appears offering you the choice to either let the program continue or to add another horse.

That's all there is to it for entering a race. Practice a few times and before long, you will have all the defaults memorized and will be zipping through races with ease.

Here is a list of the "Def" Keys and what they will do for you:

"Def" H	Starts Synergism II
"Def" D	Starts the Class & APV routine
"Def" V	Starts the Variant program
"Def" L	Reprints all readouts
"Def" =	Reprints Rankings & SC B/L

Operating instructions for
IBM & Other MS/DOS Machines

If you have not read the instructions for the Sharp PC-1350 or PC-1360, you should go back and read them at this time. Most of the information in that segment applies to the use of Synergism II regardless of type of computer.

To start Synergism II, place the disk into the drive, type the word SYNERG and press the Enter Key. The program loads and opens with an introduction screen. The next screen is a Menu of choices and is self explanatory. You should find this program to be user friendly and easy to use.

The IBM version has some additional enhancements that I hope you will find useful. One of these is that all defaults pre-programmed in Synergism II appear on the screen, showing you what answer will be input when you press the Enter Key.

You also get two more readouts both in the velocity segment and the ranking segment of the printouts. These are F X (Factor X) and W X (Factor X and Factor W averaged).

One enhancement everyone will really like is the ability to save your races to disk. At the prompt "Date & Race # (Example: 020301) ==>" you

should enter the date and race number in such a manner that you will remember it when you want to call the race back up again. I have been using the following method: Example 071701 would mean July (07) Seventeenth (17) race number 1 (01). You can do it any way you want, just pick a way that is easy for you to remember. You do not have to use numbers, for example if you were entering the Travers Stakes, you could enter TRAVER. Actually, any combination of six numbers and/or characters will work. Just be sure that you use six numbers and/or characters. This new feature will give you wide latitude as to when you enter your races or how many times you want to re-work the race. It should prove to be a very valuable tool, especially for re-working a race after a loss.

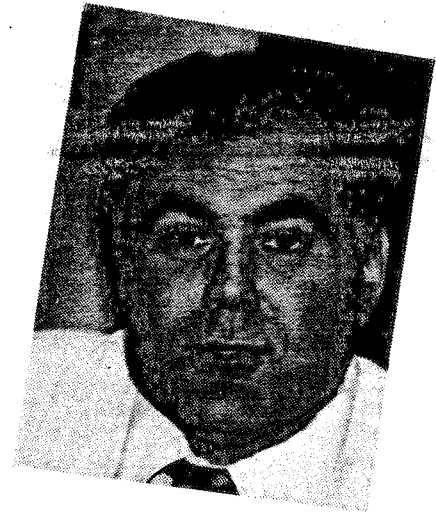
The races you save to disk will appear on your directory as follows: 071701.RAC 071702.RAC etc. Each race should take up less than 500 bytes, so you can save many more races than you would ever actually want to keep. To remove some of the unwanted races from your disk, use the "DEL" command as follows: To delete all the races - type "DEL *.RAC" (without the quotes of course) and press the Key. To delete all of the month of July races - type "DEL 07*.RAC". This will delete all of the files on your disk with the first two

characters being "07", leaving all other races still on the disk. If you have any further questions about the Dos DEL Command, consult your DOS Manual.

That about covers the differences for the IBM version of the program.

The following is a description of what the headings for the rankings "W E S T L D MED E" stand for:

W = Factor W
E = Early Pace
S = Sustained Pace
T = Turn Time Formula (unweighted)
L = Late Pace Rating
D = Doctor Factor
MED E = % Median Energy



A LOOK AT PERCENT MEDIAN

One of the things that many of our clients find most invigorating about PIRCO (and other clients find most annoying) is that we are always changing, always trying out new ideas and developing new programs and procedures. Those of you who wish we'd just tell you what to do, the best way to do it and then shut up are in trouble. The entire point of PIRCO's existence is to do research. Pari-mutuel Investment Research Company, in case you ever wondered. Research is our middle name!

That means we're always trying new stuff, making improvements, fiddling around with new ideas. Some of our new ideas are great, but, as with all progress, most of our new and wonderful ideas aren't much good. The problem is that it's very hard to predict which will be hits and which misses.

Percent Median is a classic example. When we started research on the ENERGY! program, we had the computer display our old % Early, a new % Early, % Median and % Late. After some months of trial and error, we discovered that the new % Early wasn't very useful, but that % Median far exceeded our expectations. It is good enough that we will eventually incorporate it into all of our computer programs, replacing % Early. Synergism II is the first program to incorporate this new breakthrough, and as our most advanced program to date, it is entirely appropriate that this concept be introduced here.

% Median is used exactly like our old, soon to be departed friend % Early. In this case, the improvement is one of degree, not a major breakthrough. We have found that % Median is superior in two ways to good old % Early. First off, the Win Energy parameters are generally about 25 to 33% tighter with % Median than they were with % Early. This makes the number much more useful in eliminating horses who don't fit your new, more exact track profile.

Second, we have found that % Median more sharply defines the upper and lower limits of the profile. For instance, at Del Mar this year, we found we could almost always safely throw out any horse with a % Median of over 70% from win consideration. At other tracks, a very definite lower limit was discovered by observant testers. Once established, these limits tend to hold up far better than those using % Early. Of course, weather and class can still dramatically change a track profile, but this is a superior tool.

Take a look at the charts one of our advanced testers Joe Bolger created, based on the recent meet at Del Mar. A quick glance should be enough to convince you of the superiority of % Median.

For those of you who want to see how % Median is calculated, the formulas are below. As you can see, there isn't much difference between % Early and % Median; the primary new ingredient is the use of all three fractions. The results from this new formula are a dramatic improvement, however. We urge you to pay very close attention to this new and powerful tool and to make full use of the advantage it gives you over everyone else at the racetrack.

As I'm sure you all know, % Early is computed as:

$$\text{Early Pace} / (\text{Early Pace} + \text{Third Fraction})$$

Of course, all numbers are first converted into feet-per-second.

An example of this would be:

6 furlong race

45 second call (58.66 F.P.S.)

1:10 final time (52.80 F.P.S.)

$$58.66 / (58.66 + 52.80) = 52.63\%$$

The new % Median is a close relative, but uses all three Fractions. I'll condense First Fraction to F1, Second Fraction to F2 etc.

$$(F1 + F2) / (F1 + F2 + F3)$$

An example would be:

6 furlong race

22 First call (F1 = 60.00 F.P.S.)

45 Second call (F2 = 57.39 F.P.S.)

1:10 Final time (F3 = 52.80 F.P.S.)

$$(60.00 + 57.39) / (60.00 + 57.39 + 52.80) = 68.97\%$$

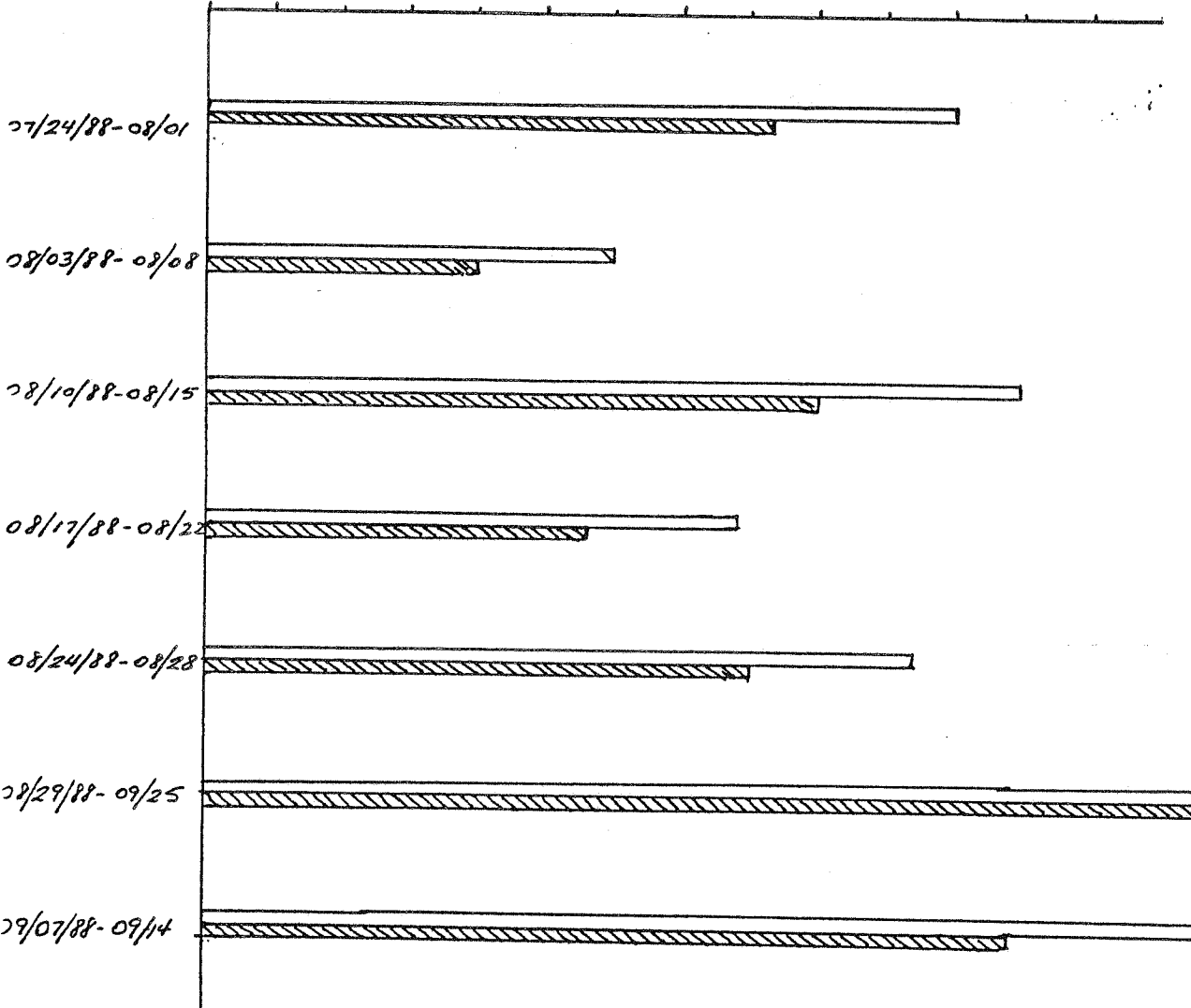

PIRCO and The Inland Empire Institute are regarded by our peers who contribute to the viable literature of contemporary handicapping, as the first to develop a cohesive, methodological procedure for optimal use of incremental velocity in thoroughbred handicapping. I say the Institute, rather than myself, to emphasize the importance of the power of the group thought process. Our procedures were honed, refined and continuously improved by a number of Charter and Associate members; people like yourself who contributed by communicating your successes and your failures.

We did NOT invent incremental velocity. Far from it. We did, however, re-define it in a manner that is STILL not accepted by mainstream handicapping experts. This fact was emphasized most recently in James Quinn's excellent book, The A-B-C's of Thoroughbred Handicapping. To us, pace is not the relationship between fractional and final time, but rather, the GESTALT TOTALITY of race intervals weighted by specific, esoteric factors that produce a result greater than the sum of its parts.

This is an important distinction. Since it deviates from accepted peer group thought, it is a vital one. The fact that we are deviant should in no way reduce our respect for the intellect or the conclusions of these experts. It allows us to keep an edge over our fellow handicappers who, in reality, are our competitors for the pari-mutual dollars.

As the developers of the optimal VELOCITY procedure, it then becomes our right to say that Synergism II is the ULTIMATE velocity procedure. And further, our LAST! Before making such a statement, all of us involved in PIRCO's research and development program did a lot of soul-searching. We have been experimenting for many years with various weightings and formulae that might give added effectiveness to incremental velocity, but each one, upon testing, fell short of Synergism II's proficiency. Since the first experimental version of what is now Synergism II has been in the hands of certain Charter Members since 1985, the test has been a long and fair one.

We subtitled Synergism II: "On the Threshold of Energy" because it contains certain revolutionary concepts that, while velocity based, are in fact Energy formulas disguised to look like velocity figures. Why disguised? Well, in 1983 we developed a program called Ultra Scan. Many clients used it, and some are still using it, with optimal results. But, because the readouts were NOT velocity oriented, the program suffered from much derision, some of it from Charter Members. In 1983, no important handicapping expert had written about us praising our efforts. We were virtual unknowns. Hence, our clients, AND certain Charter Members, were reluctant to accept any offering from me that didn't at least LOOK LIKE something akin to mainstream thought.

Our break came when James Quinn, always willing to give equal time to iconoclasts, invited me to Handicapping Expo '84. His decision was supported by Dr. William Quirin, a co-host. This marvelous, under-attended event, was our turning point. In the years that followed, our concepts were first reported in a small, much

maligned book by Tom Ainslie. Then come Quinn's High Tech Handicapping in the Information Age, Class of the Field, The Best of Thoroughbred Handicapping, and now The A-B-C's of Thoroughbred Handicapping. In between was a mention in Quirin's Handicapping by Example, two nationally syndicated articles by Andy Beyer and coverage in Dick Mitchell's Thoroughbred handicapping as an Investment. The history of ideas is full of cases where innovators, laughed at and maligned, were turned into seers through the writings of others who were "accepted." So it was with us. Had we released Ultra Scan in 1986 or 1987, it would not have been so demeaned.

While Bob Purdy was not as vociferous a detractor of Ultra Scan as some, he was certainly not one of its supporters. He could not use the name or hear it mentioned without cracking at least a big smile. His metamorphosis came during the early stages of his search for an omnipotent readout. ONE single factor that more than any other, or combination of others, that would point to the winner of a race. He was working in concert with Jim "The Hat" Bradshaw at the time. They spent some time in Las Vegas looking for this Holy Grail readout, trying all sorts of wild and wonderful combinations. Jim suggested they try a variation of the Ultra Scan formula.

Thus, the Doctor Factor came to life. After considerable more work refining the concept, they won 31 of 33 races wagered on consecutively in two days, using only the top two ranked horses in this single readout. Further testing by the entire Charter Group has never again produced a 93% win level, but it has approached it often, and in the final analysis averaged out in the mid 70% area. This is using ONE READOUT!

Of course, these results were obtained by our most astute contender selectors who surgically removed many horses from contention that others might leave in. Yet even the timid, who insist on rating borderline contenders or even outright non-contenders, have had satisfactory results with the formula now known as the Doctor Factor. By including it in Synergism II, we offer you an edge that exceeds any pure velocity or so called pace rating.

A word of caution. Whenever we produce a new manual and/or computer program, many of you act as though it takes precedence over all the written material that came before it. This is NOT the case. None of our manuals are extinct. Each contains a vital part of a holistic approach to your success as a pari-mutual investor. While innovations have lead to improvements, it is still essential to comprehend the basic concepts that are the foundation for advances. While you may be using the ULTIMATE velocity program, there remains the pressing need to comprehend the Match-Up as the basis for elimination of non-contenders and select pace lines that accurately reflect each horse's potential in today's race.

The search for Synergism II began when Bob Purdy, despite his legendary success at the pari-mutuel windows, found himself mystified by factors of ADJUSTMENTS. In common with us all, he occasionally suffered from improper application of adjustments based on variations relative to different tracks, distance and daily surface changes. His cyclic failures in this area did not result from a lack of understanding of the accepted mainstream practice of making variants from par times and projection of times. He had fully mastered the techniques developed by Andy Beyer and expanded upon by Quirin. This procedure was, and still is, the accepted state of the art and is standard practice with virtually every expert from Beyer to Brohamer, Quirin to Quinn.

Bob, who had handicapped with many of these experts, noticed ANOTHER alleged state of the art principle to which they all adhered: they were all highly selective in the kinds of races they bet. Higher priced claimers, allowance and stakes races made up the bulk of their play, with a concentration on animals aged four or over except late in the year.

It is true that these kinds of contenders at major tracks are more inclined to run true to form and are more subject to measurement by state of the art standards. All very well and good, because most of the experts played at major tracks and had a tendency to cluster together and re-enforce their notion of state of the art. Bob, on the other hand, found himself doing BETTER at lesser tracks as he traveled with me around the country; making more profit and pin-pointing long shots at tracks where he had no access to par times or alleged track biases.

He was also well aware of the facts that most of our clients with problems lived in areas without major tracks. These clients were NOT inclined to do the work essential in making par times and did not possess the intuitive skills to make projected variants. Further, they could not effectively accept Quirin's nationally published par times for their tracks because there was so little similarity between them and the actual times being run. Quirin knows this. His pars are based on relationship factors, NOT actual times.

While his times, properly utilized, can be just as effective as actual pars, these clients were unwilling to effect the urban sophistication necessary to accept such an esoteric technique. In essence, they wanted what Bob wanted: an automatic means to determine ALL variations subject to adjustment.

I have never entered into the par time vs. automatic adjustment argument because it is too emotionally charged and subjective in nature. The bottom line is that is one derives the CONFIDENCE essential to success from making one's own variants, or using those produced by someone in whom you have confidence, just continue this practice. That's assuming, of course, that you are WINNING! It also assumes that you are being duly selective in the races you play, even as the experts who prescribe these kinds of variants.

However, if you do not handicap the major tracks and like to play virtually every race in which there are no first time starters, you are a part of the statistic Bob mentions in his introduction to the Synergism II automatic adjustments. Using the auto adjust feature

does produce consistently higher mutuels, which more than offsets the slightly lower win proficiency. This has been confirmed by hundreds of users from all over North America. But just as you will not benefit from the statistic that Early Pace wins 65% of all sprint races when your track is running its share of the 35% of Sustained Pace races, neither will you benefit from the over-all statistic on the auto-adjust if you have a procedure for making variants that is TRULY WINNING.

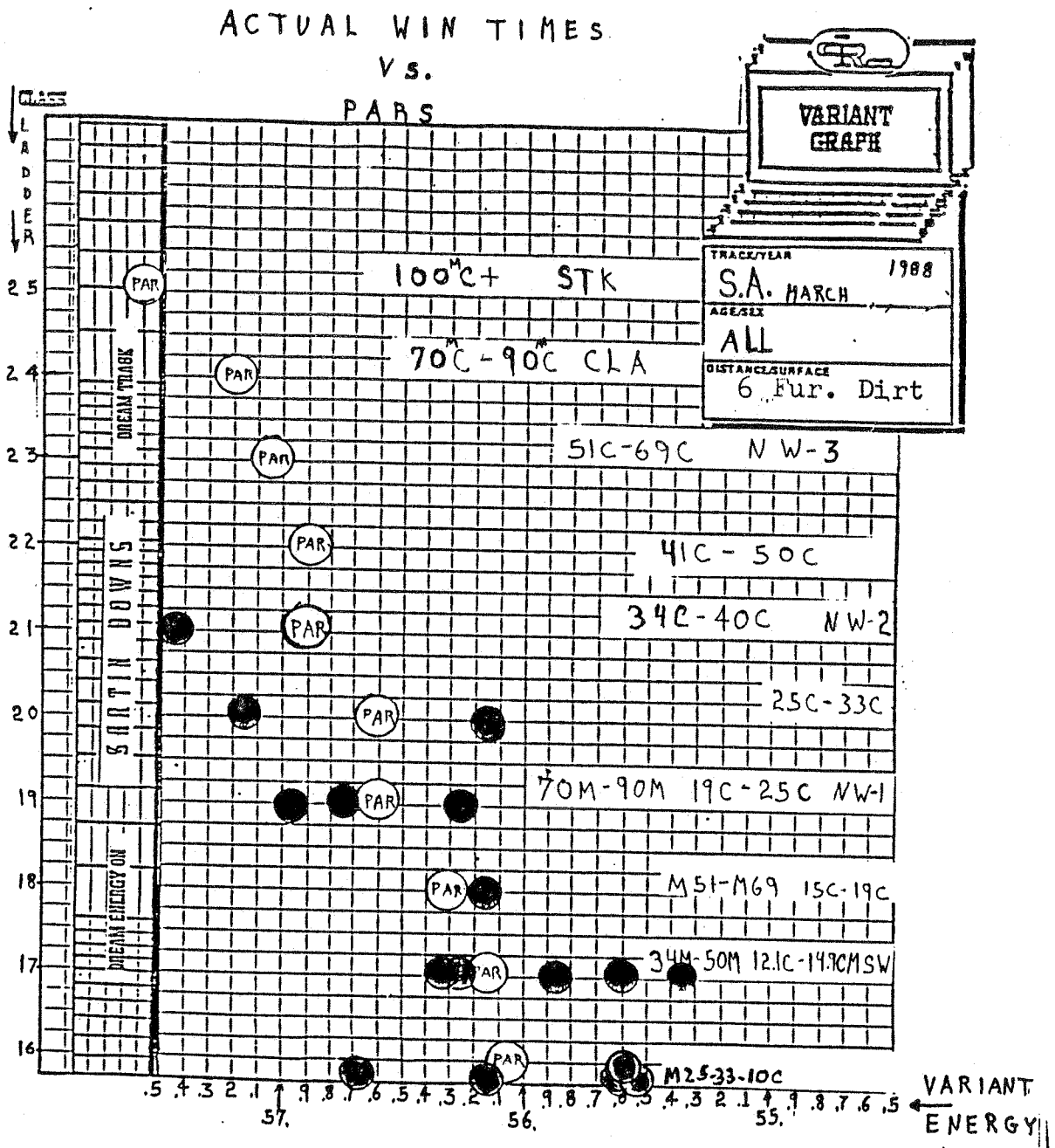
It would be folly for you to change, just as it would be folly for someone handicapping Equi-Track at Remington Downs in Oklahoma to try making daily variants. The same horses, who were running 1:14's in hot, dry weather ran 1:08's when it rained. Synergism handled this situation very well with its auto-adjust. Synergism II does even better. In fact, they were the only velocity programs that were successful in beating this track in September and October when Jim and I were there. Anyone trying to pawn off a daily variant or par time chart for this track should be subject to a class action lawsuit. They're talking about many other tracks across the country going to this new surface. Our state of the art friends will then find themselves living in an entirely new state.

The reason for the effectiveness of projected variants based on pars in given situations, and for the efficacy of the auto-adjust in handling a wider variety of races, are in no way secret. In fact, they are germane to racing itself. A given minority of horses at the better tracks are sufficiently endowed with innate class that they tend to run with consistent form when at the peak or near peak of their condition cycle. In the claiming ranks, they tend to move up

and down in level predictably according to factors of age and time frame. Their peers move similarly. Thus mainstream, state of the art procedures for determining form, class level and condition cycle are applicable. These horses are readily susceptible to adjustments for daily surface variations by a measuring stick known as par times; which are based upon arbitrary, man-made class delineations, even though the horses do not run to these par times.

Here is an example produced by Spencer Toner. Note the wide range of actual variant Energy dots for this par/class level and their deviation from the large dot, which is par. (See figure 1)

This chart for 6 f. on the dirt. Each dark dot represents a cluster of races. This chart reflects the results from ALL age groups. A study of 4 year old & up, 16,00 claimers & up, along with Allowance races, older horses, NW 2 and NW 3, showed a LOWER AVE. DEVIATION, .40, but WIDER maximum and Minimum deviations: Max: .90. Min: .35.

THE AUTOMATIC VARIANT

Synergism II's automatic adjustment is based on the demonstrable fact that horses in general run NOT against predictable par pace and final times, but against each other. It holds that only the most formful of animals run true to predictable pace-speed times and that all incremental times are more heavily influenced by the Energy Match-Up of the competitors in a given race than by surface variations. Synergism II uses the track record, which could just as easily be ANY final time standard, even a par, as a point of deviation, not as an entity in itself.

We have proven conclusively that the average daily variant, year in and year out, at every North American track is between 18 and 20. William Scott was sufficiently impressed by this statistic to use it in his latest book. William Quirin had gone a long way toward proving it in his 1979 book, Winning at the Races. Hence our description of the auto adjust as a TRIANGULATED VARIANT.

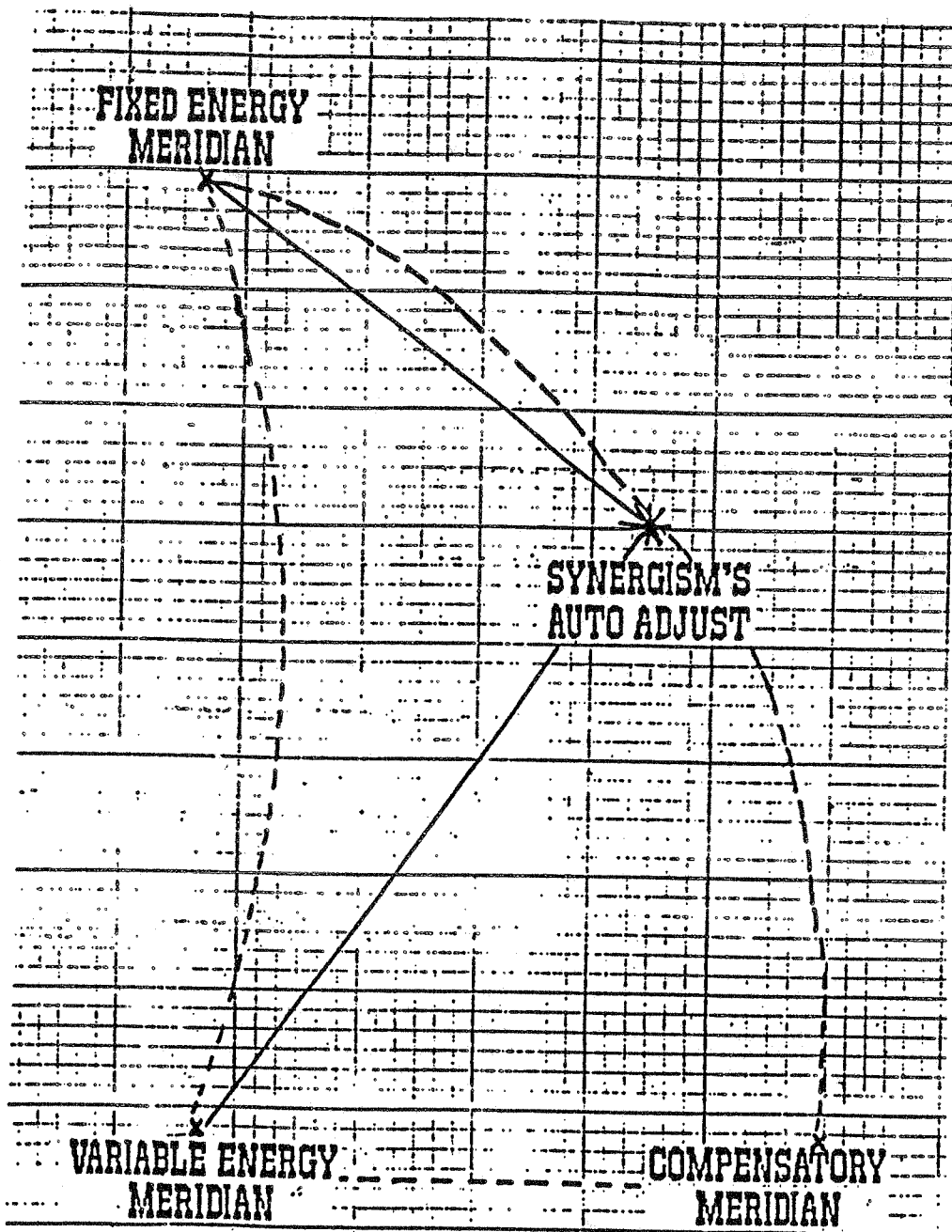
By properly employing a rare skill known as making Projected Variants, this anomaly can be effectively resolved if the horses in question fit a specific category. If you are able to do this, by all means keep it up. Your skills will only be enhanced by the new Synergism II readouts. However, the essential skill and understanding is so rare that few can achieve a high level of proficiency. James Quinn says only a handful of handicappers around the country can do it well, one of them being Tom Brohamer.

SUMMARY

I feel strongly that it is essential that I make my position on this matter eminently clear. Our long run statistical analysis of races in general throughout North America clearly demonstrates the superiority, both in win proficiency and average mutuel, of the auto-adjust variant. This statistic reflects the fact that only a handful of people are capable of making accurate projected variants. Where this capability is present, it succeeds optimally when the user is highly selective in the kinds of races wagered upon.

The bottom line is not which procedure is BEST, but rather, which procedure does the individual have confidence in. Confidence is the most important ingredient in successful handicapping. Truth is not what is, but what we perceive it to be. GO WITH WHATEVER PROCEDURE GIVES YOU CONFIDENCE! Synergism II gives you the capacity to utilize the auto-adjust variant, a variant of your own choosing or RAW figures.

NOTE: If you are subscribing to the Brohamer Variant service, we have ample monitoring of your proficiency level. If you are using Huey Mahl's service, or any other means of determining adjustments and are NOT winning at least 67% of your races, contact us.



The triangulation factors are 1) a fixed Energy figure, 2) a variable median based on a composite of the Energies of the horses being evaluated, and 3) a Compensatory median derived from an average speed rating of 80. Where these components come together, we find the Synergism II Automatic Adjustment.

The efficacy of the concept lies in the results shared by the hundreds of successful Synergism users throughout North America.

Where Synergism II has improved on the triangulated variant, lies in the way it distributes the adjustment. The Synergism II distribution formula, along with the new readouts, especially the Doctor Factor, make it not just an improved program, but a distinctly unique one.

SYNERGISM II'S READOUTS

Each of the readouts in Synergism II has a distinct property for evaluating races by distance and surface. Each can be modeled with a greater degree of consistency than any previous set of readouts. You, of course, will see this when modeling each readout in accordance with the vagaries of your own track.

Here is a guide to the essential properties of each readout:

Factor W (FW) - A slightly altered formula for Synergism II, this readout measures a horse's ability to handle the TOTAL PACE spectrum relative to the field being rated. It is slightly weighted toward Early Pace in sprints, because of the statistical value attached to being in striking distance at the second call in shorter races.

Early Pace (EP) - This readout measures a horse's ability to run well in the first (up to the second call) part of the race without relationship to what it does in the final fraction.

Sustained Pace (SP) - Determines a horse's ability to sustain its Early Energy to the wire. Since it is a composition of both Early and Third Fraction, it is NOT, as many of you persist in thinking of it, a measure of ability to come from far behind the pace setters.

Late Pace (LP) - We will skip ahead to this readout because it IS the one that predicts a contender's ability to close. It employs an Ultra Scan formula that weighs a contenders ability to overcome its early deficiencies. In Sustained bias situations, this readout often produces a bevy of high priced winners. Even on tracks with an Early Pace bias, it many times points to the place horse.

Turn Time Formula (TT) - This readout measures an animal's DECELERATION RATIO. It is no longer weighted by your ranking choice as it was in Synergism. A low number here means a horse ran an even pace. A high number suggests that the horse ran an pace that was exaggerated by either the first or third fraction. While many winners, especially at shorter distances and on the turf may rank third or fourth on this readout, place and show horses tend to rank at the top. Hence, it becomes a key factor in exacta/quinella wagering.

Factor X and Factor WX (FX) (WX) - These are corollary readouts on some computers that measure a horse's ability in the first and third fractions combined. WX factors the first and third fraction with Factor W. When you model this readout at your track, most of you will note that winners, especially in sprints, one mile races and on the turf almost always come from the top three and almost never from beyond the first four.

The Doctor Factor (DR) - This is a Paragon readout that measures a horse's velocity in conjunction with its pace characteristics AND its ability to set, press or overcome today's pace. This factor IS influenced by how you tell your computer to rank the contenders, and great care should be taken to ensure that when you tell the computer

that the track is showing a bias, that it actually exists. Most of the time, tracks aren't as biased as we think they are, and you can negatively impact the value of the Doctor Factor if you are careless or make snap decisions. Most advanced users sort on Factor W most of the time, indicating a track on which no strong bias has been observed. Test results clearly demonstrate that the Doctor will stand alone in sorting out wagering decisions that may otherwise appear clouded.

A good example of this is found in the following race, in which the winner paid mutuels of \$76.20 - \$21.20 and \$9.40. It also pinpointed the place horse for a \$525 exacta. This race appeared in Follow Up #11, with both Synergism and Synergism II readouts. Note how well the winner fares on FW, FX and the DR Factor. Sword Charger, the place horse fared best on all the important readouts, but you would expect that of a such a strong favorite. It is also noteworthy to notice how well Synergism II's auto-adjust equated the fractions from different tracks and distances.

I've also included a brief analysis of the contenders and why I selected each which also appeared in The Follow Up.

My first step was to do the A.P.V. for each horse in the race, naturally. Because this is a turf race, I will pay little attention to non-turf earnings and concentrate on each horse's turf figures.

I think that most of you would throw out Chinvat Bridge. He won at Golden Gate in an \$18,000 allowance and finished fifth in his \$30,000 race. However, his turf APV is tied for second highest, so I entered him from his Golden Gate win on June 26. Using Synergism, I used the program's automatic adjustment and added a -.45 class adjustment. When I ran the horse through ENERGY!, I made no class adjustment, accepting the program's automatic adjustments.

The horses I threw out are marked on my copy of the Form. I may have erred in the case of Parade Leader, since it finished third. Verbillion was OK on the turf classwise, but had not performed well since November of 1987. The other throw outs should be obvious looking at both class and performance, along with performance LEVEL. I've already told you why I used Chinvat Bridge; now let's look at my other contenders:

Leasee - Only an APV of 41% on the turf, but, as Bert Mayne so wisely points out, we must look at all the figures in context. The favorite in the race is Sword Charger, and his turf APV is a mere 35%. Leasee's last race was on the dirt. The one before that produced a serious trouble line. So I chose to use the race of July 10, a race of very comparable class to today's race.

Sword Charger - Both the morning line and betting favorite. No problem here with pace lines. Use it's last race, a route at today's level.

Palamhor - To me, this horse was a major problem. It would most likely not be a problem to the PIRCO experts like Brohamer, Purdy, Schmidt or Bradshaw. But I'm more like many of you, and this horse "scares" me. True, it has never done well on the turf at this level, so far as we can see, but it has won five times on grass and been in the money 11 of its 24 turf starts. Of all these horses, it has the best turf record. So what did I do? I ran both its last race AND its July 22nd race through both of the programs I was using.

As you may well suspect, it was a standout based on it's win, but a dud when you use the Del Mar last race. I finally opted to use its last race, based on the fact that it never did well when running longer than a mile in this country.

New Attitude - Coming out of a tandem with our favorite, Sword Charger, beaten a length and a quarter. I chose to eschew the tandem procedure on this horse because it has never won a race in this country. I considered him only as a possible in the money horse and used his last pace line.

There are my five contenders. Now, let's take a look at some readouts. First from Synergism.

READOUTS - SYNERGISM I

Using PAL offits Hollywood mile would make it a stand-out on this, or any other, program. You would have to adjust it down a bundle for it to be otherwise. If you insist on doing that, go bet the horse. It's going off at 4.4 to one, and then forget about it. The other readouts are going to net you enough, particularly if you play the exacta, to afford a minor error in judgement.

Otherwise here are your obvious choices:

When comparing the Synergism readouts with the Synergism II readouts, it is interesting to note that the winner, Leasee fares better on Sustained Pace with the original Synergism. Likewise, on the old weighted Turn Time Formula. However, the Doctor Factor ranking, in conjunction with Factor W, more than compensates for this seeming anomaly.

We should learn to think of Factor W and the Doctor as Paragon readouts. When they match in the top two, the results have been phenomenal.

MAN DOES NOT LIVE BY RANKINGS ALONE

Many of us have a tendency to evaluate a race directly from the rankings, overlooking completely the fractional and pace numbers. These numbers you see are ADJUSTED. If they weren't, Sword Charger would show dismal 1st and 2nd fractions and a slow 2nd call. Synergism II compensates for the two distances involved in this race: 8.5 and 9 furlongs. The adjusted fractional and pace figures reflect this sophisticated adjustment formula.

On occasion, you will view the adjusted figures with disbelief, since they will alter the picture of the race markedly. At times a raw evaluation will prove to be superior, but our research shows that for every time the raw readouts are superior, there will be four others where the adjustments seem to work miracles. In every field of wheat there is a little chafe. Go with the wheat. Avoid zigging when you should zag. We are (almost all) volume investors. At this stage, ALL of you should be over that "horseplayer" compulsion to beat every

race; and in so trying, alter your procedure after each loss. Go with the percentages. They are in your favor.

THE DREAM RACE

In most instances, winners, and often place horses, will own one or more of the DREAM RACE fractions. Note that Leasee has the best first fraction and shares a tie with Sword Charger, the place horse, at the second call. There is a REASON for the expanded readouts on Synergism II and our other programs.

SYNERGISM II AND E.S.P.

Because Synergism II's all important Doctor Factor is weighted by how you feel the race will be run, its effectiveness will be sharply enhanced by your ability to evaluate E.S.P. As we have demonstrated, any given race can run counter to your Early/Sustained bias model if the contention Match-Up so indicates. Even turf races, where Sustained/Late patterns are usually the rule, can be won by Early Pace horses who show a capacity for a BIG lead and are supported by only adequate Sustained/Late readouts.

Such was the case in the 5th at Del Mar we used as an example race. The top two contenders were Early and Early/Presser respectively. The remaining contenders were either Sustained/Pressers or Sustained. In velocity terms, they were all Late relative to the projected pace of the race, since the two Early horses showed the ability to be comfortably ahead at the first fraction and second call. Both had adequate Sustained and Late Energy. Hence, weighting your

Doctor with Early, when asked for a prediction of how the race will run at the beginning of the program, would enhance the Doctor readouts and leave no question in your mind as to the betting choices.

Once mastered, your E.S.P. analysis will make the Doctor more effective than any readout you could possibly visualize. In the meantime, when in doubt, weight your rankings by Factor W.

SYNERGISM AND MEDIAN ENERGY

The shortest description I know of the new Median Energy is that it more clearly performs the task that % Early was designed to do. % Early had a tendency to project parameters that were often too broad for all but the most skilled clients to utilize effectively. % Median narrows those parameters and becomes an excellent corollary modeling tool. Keep tabs on the % Median both for win and place at your track. With an adequate statistical base, this readout will enhance your proficiency considerably. Here is a Track Profile form for you to copy and use. It will serve you in both the area of % Median and E.S.P. projections.

NEW APPROACHES TO SET UP TIMES

When taking your set up times from actual times run by contenders, you also get a good index as to the race's E.S.P. How the race will probably be run is indicated by the third fraction average from set up times. Consult the charts on pages 23 and 25 in the Match Up manual.

Note that a 37.1 third fraction at 9 furlongs earns a 94. On the turf at Del Mar this is not particularly fast for the level of the

example race. If it were a dirt race, it would be fast, and indicate a Sustained type of winner. Bear in mind that set up times are taken from pace of the race, and are not modified by beaten lengths.

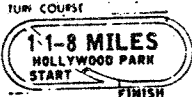
Since, in this race, the average lengths behind the pace of the better contenders was 4.1, this lowers the rating to a 90, making the probability of an earlier paced winner even more likely. You'll have to do your own regression to determine what rating indicates E, S or P by surface and distance at your track. It is not difficult; just be certain to differentiate by distance, track, class level and especially surface.

As a general rule of thumb, I think a rating of 96 and above as fast, and thus indicates a Sustained or Sustained/Presser should win the race. At the lower class levels on the dirt, you may wish to use 90 as a top level and work down from there. A simple regression on REALITY will give you a good fix on what constitutes fast, median and slow third fractions at your track by class, distance and surface.

One more race using Synergism II. This is a 9 furlong race, again on the turf. I'm using two turf races as examples to alleviate the fear many of you evidence in handicapping turf routes and, in some cases routes, per se.

Let's look at the race:

9th Hollywood

This is a relatively high class claiming event. We are purposely avoiding class factors in evaluating this race as to focus purely on the use of Synergism II as a pace program. One of our 5 contenders is a dirt horse. Synergism II AUTOMATICALLY adjusts for surface changes, as well as other vagaries (don't forget to tell the program that a horse moving from dirt to turf, or vice versa, is a shipper, even if the move is from the turf to dirt course of the same track.) so we are not concerned about using two different surfaces in our pace line selections.

Claramount - Only one turf line showing, at Turf Paradise. It's too far back to be valid today at Hollywood. Use the last race.

Millero Y Medio - Last race was on the dirt. The second back was at a mile and 1/2, so the third back is the obvious line to use.

Be Scenic - Trouble in the last race, a slow dirt race two back. I chose to use the turf race three back.

Poly Test - Is the favorite. It was eased last out. Moreover, its last two fractions indicated serious trouble. That was 14 days ago. He has had only one workout since. It was a 53.22 feet-per-second workout. Old time (and a few modern) trainers tell us that a satisfactory workout should be run between 54 and 55 feet-per-second, regardless of distance. I throw these horses out regardless of how well they ran the race before being eased in this manner. Perhaps you don't. Perhaps your handicapping role model does not. If you win using them, don't alter ;your style on my say so.

Rufus - last line

Thresh It Out - Ran a mile and 1/2 last out, so we automatically slide on back to the next race and use it.

If you question any of these pace lines, feel free to try your own, but also consider that they were chosen in strict accordance with the Methodology and that if you are using vastly different lines and not getting positive results, you should re-think your pace line selection strategy.

We will answer the OPEN ADJUSTMENT? question with 0 (zero) in all cases.

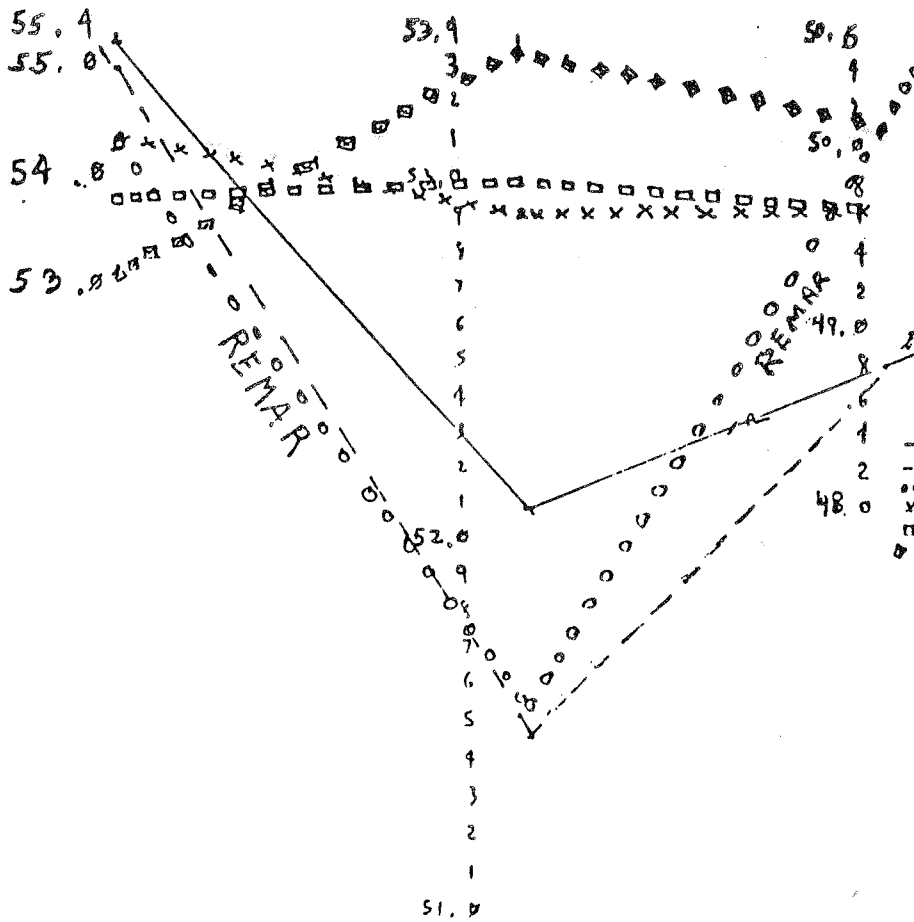

IN CONCLUSION

All computer handicapping procedures are dependent upon user input. If the user is making proper entries, the majority of the time, the computer readouts will respond proportionately. Synergism II, because of the Doctor Factor, will often over-ride user errors. Ours is a volume method. Success is determined over the course of many races; no fewer than 20 races to each cycle.

Consequently, you may find yourself losing races you feel should have been easy wins. By the same token, you'll discover that Synergism II readouts will point to long priced winners you barely dreamed of getting. Getting upset or anxiety ridden over an occasional loss will prove counter-productive. Evaluate your progress over a cycle of 20 races, NOT on the outcome of a single event or a day at the races.

Follow the regression we have prescribed from the beginning. Use the new Track Profile Sheet provided herein. Model Factor W, % Median and the Doctor Factor. Pay less attention to Early Pace and Sustained Pace than you have in the past. Adapt yourself to the realities of Synergism II and you will benefit as never before.



A USER'S PERSPECTIVE

by Dick Schmidt

Over the past year and a half, I have answered a great many questions about using Synergism. To preclude at least a few of those calls about Synergism II, I thought I'd jot down a few notes about Synergism II from a user's point of view. All of the following are procedures that have worked for me here in Southern California. Feel free to give any or all of them a try.

If you try them, and they don't work, please don't call me and ask why. They don't work for you because: (Choose one) A) your track is different, B) you choose contenders differently, C) you choose pace lines differently, D) you're a dummy. In no particular order, some thoughts on using Synergism II:

If you are using the Auto-Adjust feature, it is not necessary to make any changes to a pace line. The program takes care of sprinters stretching out or routers going shorter. I personally prefer to take the internal fractions of a route and create my own 6 furlong race, but it is not necessary. Remember that a horse moving from one course to another at the same track is still a shipper (i.e. a horse moving from 1 1/16 mile on the dirt to 1 1/16 mile on the turf IS a shipper!). If the horse is changing distances, it is automatically considered a shipper and the program will not ask you about it.

If you are using your own variants and not the Auto-Adjust feature of Synergism II, you will still get all the benefits of the

Late Pace and Doctor Factor readouts. However, you will need to enter a sprint to route adjustment. In Southern California, the adjustment is 2.3, which is added to any other variant and entered into the OPEN ADJUSTMENT. This adjustment not only offsets the difference between sprinters and routers, but also takes into consideration the difference in the Racing Form's points of call in routes and sprints. You may well find that this is too much, or not enough in your area. If you can make adjustments well enough not to use the Auto-Adjust, you should have no trouble finding the correct adjustment. Remember, this is only for those of you making your own adjustments. If you use the Auto-Adjust, enter the horses and let her rip!

As time goes by, we seem to be using fewer and fewer class adjustments. We started using an adjustment of .15 for every class level a horse was moving. Then we cut it to .08. For the last few months, I have used fewer and fewer class adjustments. My way of looking at it is: either a horse is a contender or it isn't. If it is, it shouldn't need help, if it isn't, why pump it up? I still make track-to-track adjustments, but even here I am cautious. A \$16,000 claimer coming down to Santa Anita from Bay Meadows gets a 0 adjustment, because these horses run about the same as our \$16,000 horses. On the other hand, a \$50,000 claimer from the same track would get a -.25 adjustment, because the higher claiming ranks in Southern California are much tougher. A little local knowledge goes a long way.

When we started using Synergism, we entered all the lines we had from whatever track and distance had the most common lines. If we had three 6 furlong races from Hollywood and one each from Santa Anita and

Saratoga, we would put in all three of the common lines and use them for our set up. After Synergism had been out for a while, Howard wrote an article telling users not to use any line that was much faster or slower than the expected pace of today's race. From there, it was a short distance to using the projected times calculated as Jim Bradshaw and Michael Pizzolla have shown us how to do. For the past year, I have been using projected times as my set up line, entering just the one set of times, and leaving it at that. It works for me.

Try not to get too fixated on the sort numbers and on your Brohamer Model. No lesser authority than Tom Brohamer himself has warned about races that "set up" for one horse or another, and defy the model. Use all the readouts we give you. Each is there for a purpose. Pay attention to the Dream Race and the E.S.P. Match-Up. Remember, what you do before you turn your computer on is much more important than what happens after you turn it on.

The readout giving estimated beaten lengths at the second call has been greatly improved in Synergism II. If you keep a track profile, you will know how far back a horse can be and still win. If your profile for a certain distance shows that not one contender has been further back than 5 lengths and still managed to get up to win, then a contender calculated to be 7 or 8 lengths back may no longer figure for win even if the track is running Sustained and the horse is number one in Sustained Pace. I don't advise tossing a horse because it is a half length too far back, but be aware of this tool. Keeping track of predicted beaten lengths in your model might be an excellent idea. I do it.

Don't second guess the program. It's smarter than you are.

E X A M P L E R A C E S

The example races you are about to review were not chosen by myself, but are actual races sent to me by one of our clients' testing SYNERGISM II. On July 17, 1988, at Hollywood Park, this particular client swept the card of nine races. In addition to winning all nine races, the client also had the Daily Double, five exactas and the daily triple (three times). Not bad results for a client who has only been using the methodology for a short period of time and only on a part-time basis at that. I have withheld the name (and sex) of the client to protect his/her identity at the clients' request.

I am not going to do a horse by horse analysis of these races. You can go over these races for yourself, looking at the pacelines chosen by the client, comparing them to what you might have done. The only comment I will make is to say that in the eighth race, the client bet ANNOCONNER (the third best sustained horse) because of the tremendous overlay. Other than that, the winners are all in the top two and the results pretty much speak for themselves.
