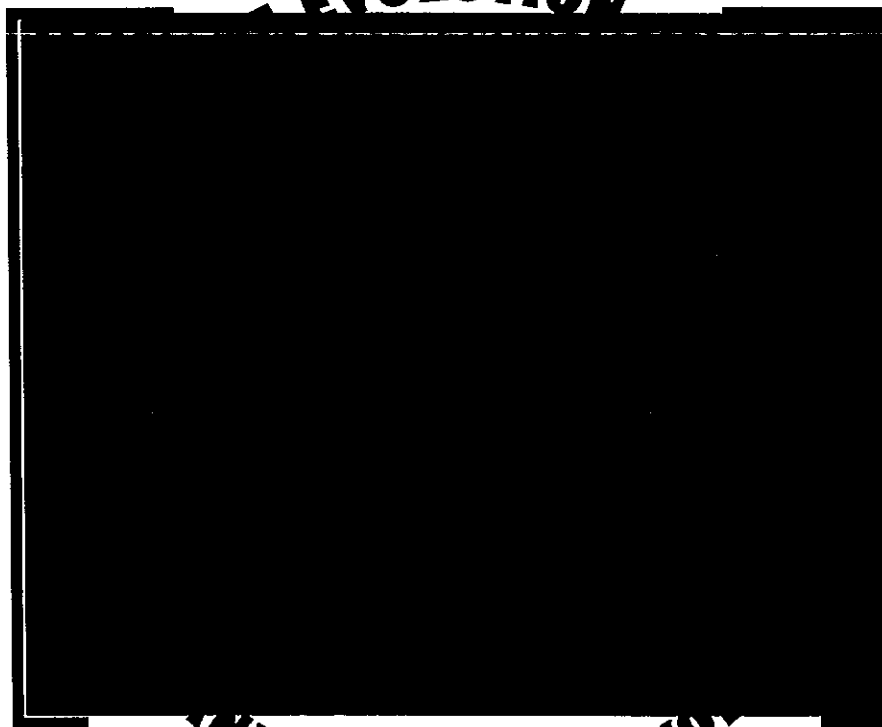

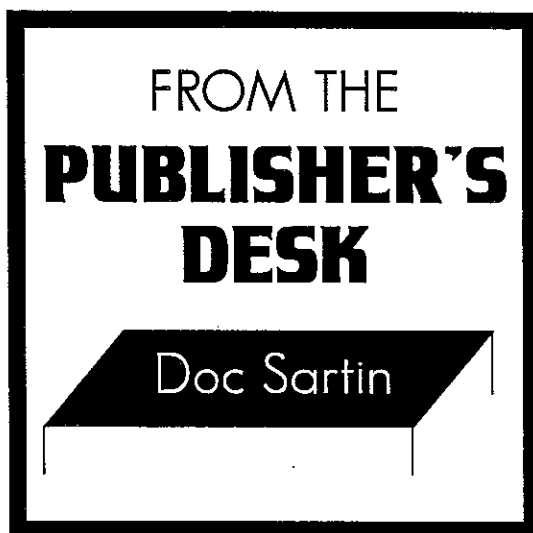

The following two examples utilizing Racingchannel live odds are a boon to phone bettors. It shows the morning line odds and the actual odds at any given time before a race (in this case, five minutes before post). This allows you to "hide" the low odds horse(s) that you don't want to bet on and recalculate the race.

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This web site, www.Racingchannel.com, covers just about every track I know of and some I have never heard of, like Harrington, Mohawk and Freehold among others. Besides Win, Place and Show odds, it also displays payoffs for Exactas, Quinellas, Doubles and shows entries, changes or results. The results screen allows you to go back as far as 30 days for any track on their list. The odds change every 30 seconds, so you don't miss a thing. The example below, after hiding the favorite ADORA, makes BLARNEY an acceptable Win bet changing it from an underlay to an overlay.

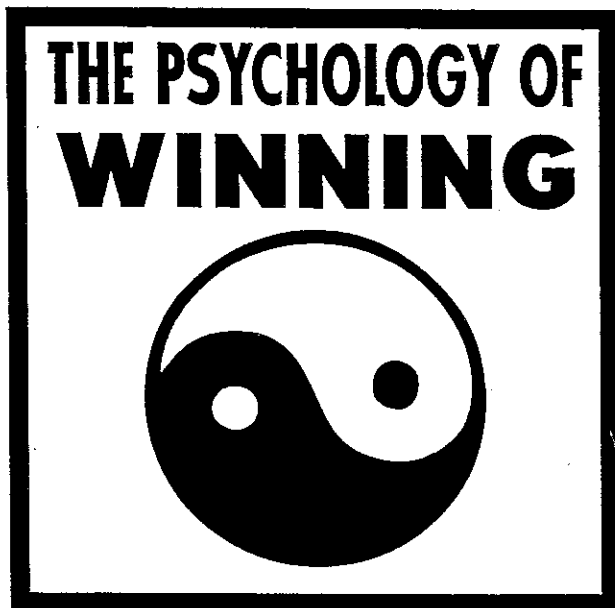

Part One - Psycho-neuro-immunology

In 1987 the 3rd Edition of the Diagnostic & Statistical Manual of the American Psychiatric Association first listed Gambling as a Disease: a Disorder of Impulse Control. In the 1994 edition, Gambling, as a Disease, was emphasized even more. It was listed along with Kleptomania, Pyromania and others, as an official Disorder, hence a Disease, replacing the old term: Compulsive Gambler.

In 1987, at the 7th International Conference on Gambling & Risk Taking, I submitted a paper and a symposium speech protesting the edict universally accepted by the current hierarchy of psychiatrists, psychologists and sociologists.

I insisted that **gambling** is **not** a disease. The real disease, by their own records, is NON-WINNING!

I had the largest audience of the conclave because all members of the disease oriented medical mainstream wanted to witness my revolution against accepted rule. I tried to keep it humorous. I cited the fact that all the persons from whom they had gathered their prevailing gloomy statistics were dedicated losers who had suffered economic, familial and/or legal consequences from their inability to stop gambling or to channel their gambling urges to a potentially profitable source. Never, in even one of their august journals, had they ever mentioned studying **winners**.

In short, at all levels, they were operating from the classic medical sick mode! i.e. studying only those with a disorder and none coming from the same environment who were not sick.

They focused solely on the **negative** and ignored the positive. WHY? Because the leaders of this international group guiding world opinion about gambling refused to accept the fact that **winners did exist**. It is their claim that the only people who won were those professionals who were either bookies or working in operations controlled by the "House" or the Track.

Further, they refused to accept the fact that there is huge difference in the psychological make up of those wagering on Parimutuel events and the casino gambler. There is perhaps, a 20% overlap. But a good 80% of horse race bettors do not share the same frenetic behavior patterns observable on the floors of casinos. Horse wagering parlors are in separate rooms or crannies within a casino operation and the difference in behavior is notable. Yet, no leading member of the Healing Arts professions would accompany me to a "Horse Room," which was in an enclosed room at the Reno MGM Grand where the conference was being held.

Two non-hierarchy professionals did accompany me. They were Michael Walker, Psychologist, University of Sydney, Australia, and from the University of Nevada, Reno, Ph.D John Rosencrance. Both subsequently wrote about my efforts in expensive textbooks - the kind usually read by all the *wrong* people. Both stated that my concept of a **viable alternative** to losing has a very promising future. Rosecrance even came to some of our meetings and discovered that many clients had suffered the same problems as the losers lying in those medical mainstream hospital beds or sitting in controlled therapy groups. Even I didn't know all the degradations some of our people had been through.

So let us accept the dictum's of those psychiatric healing arts professional who insist that a disorder or disease is involved in all gambling. Let's take it one step further and make the positive assumption that the disease is **not** gambling.

The DIS-Ease is NON-winning.

If we accept that as fact, **two** outstanding cures have been offered. The first was in 1989 by Deepak Chopra, M.D. We presented his cure in several 1990 Follow Up articles. I said his book *Quantum Healing* was the best text on successful handicapping/wagering to date if the reader was willing to interpret his words and substitute "horse racing" where applicable.

Many clients took my advice, read the book and attempted to apply its content to their daily handicapping routine. Some even succeeded; most for just a short time until the inspiration wore off, but a few others still understand and continue to practice Deepak's teachings. They remain consistent winners.

If some were turned off by Chopra it was because of his focus on Hindu Ayurvedic healing and his praise for the Maharishi Mehesh Yogi whose followers introduced Transcendental Meditation (TM) to North America and apparently allowed it to be overly commercialized by a few entrepreneurs who were arguably unscrupulous.

Some clients resisted saying that India, where Deepak originated, was fraught with disease; hence Ayurveda didn't work. They failed to read Chopra's statement that Ayurveda had been minimally practiced in India since the nation had been indoctrinated by British Medicine, a carry over from the 18th Century lasting until after WW2. The influence of the medicine of British Imperialism to this day has served to all but wipe out India's classic Ayurvedic tradition.

They also resented, as do I, the many TM practitioners who overcharged for lessons and insisted that each TM student have his own mantra, allegedly personalized for them by teachers from sacred ancient Sanskrit writings.

Not so. Choose one of the two most effective mantra's for our purpose and chant one under your breath or when alone: WIN-NER, WIN-NER....or, PROF-IT, PROF-IT. The mantra is an essential part of meditative self-help. We have several clients following this procedure and the results have been extremely positive. I'll expand on cure for NON-winning in Part Two of this series, next Follow Up..

Fast forward to 1998 and we have an American Ph.D who actually preceded Deepak with a Westernized, Psycho-neuro-immunology (actually one word) research career that incorporates Chopra's concepts with recent advances in Western Psycho-Biology.

The name of the American scientist is Candace Pert, Ph.D., formerly of Johns Hopkins and the National Institute of Health who resigned both jobs because of male mainstream bias that caused her to lose the Lasker Award, precursor to the Nobel.

I, along with a host of others, feel she richly deserved both prizes. She is currently is Professor of Physiology and Biophysics at Georgetown University Medical Center in Washington, D.C.

Science, like handicapping is not for men only.

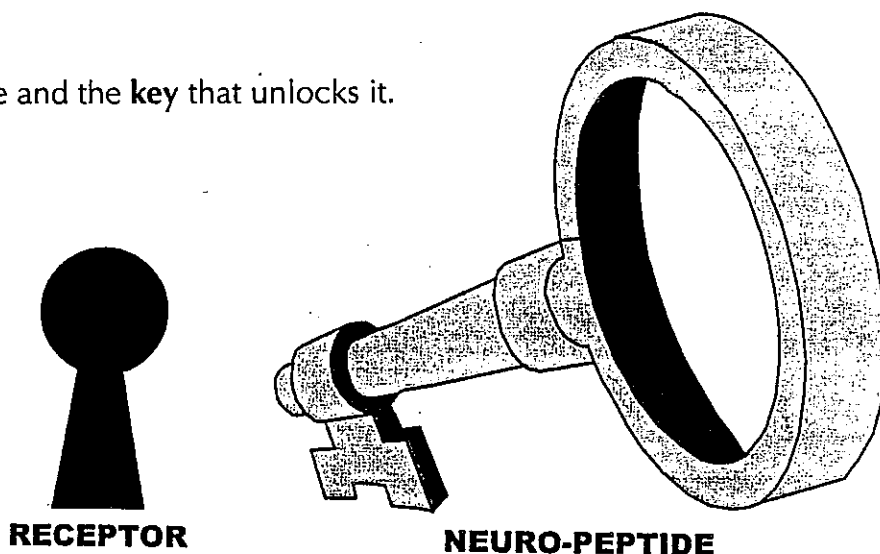
In 1972 Dr. Pert was acknowledged as the discoverer of the Opiate Receptor. At the time this was determined as the sole Receptor receiving the Peptides sent by our natural endorphins: the body's natural chemical (peptide) source of joy, bliss, well-being and other higher conscious aspects of behavior so often attributed to morphine derivatives, antidepressants and benzodiazepines like Valium.

These natural neuropeptides are extremely potent weapons in our battle to win races and money. When we deny their natural flow we limit our chances to succeed immeasurably. The manner in which our mind/body balance limits natural neuropeptide flow is by inserting what is called an Antagonist.

Dr. Pert's research is being done on physical maladies, especially chronic ones like cancer, AIDS, respiratory ailments, heart disease and others more important to society than curing NON-winning. Yet, the principles of her research apply equally to the disorder that to NON-winners is comparable to the Bubonic Plague.

ANTAGONISTS

Picture a keyhole and the **key** that unlocks it.



Focus on the **keyhole** itself as the **receptor** into which the free flow of antibodies is essential in order to **cure** that disease; in this case the DIS-EASE of losing - or as I prefer to call it, NON-winning.

Now stuff something into that keyhole so the key can **not** be inserted and turned. That something is a an ANTAGONIST preventing the binding of Ligands to the Receptor. Ligands are a variety of small molecules that specifically **bind** to a cellular Receptor conveying an **informational message** to the cell. Any Antagonist blocking the Receptor (keyhole) will limit or distort receipt of INFORMATION, making it useless or counterproductive.

Contaminated opinions, stubborn resistance to reality and a variety of *subjective* notions are the most insidious of antagonists in our field. Just as is Mind/Body resistance to natural antibiotic neuropeptides in attempting to cure physical (and mental) disease.

In one way we are fortunate that our disease: non-winning, is mental and not a bombardment of cells gone awry attacking our body to the point of total destruction. Modern medicine, led by, among others, Dr. Pert, Bernie Siegal and Deepak Chopra, has made great strides to cure illnesses that have been deemed by mainstream medicine as INcurable, but has not yet achieved ultimate success.

While we are burdened by the same kind of mainstream "experts" that conspired to deny Dr. Pert her awards and, over the centuries have stood in the pathway of medical advances, such as not recognizing the existence of germs or the need for surgeons to wash their hands before operating (small matters compared to a number other medical mainstream oversights).

We don't have to be burdened with accepting the status quo. **We** don't have to endure the possibility of iatrogenic diseases so rampant in today's hospitals caused by physicians themselves. In our case, make 'Physicians' read 'Handicapping Author-Experts'.

We can just decide to let curing neuropeptides flow freely into our RECEPTORS and live free of the DIS-ease of NON-winning. We can remove the ANTAGONIST(S) plugging our Informational Keyhole, insert and turn the Key that will make us consistent winners of races and money!

Unfortunately not everyone can simply decide to do this. We have been indoctrinated with the concept that attempting self-cure is contrary to "doctor's advice;" that we must seek professional help. That M.D. stands for "Messianic Deity." A dear friend of mine, an M.D. himself, says that unless one knows medicine almost as well as the doctor and can correctly self-diagnose, he/she is at great risk because, with general practitioners especially, diagnostics is a lost art and not emphasized in medical schools. That fact was confirmed to me by no less than the Director of Medicine at California's renowned Loma Linda Teaching Hospital and University.

A frightening reality.

At this point we have reviewed Dr. Pert's accomplishments through the year 1972 when she discovered the Opiate Receptor. For us this was an extremely important discovery. It should help all those who feel that psychology is bunch of crap. Dr. Pert, along with Chopra and many others, has proved a definite MIND/BODY connection in all behavior: both molecular and functional.

To this point I've essentially just revealed the amazing role played by your natural endorphins, when allowed to reach your Opiate Receptor UNABATED by any ANTAGONIST, creating a natural sense of euphoria and well-being so essential in permitting our handicapping information and advanced computer technology to work optimally in your behalf.

From 1972 through 1997, Dr. Pert discovered and proved many more Bio-Physiological concepts that we can interpret for our benefit. However, even though she is primarily a Bio-Physiologist, she is also vitally aware of the psychological aspects that effect her conclusions. It is for good reason that the organizational term for her efforts is: "Psychoneuroimmunology"

In previous Follow Up articles I stressed the Mind/Body healing techniques of Deepak Chopra. Perhaps I did not stress them enough. Similar yet newly expanded techniques are described by Dr. Candace Pert in her Book: *Molecules of Emotion, Why You Feel The Way You Feel*.

I said of Deepak's *Quantum Healing* that, properly interpreted it might be the best book ever written on handicapping and making a profit therefrom. Now I can state that Dr. Pert's book may be an even better text for our needs. I'm sure that both she and Chopra might not be sympathetic with the purpose for which I propose to use their works.

They have loftier goals - for them.

I'm not trying to offer a cure for cancer, heart disease or AIDS. Just one for NON-winning. To us that's a BIG "just." Perhaps we shouldn't tell them that they've offered a means to cure our DIS-ease with their research. They might be offended.

Now that I've gone over the basics with as little technical terminology as possible, we are prepared to move on to Part Two of offering the cure for the disease of NON-winning (coming in Follow Up #73).

Ironically this will be our New Year Issue designed to **cure** all who are afflicted with the disease of non-winning as well as for those who tend to vacillate, have cyclic win/loss records, or still suffer from the dreaded Sisyphus syndrome.

These books are both available to read for yourselves. Dr. Pert's *Molecules of Emotion, Why You Feel the Way You Feel*, was published in 1997 by Scribner's with a foreword by Deepak Chopra. Also available is a Simon & Schuster four part Audio Tape read by the author.

It is recommended reading, but since most won't buy the book or tape I'll continue to draw from its wisdom and simplify it in Part Two of this series. My attempt at simplification might be distasteful to the author who provides a Glossary at the end of her book and thus most probably thinks its already simple enough.

She enjoys the admirable position of, while not writing down to her readers, she seems to imply that they should rise to a level of comprehension somewhat akin to her own.

That technique has a low success rate with handicappers.

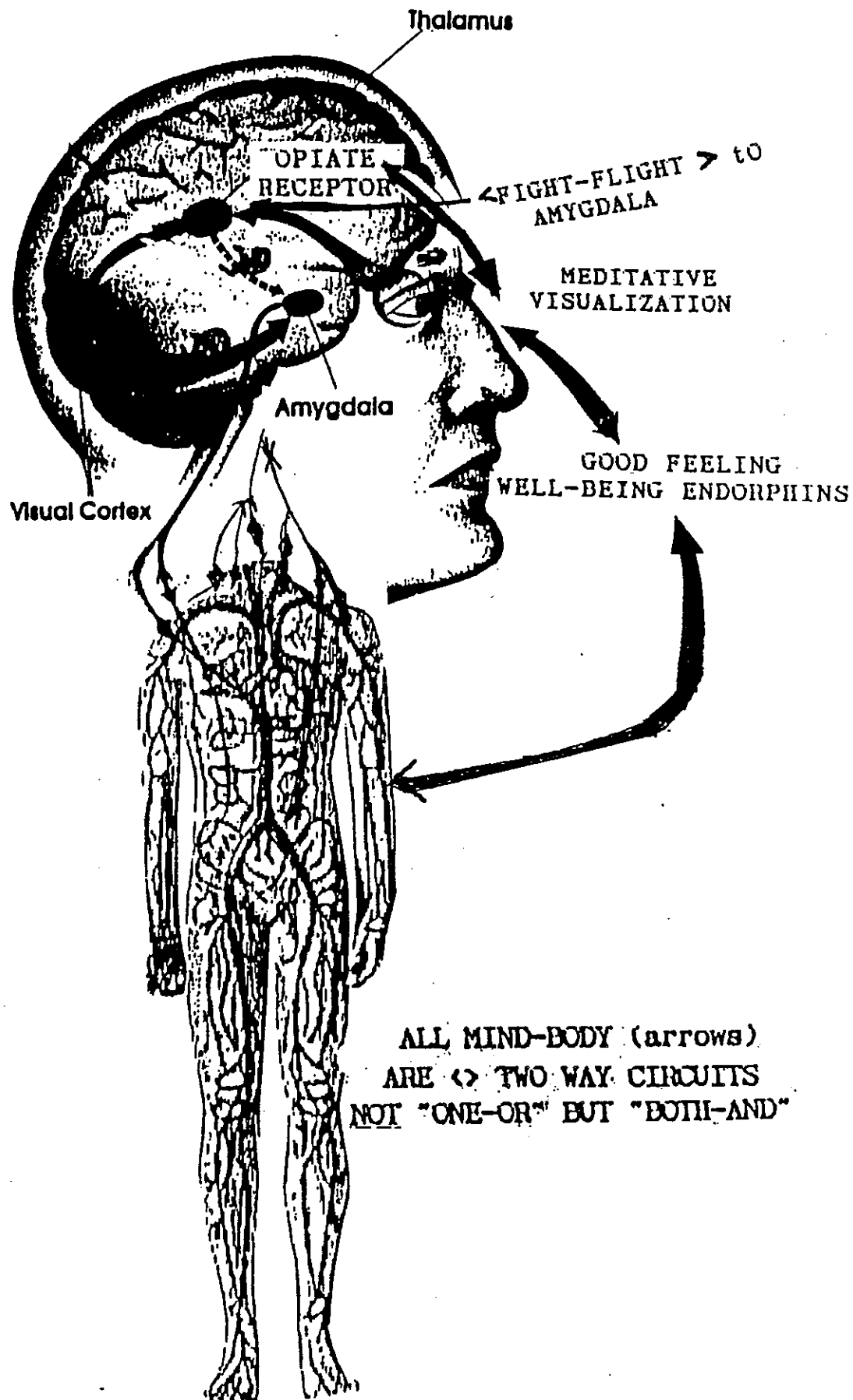

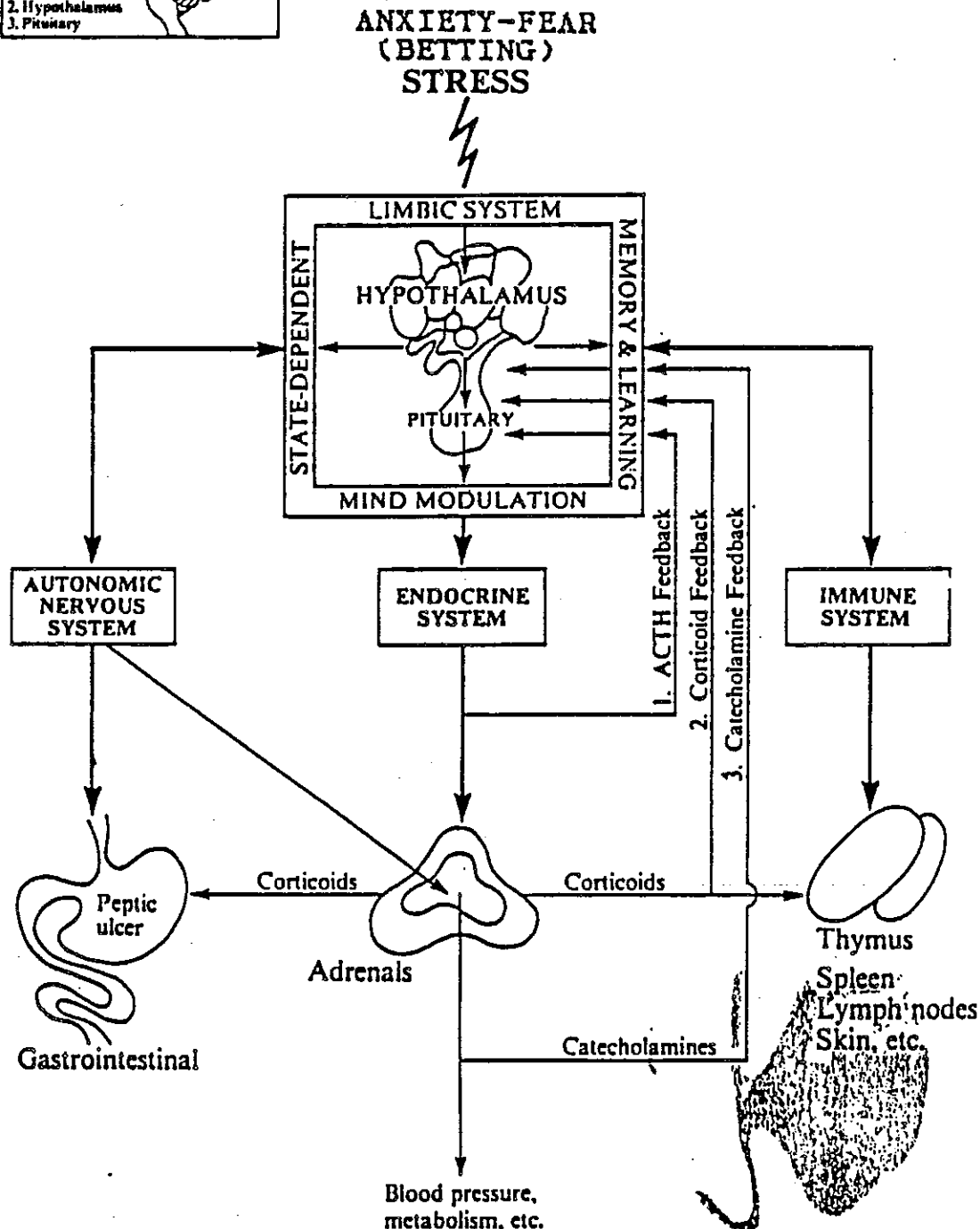
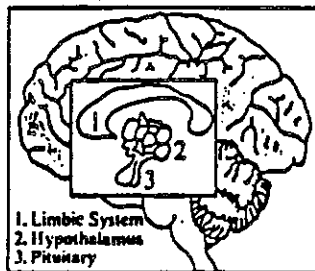

One bright client whose Wagering Form results we reprinted often, focuses on these charts BEFORE he begins handicapping and takes them to track or betting site and concentrates on their content BEFORE he wagers. His handicapping AND PROFIT results have improved dramatically.

Of course, you'll only get out of this series what you're willing to put into it. If you scoff at it or claim not to understand it, you'll get no benefit. That would be a shame because it works. Those who have put the cure into action are succeeding. Their positive results are a matter of record. Why let them make all the profit when it's there for **you** as well?



General Adaptation - Learning Syndrome *emphasizing* the *mind modulating* role of the Limbic/Hypothalamic System on the Autonomic, Endocrine and Immune Systems (*Immune* here meaning *immune from NON-winning*). RECORDS AND RECORDS

"PSSST. HEY BUDDY. OVER HERE! YOU LOOKIN' FOR A WINNER? I GOTTA HOT ONE FOR YOU. CAN'T MISS!"

Looking for an absolute in handicapping? How about 'bet the horse with the jockey, it will win today'. Boy. That's one we could certainly single. Only which one is it? How do I know which horses to bet? All this data. All these columns. Early. Late. Energy. Median Energy. BL/BL. SPN. TS. TPP. Fractals. Seems pretty easy to become confused. Underlay. Overlay. And the column that is not there. The column that is the most important to me and to you, the ROI. Return On Investment. The Doing is Truing column. If it is always in the red or loss side it does not make much sense to look at any of these other indicators. Unless of course I use a day at the races to make a few business deals to cover the losses and they get written off, like they do with a business foursome on the golf course. So how do I know which horses are contenders and which are pretenders? How do I find not the 'sure thing' but the 'right thing'? RECORDS. It is my RECORDS that show me which factors are the most predictive at this time. That lead me to the winners window. That tell me that there is no 'sure thing' BUT that do tell me where the bettable winners are coming from. Without them it is like starting over with each race on every race card. Any advantage I hoped to have gained I have given back if I do not keep records and USE them. Without them I lose the intuitive insight into how MY handicapping is selecting contenders and winners. Winners I might not have had if I had not had some 'extra' information to use as a guide. And it is not information I could get from anywhere else. It is MY data. Like the horse who shows # 1's in TT and HE and with the highest SUPPLEMENTAL readout only a 3 in Entropy and is #3 BL/BL. The Record sheet says this is a PRIMARY Win candidate and it ranks third on BL/BL. Records point the way to these wins for me. I am not stuck when it comes to decision making and betting time. My RECORDS have led me to the winners window. Lots of # 1's and #2's for the top two contenders. The top BL/BL horse is 5/2. The second one is 3/1. That gets us to the 1,2, and 3 BL/BL horses. The records say it is the 3rd BL/BL and one of the other 2. I go with the top horse. The race runs. The #3 BL/BL wins and pays \$12.60. The top horse is still running and the second horse places. I get the win. Without the records I sit around with a win bet on the place horse as well as the also ran, and an "I shoulda, woulda, coulda" on the tip of my tongue. And what about the other RECORDS? The ROI! It is no accident that the one thing all the "experts" and "wannabe" experts agree on is keeping accurate RECORDS. They are talking specifically about money invested and money returned, the ROI. This formula does not depend on any esoteric criteria or hype or mumbo-jumbo. It is merely the amount won divided by the amount wagered PERIOD. The shared exacta box ticket with the next table, the flyer on the speed horse in the race I did not handicap (looked like the only front runner in the race and would run off and hide), the \$24 ticket on the Pick Six carry-over. All of these "Extras" must be included in an accurate and True investment record. They are a drain on the ROI and must be included so we are not clouded into thinking we are doing better than we are. And if we lie a little, if we cloud it up with "I'm about even", or "I did O.K.", it is as if an employee has returned a portion of his wages to the company. Or he took a momentary, voluntary cut in pay. Yea. Right. This is the Absolute Bottom Line and is the measuring stick of handicapping success or failure.

Ainslie, Mitchell, Meadow, Cramer and Beyer to name a few along with the Doc are all advocates of RECORDS. Especially records on investments and outcomes. And if you want to make it your occupation do not forget to add in ALL the money invested AND the cost of getting the bet made, (the Form, admission, transportation, and program).

The 'Capper with a race day reminder.....work the plan, be profitable. 'Til next time.

As usual, the idiosyncratic BL/BL came up with horses that conventional handicapping would see as doggy doo.

Aline Best says.. ***"It's the final piece of the puzzle!"***

Well, it's not the final piece but it's darn close for those who, by following my directions, include the winner in their TOP 6 contenders chosen from appropriate pacelines.

I've published many of the filled in forms in previous Follow-Ups, circling the races that produced winners paying \$7 and over. It should come as no surprise that the computerized version makes it virtually impossible to lose providing the caveat about following directions is taken seriously and users ignore most of the old handicapping maxims that place personal ego above profit.

In the following tests from Aline Best, Guy Wadsworth and Shane, my biggest problem was getting them to lose or miss enough races to keep this article within the realm of reason for doubters or those who think that traditional "rules" of handicapping should take precedent over the uncanny power of using Synthesis with improved BL/BL in conjunction with the computerized form itself.

Among the problems plaguing doubters are man-made Class distinctions, including drops and rises and especially Track Class adjustments. They also want to focus on distance and surface and other ancillary factors that have heretofore been important *even* in our Methodology.

These factors are still important when isolating contenders and pacelines. But once properly selected, the amount of the **payoff itself** becomes paramount.

My biggest concern with these test results was getting Shane and Guy to leave in certain horses that they would eliminate before going to the 20 Race Cycle Form. I begged them to handicap the way many of you would, leaving in the more obvious choices and HIDING them only after their odds proved too low to warrant a wager.

Of the three, Shane was the hardest to convince. I have to literally stand over his shoulder and force him to include horses he normally eliminates before going to BL/BL. Since the Computerized Form was not ready for Fred Tanaka's results (Follow Up #71), I showed his hand written forms. I got little comfort from him since his ROI, following directions was also astronomical.

Aline Best, with her 1.74 ROI from only the TOP 3 BL/BL AFTER HIDES, was as close as I could find to what I once felt was a NORMAL profit expectation. She is a relative newcomer to handicapping, lives on a tight income, is partially disabled and is by far the most conservative of all the Synthesis users that I am able to observe on almost a daily basis. Still, a 1.74 R.O.I.

exceeds the highest expectations published by recognized author-experts.

Almost obscene is the 2.25 and 2.24 ROI'S posted by Guy and the 1.76 by Shane's Top 3 and 2.85, TOP 4. His only BL/BL 4th Tier Horse paid \$83.40. I doubt if even Aline, who seldom goes beyond the 3rd Tier, would pass up a bet on THAT winner.

Despite the doubters and others who refuse to follow directions these reports are accurate! I personally stood over 3 of the testers as they handicapped and produced their Before and After Reports. In Guy's case, my suspicions caused me to make him do TWO 20 race cycles, both at Santa Anita. His results were almost identical, both cycles.

All my testers did not even put into their computer certain races that didn't qualify according to our published standards: maiden races with more than one first time starter, races in which too many horses had to be projected or extracted, races with foreign horses having no North American Lines. Guy and Shane ignored races for two year olds. Aline didn't. She did two; won one, lost the other.

I offered no handicapping advice to any of the testers. I insisted only that they follow contender/paceline and HIDE directions as published in the Follow Up and the Synthesis manual. After converting Fred Tanaka away from many of his traditional handicapping precepts I had four persons willing to test my cure - as prescribed - for the disease of non-winning. It was much like Dr. Salk testing his vaccine on willing human guinea pigs before releasing his Polio vaccine.

These kinds of results will be doubted and contested by all who think that winning races is more important than making a profit. And by all those who still insist on intellectualizing the handicapping process, still follow certain mainstream concepts and are overly concerned with who will take the lead today, man-made class, track class and self-determined adjustments.

All the races on these BEFORE & AFTER HIDE Wagering Forms represent WIN MUTUELS only with no concern for Distance, Surface or any other handicapping factor *except* in the selection of contenders and pacelines. Those choices were made by following the previously published directions. Ironically, those who either don't understand or refuse to follow those directions will benefit from this Computerized Wagering Form, Because if they do enough 20 race cycles, and go back after losing races and insert winners from appropriate lines, they'll actually learn how to get proper contenders and predictive lines.

To someone with conventional **left** brained logic such a procedure may seem nonsensical. However, it is the way most winners have done it: Starting with at the ultimate result and working *backwards* toward their goal of profitable selection. Preventive medicine pioneers do it that way. They study healthy persons and learn how they got that way. In so doing they offer prevention of disease. The conventional procedure in medicine and handicapping, is to study the sick mode and try to develop a magic bullet that will return persons to health.

Books, articles and lectures on handicapping are nothing more than magic bullets; pills designed to cure handicapping ills. In truth, even the best of these vehicles can only help you find viable contenders. Some include running line selection. Information provided by lesser sources will most often lead you away from the kinds of contenders paying the higher mutuels.

Read over any of the handicapping books in your own collection. You'll find sets of elimination

"Rules" that would remove from consideration almost every double digit mutuel on the following reports. Following the dictates of most available informational material you'd wind up on low priced favorites and near-favorites.

The Value Boys attempted to override the problem of betting on low odds horses NOT by altering the alleged rules for getting contenders, but by telling us to wait until the PUBLIC let one of these qualifiers go off at a decent price. Despite Mark Cramer's claim, I am not one of the Value Boys. I do not accept conventional elimination rules or guidelines. I don't wager on a horse because it is an overlay, I demand a minimum mutuel of no less than \$7. I do not recommend waiting for the public to "let" some horse go off at high odds. I've always insisted that we should look hard for the kinds of horses the public tends to ignore in the first place. Horses that, if you'll enter an appropriate paceline into Synthesis, will often AFTER HIDES, end up in BL/BL's TOP 3 Tiers paying a double digit mutuel.

Read the Vox Pop letters from clients who lost a race, went home, put the winner IN the computer and had it come up in the 1st, 2nd or 3rd Tier of BL/BL. They learned from their mistakes. One of the primary purposes of Vox Pop is to help all clients learn from others' positive procedures that lead to success.

You must keep in mind that virtually every Vox Pop letter is written by someone who once was making the same mistakes made by all non-winners. These letter writers have all converted themselves into winners by abandoning the conventional wisdoms of their handicapping past. That is the only real difference between them and those who say they envy them but cannot duplicate their progress. The real word is not "CANNOT." It is "WILL NOT".

Anyone laying ill with some dreaded disease would take whatever medicine their practitioner prescribes. But standing erect with the disease of non-winning, that person will stubbornly resist help and continue the life-style (handicapping style) that causes the DIS-ease.

I witness it daily.

However, several hundred clients who once resisted have been converted into winners making substantial profit. I can only pray that some day all others will join them.

The Computerized Wagering Form, BEFORE and AFTER HIDES, may not be the absolute FINAL piece of the puzzle, but it's a damned good start toward the Nirvana we all seek.

In past issues we focused largely on western tracks because of the immediate availability of past performances and results.

There are still some clients from east of the Rockies who think their tracks are DIFFERENT. We've commented on the error of such thinking for over 20 years but for some, to no avail.

In this issue we're publishing races and user comments from tracks other than those in the far west (see Vox Pop with more results from a new client handicapping Louisiana Downs).

Shane uses the TrackMaster download for all races, including these. He's too busy answering phone queries to hand enter races. His success using the TM download has been quite positive. He sees no reason to hand enter. I frequently hand enter to help those who don't download and to compare results.

The procedure used in handicapping these races was to follow my guidelines re: contender/ paceline selection and to HIDE all horses with odds too low to warrant a WIN wager. If all of you would do this, your profits would increase astronomically. Keep two sets of BI/BL printout IF you wager on exotics. The PLACE and/or SHOW horse may be going off at odds too low for a WIN bet but will figure in the Exotic.

A Worst Case Win Percent Scenario from Aline Best Win & Place ~ 20 Races

Throughout this issue I've been showing best and worst case scenarios from the few clients who've been testing and using the **new** computerized version of BL/BL with HIDES from the Synthesis Super-Screen.

One 20 race cycle from Aline Best represented a worst case scenario in which her profit over three days was only \$61.70, based on betting only \$2 each on her two horses to win. Betting \$10 on each horse to win would have yielded a profit of \$308.50 which, for someone on Social Security Disability, is a goodly amount.

Just before sending this issue to the typist I asked Aline for another cycle of races handicapped before-the-fact using the new program and HIDING all horses that did not meet her minimum wager requirement.

While she was at it, I asked that she use the same program to get the prices paid by horses that actually placed, NOT winner's place prices.

On her initial report she downloaded results from TrackMaster. On this one she hand-entered results from our regional newspaper.

She only won 11 of 20 in the TOP 3 tiers of BL/BL: 55% winners. 9 of 20, TOP 2 tiers, 45%. There was a day when such a percentages were scorned. We've come a long way since then. Let's examine her results:

BEFORE HIDES: she had 3 wins on 4th tier of BL/BL and 3 from tier 5.

AFTER HIDES: she had only 1 win on tiers 4 and 5. Note how the \$66.60 winner went from tier 4 to tier TWO!

Ignoring the wins on tiers 4 & 5, here is what she accomplished just on her TOP 3 tiered BL/BL. She missed 7 winners altogether. Despite that she made a gross of \$236.60. Based on \$2 bets on TWO horses to win. That's \$80. Her net profit was \$156.60. Look at the dates. The cycle was from 10/9 through 10/11, three racing days!

Making a \$10 wager on each of her winners ups her 3 day net to \$783.

Aline said to me when she handed me these reports: "Thank God for my handicapping ignorance. I just do as you taught me. I don't try to be what you guys call a "handicapper."

From the same program I also include her PLACE HORSE Form. Don't try HIDING from this, Let what you see be what you get. What you get from horses that just place, is not often very much.

Aline has found that my cure for non-winning works because she doesn't fight my instructions and gets contenders and pacelines solely by following my directions. She's no dummy. She senses when rigidly using the best of the last three lines is not optimal. But, in her case, that's only in 1 out of 10 races.

A Potpourri of New Wagering Strategies

I am opposed to the offering of so many authors who give strict Money Management instructions. They are subjective rules that theoretically work for the instructor but they invade the private domain of the user. How you bet and how *much* you bet is as personal as one's religion. Imposing on that sacred area is akin to missionaries who burn down totem poles and put up crosses.

So I don't care if you bet \$2 or \$200. I can only offer strategies and leave the amounts bet up to you.

Much has been made of the fact that I don't personally download and always buy a Racing Form to check for horses that may have been left out or improperly projected or Xtracted. While I don't execute the TrackMaster downloading, I have lots of help. Shane, Aline or Guy; sometimes all three. I take their readouts, compare them and then follow the exact directions I offer you: hiding and crossing out horses with odds too low to bet. This invariably moves OVERLAYS from 4th, even 5th to a much more attractive position.

It is betting strategy, not handicapping that's now uppermost in the minds of those using Synthesis. Because, as Tom Ainslie has stated, with Synthesis, handicapping as popularly defined, is all done for you!

The old 60-40 Proportion made obsolete

Following the directions offered in Follow Up #71, and repeated elsewhere, we no longer have to proportion our wagers 60-40. This procedure was designed to *increase* the profit on winners paying less than 5-2 (\$7). By wagering 60-40 a \$6 horse would pay \$9, a \$4 winner \$6, etc. IF you still persist in betting low priced horses, keep on using 60-40. Otherwise make your two horse wager 50-50.

Just go over some of the Pace Launcher/Synthesis Wagering Decision Charts published in this and other Follow Ups. You'll see the big advantage you'll have by proportional betting with a 50-50 split.

For those still having decision problems I strongly suggest that you read and digest the material in this issue's Psychology of Winning, in which I begin a series about the cure for the DIS-ease of losing, or as I prefer to call it, NON-winning.

In his article about BL/BL in the recent Cramer-Olmstead Report, Mark wrote this:

My first inkling of a personal odds line came from a conversation with Dick Mitchell, back in the early eighties. He said: "If anyone can develop an accurate odds line, he'll never have to work a day again in his life."

This first paragraph personifies Mitchell's tendency toward hyperbole and reliance on theory. Otherwise we would not have the benefit of his continued employment. We all know that even with a SUPER accurate Betting Line as offered by proper utilization of BL/BL, not all clients using Synthesis can afford to quit their jobs.

In this next quote from the same article, Cramer is more accurate.

All along, I felt that if Sartin's unique analysis could be put into the format of an odds line, all I'd have to do was bet the overlays and, I could not help but win.

A far more realistic approach to the subject because he uses the word 'I'. He doesn't say: "HE'LL (why leave out SHE) never have to work a day again in his (her) life.

The caveat is in the words "All I'D have to do was bet the OVERLAYS and, I could not help but WIN! Unfortunately we're NOT all blessed with Mark's unique skills and handicapping insights.

If Mark has a fault it's thinking that everyone's skill level can be raised to equal his own. It's a marvelous Christian-like attitude but neither he nor I have managed to accomplish such a goal. I freely admit it; he still has hope.

His last three books that deal with betting horses make a good stab at it. However, since Mark is a Philosopher not a Psychologist he may not realize that for anyone to get value from reading KINKY or KINKIER HANDICAPPING, they have to be KINKY themselves. While Mark chose the titles for their possible prurient appeal, KINKY is not applied as sexual deviation but as confirmed DEVIATION from the mainstream NORM in handicapping. This is probably why Barry Meadow panned both books. They offended his mainstream mentality.

Beside which Barry makes his profits by panning anything that might be worthwhile.

I recommended Mark's latest book *Value Handicapping* because it is conceptually true and amazingly accurate. Some people, including American Turf Monthly reviewer, Vince Doyle, were less than kind in their comments about the book because they felt it was too subjective and that Mark didn't offer enough detail to make the book fully understandable to the masses. What book, outside of a comic book, ever was?

The fact of the matter is that making a personal (non-computerized) Odds Line is beyond the skill of 99% of all handicappers. Even those who say they do it, Like Meadow himself, only make an annual profit of FOUR percent from betting horses.

This fact was openly admitted by Barry to Cramer and published in the C&O Report along with the article in which Cramer made a 258% PROFIT from the \$100 he sent us to test OUR BL/BL. Even in his book *Money Secrets at the Racetrack*, Meadow only projected a potential profit of from 8 to 10%. Here it is photocopied from his book:

THE TRUTH ABOUT MONEY

Even when you play the game with an advantage—and a professional bettor may realistically expect to win 8% to 10% on each invested dollar—your losing streaks will astonish you. Playing five races a day five times a week, it is no big deal to lose for months at a time.

Anyone who tells you different is lying.

—“ANYONE who tells you different is LYING?

By my standards anyone who does NOT tell you different is functioning from a negative and highly SUBJECTIVE mind-set, imposing his OWN failure on everyone else and calling it a statistic. NO wonder BARRY makes such a good living writing inexactitudes and slandering those who don't share his negativity.

Midwest & New York

In keeping with our pledge to offer more non-West Coast races, we go to Illinois and N.Y. for nine races. The majority of these are consecutive same day races. I like to see that. It proves consistency. Winning several overlays on the same day is TRUE proof of success.

One of our favorite people and top Midwest correspondent is Michael K, a Marine Vet who is a stickler for anonymity. He doesn't want to be a Teaching Member because he spends all his extra time - and most of his horse racing profits - helping disabled Vietnam vets. I have contributed a number of program discs to his group, some of whom have become accomplished handicapper/bettors. My reward is their success. Plus, each year I get special Novenas from a group of Roman Catholic Sisters who watch over me with their invocations.

Since Michael joined us in the early eighties he has sent me literally hundreds of consecutive winning races from all over the U.S., but especially Illinois tracks where he has had phenomenal success along with tremendous profits.

He often sends races where he missed the winner but enjoyed double-digit PLACE prices. He read and took seriously my article on The Power of Place (Follow Up #66). He is also one of the few clients who profitably invests in exactas. He was one of the first to read my manual, *The 55% Solution: Key to Exacta/Quinella Profits*. He wagers accordingly.

Michael still uses a battered old computer that doesn't have enough memory to take Synthesis or to let him download. He does it the old-fashioned way: from the Racing Form. A good lesson for all those who have put technology above the quest for profit.

Here is Michael's note that accompanied his readouts and results.

During the same week in which we received so many winning races we also got some strange e-mail. One client was entering pace lines incorrectly, putting decimals where they don't belong, such as 1.10 instead of 110 for a six furlong time.

Someone tried entering his TrackMaster download into his old HRACE directory. No wonder he got nothing back. Another client after reading my HIDE instructions in Follow Up #71, still asked if he should hide horses from the 1st or 2nd Tier of BL/BL when their odds were too low to warrant a wager based on his own standard for MINIMUM ACCEPTANCE standard. Of course he should. He set the standard.

He also compared my HIDE instructions and wagering plan to those of Dick Mitchell and Barry Meadow. There is NO comparison. They'll bet any horse their subjectively made odds line says is an overlay. That means if a horse should be 4-5 but goes off a 3-2, they'll bet it.

I won't. I DEMAND \$7 and up.

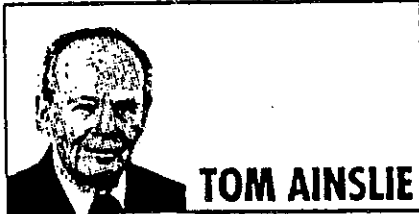

Heads up, Dr. Freud: Cure for losing is winning



TOM AINSLIE

For many years, psychiatrists and other practitioners loyal to the theories of Sigmund Freud have believed - and insisted - that habitual losers at racetracks and gambling casinos are masochists with low self-esteem who specialize in punishing themselves at the windows and/or tables.

A California psychologist named Howard G. Sartin, whom I proudly cherish as a close friend, stuck a pin in the Freudian balloon when a state agency employed him to counsel a bunch of hopeless gamblers who had gone to prison after performing felonies in goofy attempts to maintain their gambling bankrolls. As I recall, they were released to Sartin on some kind of probation.

He sat them down at a table, looked them over and announced that abysmal failure at tracks and

casinos was not a symptom of hopelessness. "There is a cure for habitual losing," he proclaimed. "The cure for losing," he continued, "is winning!"

I was not present, but I am told that Doc Sartin persuaded these bettors to open their minds and make room for winning attitudes, winning handicapping procedures and, above all, winning wagers. He hammered the new outlook into their various states of consciousness. Most of them were enthusiastic and cooperative. Some of them, I hear, are doing nicely at tracks and are behaving with properly defensive care when visiting casinos. Most, I think, have managed to stay out of the slammer.

Howard Sartin has allowed no grass to grow under his feet. As a psychologist and wagering counselor he has attracted a large and loyal following throughout North America. Few of his followers are former felons. And he keeps generating ideas, software, periodicals, books, and grateful admirers.

Among his latest achievements is the declaration that horseplayers need to stop emphasizing the desire

to pick winners. "We can pick more winners by picking odds-on favorites," he said. "And that will guarantee losing days, weeks, months, and years. But if we stick with overlays, we prosper. We are there to prosper. Our goal is to make money."

Not all his enthusiasts are capable of that approach. But most are. And most are happy warriors.

If some of you are not quite ready to spot an overlay and its potential to help you and your bankroll, you can zero in on whichever one of this newspaper's local handicappers strikes you as preferable. If his or her odds line includes a few favorites at 3-2 or less, watch the tote board carefully during the final five minutes before post time. If one or more of the handicapper's top choices goes off at odds notably more generous than the handicapper predicted - such as the 3-2 suddenly bobbing up at 5-2 or better - consider betting win and place on the horse or horses and maybe tossing in a third starter (perhaps at low odds) in a three-horse exacta box.

Here at C&O, we see Ainslie as one of the few handicapping minds that remains suspicious of anything that resembles trendiness. Ainslie's been around a long time, but his spirit is youthful and his ideas are contemporary.

"I don't think there's an edge from the various services available but Sartin's technology, Synthesis, is in a class by itself. If you put the right information from the pps in it, you get an instant betting line. Adjust the line with various corollaries and it works, as long as you only bet the overlays."

THE MYTH OF "WORST" SCENARIO CYCLES

Throughout this issue I've been discussing Anxiety/Fear, dwelling mostly on the "everything that can go wrong, will" syndrome. Certain clients still suffer from this more than anything else. It causes them to take any win they can get, regardless of mutuel. It restrains them from going against the crowd, thus not taking advantage of the power of Synthesis and, especially BL/BL with HIDES.

Most of the races shown in this edition of the Follow Up are from the Midwest and East, but because of the immediate availability of Santa Anita results, I'm going to show you THREE consecutive days of racing where there was only ONE non-playable race each day and, out of 23 total races there were only SIX in which the winner paid less than \$7. So much for the alleged domination of favorites. The races where I've indicated a big NO, were for Maiden events with too many 1st Timers.

The only tracks in the North America where the fans are possibly as sophisticated as those at Santa Anita, are from the Big Apple and, ironically to most U.S. handicappers, Woodbine. Hence Santa Anita represents the height of fan sophistication and handicapping/wagering savvy. They also have the availability of expert information unequaled anywhere else in the world. Yet the average win mutuel for these three days, including those paid by favorites, was: \$11.40!

That's the three day average omitting the three races we would not have handicapped and including horses that paid as little as \$2.40, \$2.80, \$3.40. \$4.80, \$5.80 and \$6.80. Take those out and the 3 day average mutuel rises significantly.

For 23 years I've been harping against following public trends. For the past TWO years I've written hundreds of pages, given lectures and made audio/visual tapes on the proper use of BL/BL with HIDES. So, I must confess that I'm a little discouraged when I still see and hear clients clinging to TOP-TWO-ITIS and wagering on horses the PUBLIC deems most likely to win. I've spent literally thousands of hours creating formulae that, when directions are followed, points users to higher priced winners and consistent PROFIT. This includes hundreds of Follow Up examples where clients who accept my words are making up to a thousand dollars per 20 races on Total Bets of \$20 using Synthesis and the wagering strategy I've applied to properly utilizing the newly improved BL/BL with HIDES (with emphasis on HIDES).

I thought that when a non-client, Mark Cramer, spent 13 pages in the C&O Report showing the profits I made for him, it would help everyone to overcome their anxieties by simply following the same directions that earned him a 259% profit in just six racing days.

It would seem that some clients are still fearful of going against public choices, the outmoded "rules" of so-called experts and, most especially, their own ego-centered beliefs about contender/paceline selection and old myths concerning the "playable" race.

MARK CRAMER'S SECOND BL/BL ACID TEST

As you know from reading Follow Up 70, Mark Cramer published the results of a test in which he sent me \$100 to make \$2 win bets on BL/BL overlays of my choice. The test was culminated within 6 racing days and he published the results in the C&O report, showing a profit of \$257.

That was in March. In April, '98, he sent a second request:

Dear Howard,

I'm sending you my analysis of the BL/BL printouts and results charts. I hope this analysis (final three pages of an 11-page article) will be of use to you. I won't burden you with the rest, but needless to say, it speaks highly of you and the BL/BL. Glad to see you're now one of the "value boys."

I am aware that your corollaries involve subtle handicapping nuances and are valid tools. However, I also believe that the BL/BL can be used MECHANICALLY.

(1) First, I would only consider the top three BL/BL choices, the rare exception being when the fourth choice has an equal rating as the third.

(2) I would bet all horses that have toteboard odds 100 percent or more above their BL/BL odds. I'd take a horse rated even on BL/BL if he was going off at at least 2-1. I'd take a 2-1 BL horse if he's going off at 4-1 or up. For uneven numbers like 8-5, I'd double the odds in my mind (16-5) which means above 3-1, so I'd require 7-2.

Here's what I'd be interested in doing for a sequel article for C&O #11 IF you have the person to do it.

I'd like to give him/her/them \$100 of my money and do the same 50-bet experiment, telling them to follow the rules as if they were McDonalds employees.

(1) Consider ONLY the top three BL/BL horses;

(2) Bet \$2 win on the horse or horses that are going off at AT LEAST DOUBLE THEIR BL/BL ODDS. This could be anywhere from one to three win bets per race. Bet between 4 and 3 minutes before post time.

(3) Don't worry if odds change at the last minute to slightly below the required odds.

Howard, I'm not interested in making a personal investment or in making money. I only know that research with real money in a real-betting situation has greater validity.

If I were to win, you could return my \$100 and send the profits to my favorite charity: Maryknoll Brothers in Ossining, New York. (They are religious Catholic missionaries who risk their lives in difficult countries doing non-religious projects than enfranchise people. What would the Maryknolls think if a donation came from horse racing?)

If I lost, you could send me my balance.

If you have the person who can do this, fax me at:

and I'll send you the money. If there is no such person among your legions, no problem. The help you've already given me is very much appreciated, and I hope the well-deserved publicity brings some good people to you.

The BL/BL is intellectually exciting to me, and this second phase of research could be useful not only to my readers but to your clients as well.

In his 2nd request for still another experiment, he asks me to use a client who will: "Follow the rules as if they were a MacDonald's employee." The rules are spelled out in the letter. The implication was that I should turn the experiment over to someone with little or no insight or self-esteem.

The need for outmoded rules in our endeavor is a basic symptom of low self-esteem. Mark's phrase, "If (he) were to win——," seems a little harsh in light of the \$257 profit he made on our first test. Forcing any client to follow rules is anti-Sartin, as is confining all bets to 100% overlays in just the top 3 BL/BL, so I thought long and hard before accepting and then assigning the task.

I also took a small bit of umbrage at being called one of the "VALUE BOYS." I'm not. Unlike them I do not consider a horse that pays \$6 an overlay if it's projected odds are even or 3-2. Unlike them I hold out for a personal minimum payoff regardless of projected odds. For me that minimum is 5-2 (\$7). I've personally watched VALUE BOYS, other than Mark, accept winners paying far less since, by their personal odds lines, they were overlays.

I have several clients living close to the office or to one of our nearby off-site wagering centers, who qualified for Mark's RULES. They really wanted rules and, although I never mentioned it to the person I finally picked, he had little self-esteem or inner confidence. He shall forever be nameless. You don't help make people become consistent winners by insulting them.

Aline Best was responsible for the first \$100 test. She yielded Mark his \$257 profit, following my wagering guidelines-not RULES.

To make a long story short, the second tester, following Mark's VALUE BOY RULES made a profit on Mark's \$100 of only \$141.60. Before even beginning the test, I returned Mark's original \$100 investment so the that \$141.60 to the Maryknoll Fathers represented net profit. In the end we had a return of \$241 for the \$100 invested.

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I'm publishing this for two reasons. First, a \$141.60 profit made by following rules that I would never impose except for this test, yielded less than the profit made following my guidelines.

Second, in light of this fact, I am not one of the VALUE BOYS because I refuse to follow their rules and bet on a horse merely because it projects as an OVERLAY! Holding out for a minimum payoff regardless of projected odds is far more profitable. AND, confining wagers to the TOP 3 BL/BL was pure folly at the time of this test.

Now, of course, we've instituted the HIDE or cross off of any contender with odds not up to our minimum standards. This technique does place almost all overlays in the top three tiers of BL/BL.

We've also developed a computer program (now available) that let's you HIDE any contender with odds too low to bet. Those testing it are all making a considerable profit.

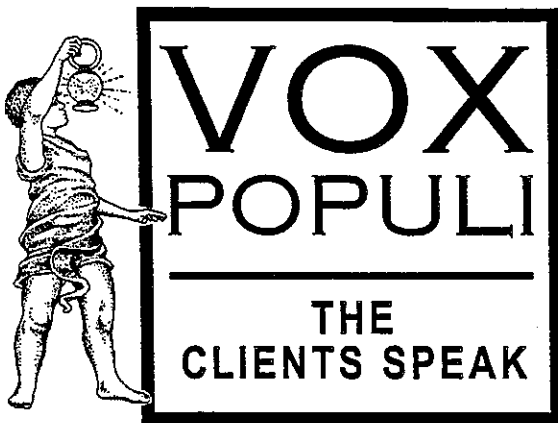

The real message of this article is: By following directions, even a rule-bound client with inadequate self-esteem can earn 141% profit using just the old BL/BL with no HIDES or cross-offs. Aline Best, who had been handicapping for less than 6 months at the time, followed my directions precisely, and made a profit of 259%. Now, perhaps you can understand my frustration at those who still persist in "trying" to do it their way and refusing to utilize the Wagering Decision Form.



Hello Howard,

Enclosed are another set of win decision charts. Please notice I was getting a lot of four hole (and sometimes five hole) winners. Now I'm sharp enough to know that if that is where the winners are coming from, you'd damn well better be betting them.

...After reading the current Follow Up, I went back through these four hole* races eliminating the favorite and lo and behold, they shot right up to the two and three holes. Not that I don't eliminate the favorite, because, in most cases, I do. I just have never hid them until now. Thanks for the advise.

Thought I would share this:

I have an application on my computer which is an alarm program. I set it for about 10 minutes before post time. Since my computer has (synthesized) speech, when the alarm goes off, it yells at me: "Wake Up! It's Post Time! Don't Get Shut Out!!"

Now if I'm doing 1 track, it's indispensable because I'm always "doing stuff" between races. However, if I'm doing multiple tracks (I normally do 2), it's a matter of life & death. I'd never be able to manage checking current odds & then calling in my wagers without it.

As noted, I have been working with the Synthesis program - TrackMaster version - for a couple of weeks and I am amazed at how good the program is. I am very new to the Sartin Methodology and do not understand how to use most of the graphs and readouts. I'm just plugging along, trying to follow the Pace launcher manual and the Follow Up #70. To test the program I used a simple test along the lines suggested by Mark Cramer. I took the first three horses in the BL/BL screen and made "paper" bets on any one, two or all three that were overlays based on the odds line in BL. I used 100% as a minimum overlay and 3/1 as minimum odds.

The test was over four very different tracks, BM, Bel, Crc, & Lad, and the results were fantastic. I made 285 "paper" bets in 163 races. I won 41 bets (14.48) with an avg mutual of \$17.74. The return on these bets would have been 27.68. With no "handicapping" at all and with very little, if any, understanding of the individual readouts and graphs, I think the results are unbelievable. What a great program! Again, this is betting any of the top three horses on the BL/BL screen that went off at a minimum of 3/1 odds and showed at least a 100% overlay from the BL odds. I am looking forward to learning how to use the program correctly and am excited about the journey I've just begun. I have sent my check in for the video series and for some past issues of the Follow Up via USPS mail. I'm really excited about learning this program and using it as an alternate source of investing.

DOC COMMENTS: He was a non-winner before getting Synthesis. Betting on three horses per race is an expensive procedure since his ave mutuel, \$17.74, although commendable, is not going to occur consistently. Starting with a 27.6% profit is ok but not "fantastic" as he states. Perhaps he read where Dick Mitchell said that 20% was professional level or heard about B. Meadow's 4% profit. I'd like to see his ROI rise to at least a 50% profit on each dollar wagered. When he sues the new computerized Wagering Decision form, he'll do better. His testimonial about 'non' handicapping is right on. He let his 'feelings' work instead of his ego. I know some improvisational musicians who are more entertaining and make better livings than many accomplished musicians playing all the correct notes.

I just want to mention that I've only used PL3 twice so far since I did just become a client of PIRCO. The first day wasn't that good for me. I did get 2 winners and two exactas using PL3 but they were short payoffs. I was disappointed at first but I read over the instruction manual I have and the other booklets and found the mistakes I was making such as using Maiden Lines in some races, not using their best lines and only the most recent line and couple of other stupid mistakes that I did seem to remedy the next day. I played the Santa Anita track and had all the stats from PL3 and also played Bay Meadows but only brought the BL/BL stat sheet with me because I just wanted to focus on 1 track first. To make everything short, by fixing and going over mistakes from the previous day, I had winners at SA (10/25) that paid \$9.40 in the 3rd, \$23.60 in the 5th, \$44.00 in the 6th (this race was risky since it was a maiden race filled with firsters but ran it anyway just for the heck of it), \$7 exacta in the 8th and the \$21.80 exacta in the 9th. I should of had the tri in the 9th but didn't box my horses of 4-2-1. Instead it came out 2-4-1. As you can tell, I was doing ok. At Bay Meadows, I wasn't paying attention till the 3rd race. I didn't run the "also eligible horse" in the 8th race and completely forgot to put a horse in the 9th race which was the winner. If I didn't make these 2 errors, I can honestly say the PL3 would have assisted me in picking 7 straight winners from the 3rd race on!! I did manage to make bets on the 3rd which paid \$7.40 to win, 6th race which paid \$25.60 to win, and the 7th was \$7.20 to win. As you can see I had a great day by going over my mistakes and rereading the instruction manuals I was able to pick the correct lines and make the correct choices for the next day. I'm looking forward to much more success at the races in the future. Thanks for your time.

Hi Howard,

Thank you kindly for the recent deluge of reality enhancing examples of your race results vs a variety of mutuals from SA and BM. I know that defecting from BM to SA is not a very "methodological" act, but the fields are generally larger and that is what I mainly want for the sake of getting more place bet opportunities. At any rate, at least I took a decision and went with it. Strangely, it is at BM that I have twice sustained two-horse win percentages of about 74%, one of those for over five weeks. So, OK, I hear you; BM also has double digit mutuals. BTW, the suggestion that I might be scripting you as surrogate parent/rescuer scared the hell out of me!!!

However, your generous BL corollary examples helped a lot in a way in which you perhaps did not intend: It gave me a HUGE boost of confidence regarding my race analysis! Why? The first mailing had three consecutive races from SA on 2/11 and three from BM on 2/01. It happened that I had worked five of those in real time. The confidence boost came when I realized that I hadn't done much worse than you as far as contender selection and computer analysis! So, it must be the case that your superiority is mainly in the sphere of corollary wagering decisions vs odds of final contenders. It was somewhat enlightening to examine the differences in final contenders and (in only a few instances), pace

lines. Were your contenders chosen with only the best-of-last-three-comparable technique? I always note these qualification "scores", but seem to cut too many place horses when I use it religiously. While we must remain focused and perceptive during an analysis, I must say that with Synthesis, my analysis are as close to "routine" as it's gonna get, especially with the inclusion of E/EP, L/EP and the balance therefrom. I also like the "Don't Stop Here" sign on the BL/BL - so much so that I think it should appear on the computer printouts!

...In the old, Yellow Manual, you mentioned your old technique of keeping a "stable" of horses. Are you aware of the "Stablemail" service through the DRF website? I think it's free. You submit the names of certain horses, and they automatically email you when one of them is scheduled to race. Thanks for Everything,

Interpreting Right Brain Teachings with Left Brain Response

Herein lies a problem that has existed since 1975 when I first began working with those problem gamblers I helped convert into aspiring handicappers. It has become increasingly apparent since 1982 when I first went public.

I will write or say something designed for **right brain** reception and get responses like these:

(1) "In other words..." This kind of listener then goes on to re-word what I just said with a linear, mechanistic paraphrase that has little or no relationship to what I actually meant.

Other responses that come from the same source -

(2) "What you mean is———" "What you're trying to tell me is———" "That's what so and so meant when he wrote (or said)———" "So, you're saying that I should always (never)———"

The next response is from the kind of person who remembers every time something did not work, while forgetting how often it did.

(3) Yes but, sometimes ———" "But last Wednesday in the 7th race I tried that and the horse only showed." etc. ad infinitum.

I guess I'll have to repeat what I've so often written and said before:

There is no such thing as an ALWAYS or NEVER in successful, profitable handicapping. I've seen, as have you, people win by doing things I'd almost never do or by going totally against something I might almost always do. There is no universal "One Way" to consistently skin the elusive cat of successful handicapping. However, if we think in 20 race cycles instead of individual races or a day at the races, ours has been proved by the tests of others to be the best computer handicapping method of our times.

I say this not as self advertisement but as the result of testimonials from authors like Ainslie, Brohamer, Cramer, Bradshaw, Sal Sinatra, Dave Litfin, Andy Beyer, Wm. Quirin and others; not to mention my co-authors of *Pace Makes The Race* who built careers on my efforts. Before they attempted to "phase me out" Quinn and Mitchell, in several books, were also big boosters of my work.

Mis-Interpretations of my efforts, similar to those listed above, come from left brained, common sense, logical people who want everything reduced to a formula based on linear succession and a set of fixed, mechanistic rules.

Some will protest my statement and claim to have read all the alternative, new paradigm books and listened to audio tapes from mentors like Deepak Chopra and others I've recommended. However their PERCEPTION RECEPTORS are so clogged by ANTAGONISTS from years of absorbing information and mis-information from the old paradigms, that they cannot stop trying to INTELLECTUALIZE both my material and that coming from Chopra, Pert, Ornstein and others I've recommended.

None of the works of these scientists is concerned with successful handicapping. They would undoubtedly look upon our efforts as trivial. Yet, the content of such work when placed in our context, makes them the best handicapping success books ever written. Those who read them seeking handicapping information, per se, are refusing to adapt the author's words to our field of endeavor. They don't see any mention of horses so they claim the books are useless. They translate the content literally and intellectually.

A tragic mistake. Developing a Quantum Mind-Set is not something that can be intellectualized. It must be FELT! Felt as a whole, not in linear segments. Felt completely with BODY and MIND functioning as a unified force field; NOT separated in the old Cartesian, separatist mode (Descartes: "I think therefore I am.").

The new Paradigm is: I AM, therefore I think and feel and a host of other therefore things.

I'm literally astounded by clients asking what I mean by New Paradigm, Fractals, Quantum, Entropy, etc. They mean the same thing in handicapping as they do in dictionaries costing \$2. These words are in COMMON usage in books costing (paperback) less than \$10. They're also prominent in popular magazines as well as daily newspapers. WHY, I ask, can't some people fathom their meaning in an area that's allegedly so important to them: Handicapping and Wagering???

Do they think ours is a unique language only applicable to selecting horses that are supposed to win? NO. It's the other way around: Successful handicappers employ a language that has potent meaning in ALL the sciences and arts and applicable to a fuller daily life.

As an old Philosophy professor once said when teaching the works of Descartes: "Don't put De Cart before De Horse."

Most handicapping author-experts are offended by a holistic, Gestalt approach to success at the races. They cling steadfastly to the old reductionist paradigm filled with linear mechanics and rules. Steve Davidowitz, while complementing some of my efforts, called the bulk of my work "pseudo-science." This statement represents the height of humorous irony since Steve, in his book, a newly revised *Betting Thoroughbreds*, demonstrates absolutely no familiarity with the paradigms of today's science, none whatsoever!

If one is not familiar with contemporary science, how can he know what is pseudo? Davidowitz cannot be singled out for derision. He is joined by the majority of his peers; all living and writing from the perspective of an archaic Newtonian paradigm of physics and thought. As a result,

much of their work is counterproductive.

This indictment is not intended to insult the author-experts in question as their works apply to the general handicapping public. My impressions are for clients ONLY. Especially for those who take pride in having read them ALL and SAY they're now ready for our Method. I can tell them with a certainty born of long experience with others, that the content of most of the handicapping literature available today is mostly outdated, inaccurate and, except to the more astute, will produce more confusion than successful outcome.

While many handicapping authors prefer to remain in the dark ages, my indictment is meant more for their publishers. The idea of *revising* handicapping works (as was done with Ainslie's) to keep their content current, has always been anathema to publishing houses whose editors know nothing about successful handicapping in the first place.

Brohamer's editor did. On the dust jacket of *Modern Pace Handicapping*, he wrote: "There is a REVOLUTION going on in the world of Thoroughbred Handicapping. Written by a leading practitioner of The Sartin Methodology, *Modern Pace Handicapping* is the first, last and only word that matters on pace in Thoroughbred Handicapping."

Maybe not the ONLY, but close. In 1989, when Tom began his manuscript, it was the best word. Unfortunately by the time the actual book was circulated by Wm. Morrow in 1991, much of it, while remaining excellent pace background material, addresses little about of the EVOLUTION of the Revolution referred to by the editor on the dust jacket.

Not Tom's fault. He wanted to revise and update the book. Wm. Morrow refused, eventually deciding on a policy not to publish any more books on handicapping because they didn't produce enough profit.

It is an unfortunate fact that all trade publishers angled their handicapping works from a left brained, common sense, rule oriented perspective. Their credo in the matter is: Give the PUBLIC what it wants and expects. Dick Mitchell's last two books were even called *Common Sense Betting* and *Common Sense Handicapping*, subtitled: The Logical Left Brained Approach To Winning At The Races. The idea of appealing to left brained thinkers is highly commercial.

Only books written by esteemed scientists and directed toward readership with scientific, real, pseudo or pop science interests, arouse the senses of trade publishers.

Robert Ornstein, author of *The Psychology Of Consciousness*, built a readership with that book and thus Harcourt-Brace published his *The Right Mind*, a volume dedicated to helping readers seeking to activate the power of their right brain.

I listed it as recommended reading in Follow Up #68. I'd love to be a fly on the wall observing someone trying to read this book along with Dick Mitchell's LEFT BRAINED Approach to Winning At The Races.

This article is meant to be compatible with my Part 2, the CURE for NON-WINNING in which I offer some proven remedies for the problems expressed herein.

To some my words may sound like self-aggrandizement, bragging or being a know it all. That's not so. Everything I write is directed toward making each of you consistent winners of races, but especially profit.

I may appear arbitrary but there is good reason for it. Unlike most other handicapping authors and so-called experts, I get daily, sometimes hourly, input from clients with many of the problems discussed in this article. I hear these problems through two sets of ears. Shane's and my own and respond to them accordingly.

Others in the field can get away with expounding their theories and presumed expertise without having to deal with such feedback and or having to solve problems arising from their statements. My lessons have been learned from persons just like you. Therefore, I know what is or is not working for you. I don't have the luxury, as most other handicapping mentors do, of saying: I got it, now you must figure out the HOW part for yourself.

Our responses may not seem logical by common definition. BUT THEY WORK, at least for the hundreds whose testimonials appear in Vox Pop.

I'm am not concerned with what is RIGHT or CORRECT. My ONLY concern is what CONSISTENTLY WORKS for YOU! If defying mainstream concepts and constructs earns me criticism from the majority of experts, I don't care. I'm also vitally aware of the fact that what may work for ME, may not work for all. Some say I have a lot of patience. That's not quite true. But my inner lack of patience is overcome by my will and dedication to see that ALL OF YOU SUCCEED!

To aid my purpose we're offering a computerized version of the Pace Launcher 4/ Synthesis Wagering Form that I've been harping on for so many issues. It goes to five tiers of BL/BL and AUTOMATICALLY demonstrates how removing or HIDING contenders on which you would NOT bet, raises the BL/BL tier level of Overlays considerably.

We've also produced a new and improved BL/BL program that is a stand alone, except for TrackMaster downloaders who will still get the SUPERSCREENS along with the improved BL/BL. The reason for the stand alone versions is for quick results and the fact that most clients don't use all their screens anyway

The Dangers in ***Preponderance of Evidence***

On the next page you'll see the fourth entry in a long record keeping adventure from a new client. He had never read my warnings about trying to make decisions from the old Linear Preponderance of Evidence method promoted by a former Follow Up editor. The technique got the editor nowhere and it was beginning to affect this new client similarly. Even with several months of records like the ones on the following page, he was about to quit us, totally frustrated.

Tallying all the corollary rankings of each winner may be helpful to some when they FIRST start using Synthesis or Pace Launcher 4. All it does, however, is show that on almost ALL Corollaries the average rankings of winners is between 2 and 3. Yet, despite this knowledge most new clients are faced with indecision when it comes time to bet.

The reason is simple: **trying to use too much information** and winding up in such a confused state that profitable wagering becomes a seemingly insurmountable barrier. The next step taken by most clients is to ask me, which corollary or combination of Corollaries is best?

The answer to that question can come only from you. It shouldn't be based on a Preponderance of Evidence chart, however. It should come from implants in the memory of your Emotional Intelligence (see Follow Up 54) with the constant self-reminder to be *flexible*. The flow of corollary variables is like a river, not a lake with no outlets.

The last question anyone should be asking someone else is what corollaries are best! I have repeatedly stated that the rankings from the PRIME corollaries and BL/BL are the focal points of BEST, with various SUPPLEMENTAL corollaries as gleaned from your records, quite often the key to the higher paying longshots.

I looked at only one readout in his long tally: Factor X. The top 2 WON 43 of 63 races. That's 68.2%. What more can I say?

An e-mail just received is typical of the problems faced by newer clients. It reads: "I have been working with the TrackMaster version of Synthesis for several weeks and am amazed how good the program is. The statement itself is most revealing. It's like saying I got a new guitar for Christmas but still don't know how to play it well."
