\* Early Energy for the Winner of this race, Donny K. was 50.03%. That put Donny K. right at Par Early for Hol on the turf at 8.5 furlongs. Total Energy was only 54.95, somewhat low at today's class level.

The 50.03% Early win energy explains Shuttle Jet's inability to hold on to win after leading at the 2nd Call. With the exception of Poly Test's June 2nd win 5.54% early is too high at this track, on this surface, (turf) at this distance.

I emphasize these last three points so that no one will confuse the demands of a given track, surface and distance with a general rule. Keeping your own Track Profile is essential if you expect a win % of over 63%.

LAK LUSTRE is included above even though the horse cannot be rated by the procedure in this manual. His second race back is unuseable. He has yet to establish a class level in this country but his running style is well suited to Hollywood Park.

AT YOUR TRACK(S)

While I am not prone to cling to the wisdom and words of JIMMY The GREEK, he did make an interesting statement during the CBS telecast of the Belmont Stakes. He said that if "these horses--the Belmont contenders--got together on four consecutive Saturdays, you'd have a different winner each week." If all of those races were at Belmont Park at a mile and one-half, I would certainly question his logic. It takes a particular kind of horse to win such a marathon and the Stephens' Entry was the two contenders who were most qualified. Until the Travers, Chief's Crown was America's best show bet at any distance.\*\* Eternal Prince needs to go back to Sprints and one turn miles. Still, "The Greek's" essential point was well taken. At distances of a mile and one-eighth or less, any group of horses of near-equal class potential will, if regularly raced against each other, take turns winning. Of course there will always be at least one of these who never wins but perennially finishes in the money,

Races such as these are what we call "Tandem Races." They happen along quite frequently in both the claiming and the Allowance category. While Stakes Races frequently have a number of Tandem Horses, the procedure outlined in this manual only applies in part. The class make-up in stakes races is sufficiently superior to negate procedures that apply so optimally to claiming and under \$80,000 AW races. At every track and in every circuit a certain number of horses will find themselves graduating and/or declining at the same rate so that they form a group, each member of which seems to fit the same race conditions; and for this reason the Secretary is obliged to pit them together frequently in the same race.

On the surface these races seem difficult to handicap since it doesn't take long for even the novice to determine that such animals seem to take turns beating each other.

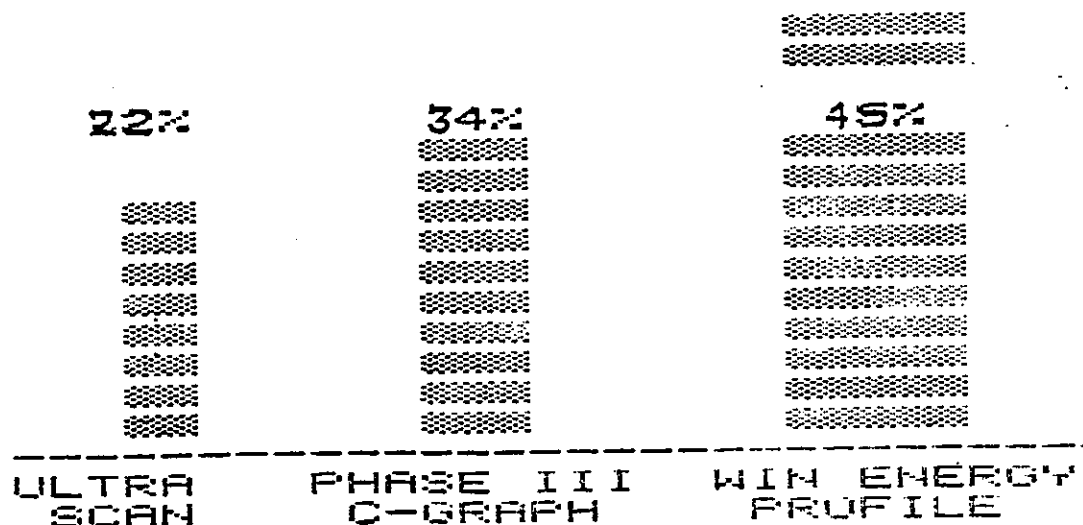

Phase III Handicapping procedures, employing a Compugraph, frequently project a different order of finish in today's race than in the Tandem Race, but not quite often enough. The previous race winner still projects as best today in defiance of its actual win probability. Ultrascan, so effective under other circumstances, is even more prone to duplicate the order of finish from the previous race. Realizing this we began a serious study of Tandem Races in 1984. Our track data base ranged from New York to Caliente; from Florida and Louisiana to Washington and Vancouver, B.C., Omaha, Fairmont Park, Arlington, Sportsman's - 27 tracks in all were included in the study. Where once we dreaded Tandem Races because of their alleged unpredictability we now delight in them, especially when they are carded as Exacta Races. Without question these are the most predictable of all Exacta Races and frequently pay higher mutuels because the public does not yet have a handle on how to handicap them. As always, our ongoing research is designed to give you that "extra edge."

A very UNSATISFACTORY result. Now what to do about it?



In reviewing several hundreds of races handicapped by Pirco Charter Members and clients alike, an almost astonishing pattern began to emerge. Tandem races were the prime deterrents to a 70% + Win Proficiency. The foremost roadblocks on the highway to handicapping Nirvana.

Time after time clients who were boasting of 20 race cycles of better than 65% win proficiency would call me in near-despair: Suddenly their win percentage had dipped to 55%, or as low as 50%. Why? As always, I asked that they send me the problem races: Ones they felt they should have won but lost instead. In virtually every instance Tandem Races were at the root of the problem.

Then we began checking our own failures. In one week at Hollywood Park 3 of Pirco's best, working in concert, won but 13 of 22 races. A win proficiency of only 59.09%. Of the 9 losses FIVE were Tandem Races. Four of these five would have been won had we developed the material in this Manual a few months earlier. This would constitute a difference between 59.09% and 77.2% win.

This was only one example piled on top of many others.

After we started paying close attention to the frequency of Tandem Races we recorded an average of 2.4 PER DAY on samplings of races from California to New York and many points in between.

In the two weeks before putting this manual to bed, Jim "the Hat" Bradshaw, Glenn Smock, Bob Purdy and I played a total of five different tracks in Las Vegas. We had two objects in mind: to make profitable investments and to test our new-found skills in winning Tandem Races.

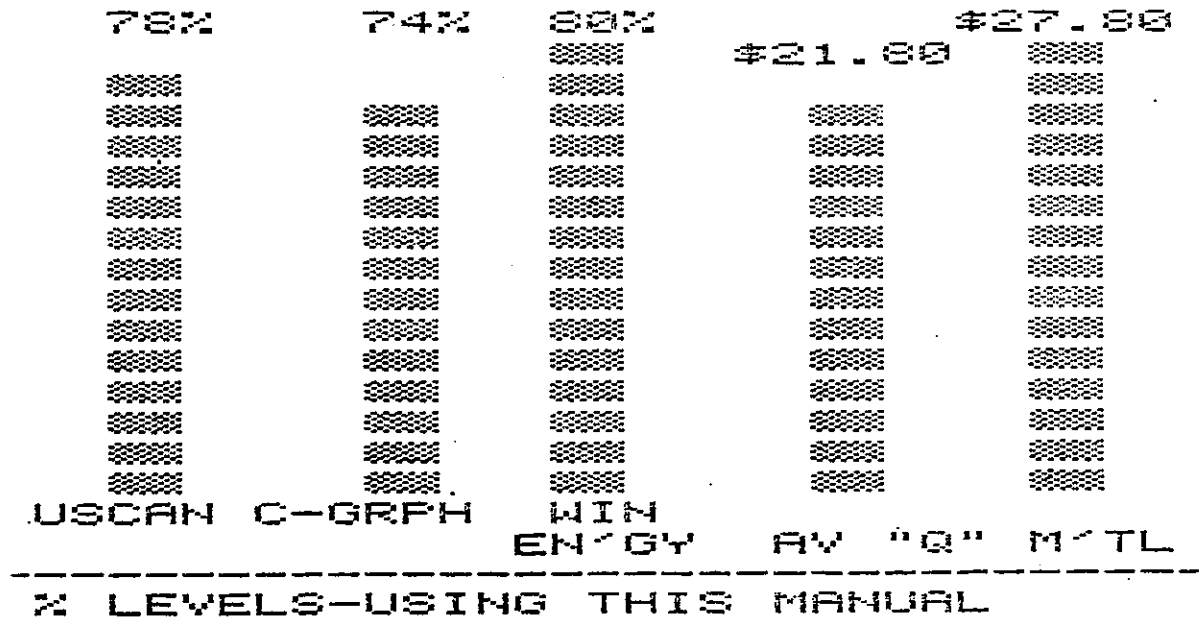
The tracks handicapped were: Hollywood Park, Belmont, Monmouth, Pimlico, Garden State and Arlington Park.

There were, at these 6 tracks a collective average of 13.4 Tandem Races per day. Or, 2.23 per day per track.

Our win proficiency during the period was 78%, BUT ONLY because we were no longer defeated by the Tandem Race. And, since the Tandem Race presents the best Exacta-Quinella opportunity, Our Quinella win proficiency, using a 3 horse round-robin, went from a previous average of 50%

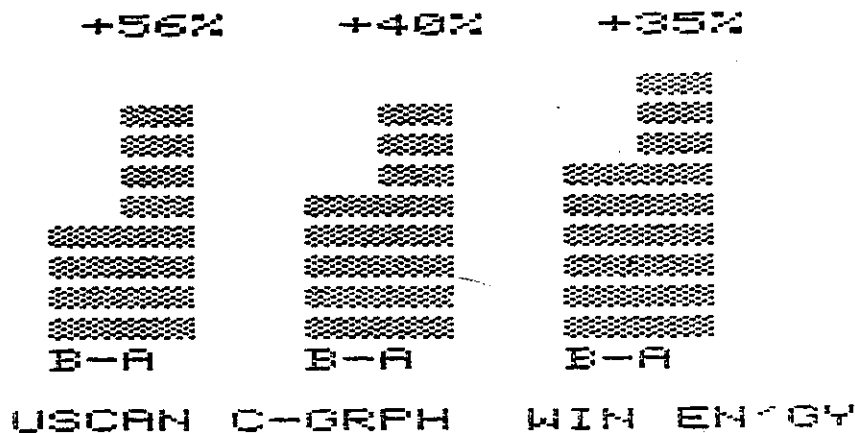
to a whopping 66.6%. Further, our average Quinella Mutuel, went from a previous average of \$21.80 (per \$2 bet, \$6 Round Robin) to \$27.80! The post-mortem proved conclusively that winning the Tandem Races made the difference.

Compare this current graph with the dismal picture painted by the one of a few pages back:



Now let's compare the 2 graphs, Before and After:

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We must never lose sight of the fact that these high positivity levels were achieved by PIRCO'S best and many other clients have yet to reach such expectancies. On the other hand these PIRCO professionals were not always this good. They achieved these levels through diligent pursuit of the same factors and information that is available to YOU.

Until a few months before the publication of this manual we, too, were often victims of the Tandem Phenomenon. Since about 28% of all playable races are Tandem Races it behooves us all to overcome the problems they present and to capitalize on their higher mutual opportunities, especially in the Exacta-Quinella area.

In reviewing the data on Quinellas it must be made clear that these were Las Vegas House Quinellas. The payoff is based on One-Half the PLACE PRICE Times the WIN PRICE. All races with six or more contenders are Quinella Races. These are not the same as EXACTA races at the track which are specifically carded as such by the Racing Secretary. This fact reduces the EXACTA proficiency expectancy by about 11%. Our best win about 57% of their 3 horse Exacta wagers on a long term consistency basis. Yet even from the ranks of the less astute we get frequent reports of 55% and more. Exactas pay more handsomely than Quinellas, so the average profit per dollar invested is about the same for both.

To qualify as being FROM a Tandem Race, at least two of today's contenders must have come from the same PACE RACE, probably the LAST RACE. Since you are ranking your contenders from that race it must be assumed that they did well: finishing in-the-money or within 3.25 lengths of the winner. The ideal Tandem race is one where the Winner and all the in-the-money horses from the previous tandem race are going against each other again today. Barring that we will accept two or more in-the-money or within 4 lengths horses from the previous tandem race. If today's race fails to qualify under these minimum standards, it is NOT a Tandem Race.

Before applying the special procedures in this manual you must FIRST Handicap the race in the conventional Phase III manner using PACE LINES from the Last Race.

#### TO QUALIFY AS A TANDEM RACE

- 1: TWO OR MORE CONTENDERS FROM SAME PACE RACE (USUALLY THE LAST RACE).
- 2: MUST HAVE FINISHED IN THE MONEY OR WITHIN 4 LENGTHS OF WINNER.
- 3: IDEAL TANDEM RACE WILL HAVE THE TOP 3 OR 4 HORSES FROM LAST RACE.

PROCEDURAL STEPS FOR PROJECTING TODAY'S WINNER  
AND IN-THE-MONEY HORSES FROM TANDEM  
RACES

**1: DON'T ASSUME ANYTHING!**  
FIRST, RUN THE TANDEM HORSES THROUGH PHASE III PROCEDURES  
MAKE SURE THAT THEY DO, INDEED PROJECT THE SAME FINISH AS IN  
THE TANDEM RACE. DOES THE WINNER QUALIFY TO REPEAT??

All too often both Phase III techniques and ULTRASCAN  
tend to project today's order of finish the same as in  
the Tandem Race. However, Phase III, utilizing the  
COMPUGRAPH, will project today's actual winning horse  
with a higher ranking than seems justified by it's  
finish in the Tandem Race. This is a key factor in making  
today's selections. If we merely assume that a given horse  
will rank low, we are relinquishing much of the power of  
Phase III procedures. So RANK ALL TANDEM CONTENDERS ON  
YOUR PHASE III Compugraph.

Regardless of ranking NEVER THROW OUT one of the Tandem  
horses if it was within 4 lengths of the winner. NOTE:  
If today's race is an eighth of a mile shorter  
than the Tandem Race, figure beaten lengths at the  
Stretch CALL!

PACE LINE SELECTION IS THE KEY TO WINNING SUCH RACES. WE WILL  
USE ONLY THE WINNER'S PACE LINE FROM THAT RACE. IT SHOULD NOT  
BE PENALIZED FOR A WINNING EFFORT. SELECT THE PACE LINE FOR THE  
OTHER TANDEM HORSES AS IF - T O D A Y ' S - RACE WAS THE  
PREVIOUS TANDEM RACE.... SEE EXAMPLE RACES

Use the tandem Race Pace Line for the Winner of the Tandem  
Race only. UNLESS the winner is NOT IN TODAY'S RACE. Then  
use the Tandem Race Pace line for the Horse in today's race  
that was closest to the Winner.  
For the other Tandem Contenders Use a Pace line that would  
be considered THE MOST PREDICTIVE OF THE TANDEM RACE ITSELF.

This is the key paragraph in understanding why Tandem winners seldom repeat and to why the 3rd or 4th place finisher in the previous Tandem Race may well be Today's Winner!

The 4th race at Hollywood Park on June 23, 1985 is an excellent example of a Tandem Race. The four top contenders all raced against each other last out. Shuttle Jet, while not in that race, was up against the same contenders TWO races back. A look at Match Winner's Past Performance chart shows him in Tandem with at least one of the other top contenders in today's race in 4 of his last 5 races. He won Two of those races and was in the money or within 3 lengths of the winner in SEVEN of his last eight races. Poly Test, the horse to beat, was in the money in 7 of its last 10 starts and won THREE times. Only in its last race was it able to win at Hollywood Park, a track with a marked late energy bias. Poly Test was able to defy that bias with a very swift 1:41:1 win at a mile and a sixteenth on the turf June 9th. The Turf at Hollywood is particularly demanding of late energy so Poly Test's win with 51.66% Early Energy was something of a phenomenon in itself. The win energy pattern at Hollywood for this race in the Summer\* of 1985 ranged from 50 to 51.05% Early, never higher, except in this race of June 9th. The Methodologist keeping a track profile would have taken a dim view of a repeat win for Poly Test at the outset. Eliminating such a formidable horse from win contention on the basis of energy expenditure represents a bold step not everyone is ready or willing to take. That is why we are offering this alternative procedure for rating Tandem Horses.

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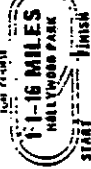

Handicapping the race on the COMPUGRAPH utilizing the procedures in this manual puts Match Winner on top with Massera and Poly Test tied for second.

The three horse Exacta/Quinella box using these horses produced the winning combination.

Match Winner's 2nd (tie) Ranking on the previous page adds emphasis to STEP #1. Always handicap the Tandem Race with Phase III procedures FIRST. Don't just assume the methodology will rank the contenders in the same order of finish as in the Tandem Race. In this instance ULTRASCAN also ranked Match Winner in the top 2. But this will not always be the case.

In reviewing the Past Performance chart for Poly Test's loss- by a head - to Match Winner on June 2nd, we can see the scenario for their next meeting unfold. Poly Test was held back too long on June 2nd and it cost the win. On June, in order to compensate for the previous error, Poly Test went to the lead between the 2nd Call and the stretch and emerged victorious. June 9th was just not Match Winner's day. It had trouble making its traditional move at the 2nd Call and had to wait until the stretch to start gaining on the pace. Too late. That 3/4 length loss between the 2nd Call and the stretch was the animal's undoing.

Having won the race close to the lead Poly Test's handlers, being only human, decided to try it that way again on June 23rd. This strategy seldom works twice against Hollywood Park's energy demands. As we anticipated the Horse failed to maintain its 2nd Call lead and finished fourth. Match Winner, encountering no problem between the 2nd Call and the Stretch, came home the winner. Here is the actual running of the June 23rd race:

As you can see the three in-the-money finishers conformed closest to the Early Energy % Pars at Holl which range from 50 to 51.05%.

THE MATCH UP  
POLY TEST VS. MATCH WINNER

Tandem Races present the best opportunity for comparing horses against each other, fraction by fraction, rating category by rating category and class factor by class factor. Since all contenders are coming from the same race, same track, same distance there is no variant factor to contend with. Huey Mahl stated years ago that the Match Up Factor had more to do with the outcome of a race than anything else. Jim Bradshaw, Pirco's master of the Match Up, always views the contenders in PAIRS. A is better than B; C is better than D; E better than F. Ergo, the contenders are: A, C and E. It's as simple as that.

In analyzing the contention in our target race of June 23, I think we can all agree that Massera, Morry's Champ, Shuttle Jet and perhaps Lak Lustre, are all good candidates for Place and Show in this group - and I stress: THIS GROUP- because none has ever done better than finish In-The-Money against either Poly Test or Match Winner.

So the match up for WIN is between Poly Test and Match Winner.

FIRST: Let's Examine the Class Factors:

Poly Test is 5 years old. Match Winner 6. Match Winner has had 5 more starts on the TURF. Since our race is on the Turf we will use TURF figures only. Poly Test has finished in the Money 72% of the time while Match Winner has done so only 59% of the time. In reality both percentages are very good by comparison to the average. Both horses have 6 Wins to their credit. From this point on Match Winner fares considerably better with an APV of \$32,437 compared to Poly Test's \$18,399 and Earnings per start of \$6,247 as opposed to Poly Test's \$4,599. Hence, the Class Handicapper would automatically choose Match Winner over Poly Test.

We will not afford ourself that myopic a luxury, however.  
Class is a Factor but only in relationship to Performance.  
So let's examine each horse's performance against the other  
AND at comparable distances and tracks.

In the two races where they did not race against each other Match Winner had a 6 point Daily Variant advantage at 9 furlongs, Santa Anita; Poly Test had a 4 point advantage at @ 6.5 furlongs, Santa Anita, so we can discount the Daily Variant Factor in analyzing these two contenders.

The overall advantage belongs to Match Winner. Perhaps the Class people were right after all. There are Three Vital factors to consider in viewing this match-up.

- 1: Where Poly Test shows superior figures to Match Winner they are minimal. -- Whereas Match Winner's superior figures are substantial.
2. Match Winner holds a .09 advantage in the Sustained Pace, the key factor in winning at Hollywood Park with only rare exception.
3. Most important of all: Poly Test won last out with a



running style contrary to the Win Energy pattern of the track. Trainers and Jockeys will invariably go with the guy that brung them. i.e. Stick with what won for you last. A winning effort requires no new strategy next out. A loss, however, inspires the need for a different strategy, especially on the part of Match Winner's Trainer and Jockey, the Messers Ellis and Mc Carron. Mc Carron in particular knows precisely why he was unable to spur Match Winner to his typical move between the 2nd Call and Stretch Call and will take pains to amend the problem this time. Having ridden this mount to two straight wins before the last race, he knows the animal's capabilities. Sibille, on Poly Test only once, knows that victory was achieved over Match Winner and the rest by going for the front early. Mc Carron's logic may not be based on a knowlege of the track Win Energy profile, but it is more accurate than Sibille's.

Since the average handicapper tends to endow Trainers and Jockeys with super powers in areas other than those directly concerned with training and riding, you may feel that if WE understand Win Energy requirements, certainly these titans must understand it better.

It is in no way intended to demean any of these professionals when I say: They Do Not.

Charles Whittingham, one of the greatest of all trainers, recently became quite close with Pirco's Bob Purdy. Both are ex-Marines who talk the same language. (Oh WHAT language.)

While he is very fond of William Shoemaker, Charles the Great is quite parsimonious in his praise of Jockeys in general: "I told the @?@ to lay off the pace 'til the three-quarter and what does he do? Lays off 12 lengths. Anybody knows, with an ounce of brains, that you can't lay off 12 and win here!" Or: "I told him to ease him to the front and goose him at the stretch pole. What does the silly \*@\$ do? Goes out in 21.2 and dies at the half!"

So much for Whittingham on Jockeys. Now for Whittingham on Pace: "At Hollywood Park you have to be on or near the lead at all distances up to a mile and an eighth - EXCEPT on the Turf. There you can be way back and still win. At a mile and an eighth and over on the dirt you should be within four at the 2nd Call." Truer words were never spoken. BUT, and here is where, in my presence, the younger ex-Marine imposed his expertise on the 72 year old ex-leatherneck. Purdy informed Mr. W of the precise early energy % requirements at Hollywood Park. With a good deal of graciousness Whittingham took our Hollywood Pace profile back to his office and the next day confirmed the accuracy of our figures. In gratitude he gave Bob a tip on a dead crab -- which on the next day finished sixth.

Whittingham confirmed the Energy figures but allowed as how there was little he could do about it. In the final analysis, he concluded, the trainer could only prepare the horse to run at ITS best and place it where that best effort would be effective. Trainers, he stated more than once, were the world's third worst handicappers. Owners and Jockeys being the first and second worst. Being too close to the subject, was his rationale for this phenomenon. And I have heard many a trainer - in vino veritas - confirm his sentiments.

We must always remember that we are handicapping HORSES, not people. Those horses need trainers to get them ready and jockeys to urge them to their best effort. The horse must then be able to do the main task at hand: Give us relief at the payoff window.

Having labored the technique for handicapping TANDEM RACES in our first example, getting W.C. Shecky on top in this race becomes virtually automatic. The Tandem was W.C.S and HOT DRMS. This time HOT DRUMS comes in second. Not surprising in view of what we have learned. In Las Vegas the \$2 Quinellas would pay \$17.50. Nothing to write home about, but a fair return for a minimum risk. The key to W.C. Shecky's comeback win lies in the second fraction. In its last encounter with HOT DRUMS, W.C.S. LOST ground in the area where it usually makes a strong move. (SEE TRIP HANDICAPPING VIA THE RACING FORM) In all of WCS's races showing this happened only TWICE before. We had every reason to suspect that whatever trouble was encountered in the last race would be avoided today. Even though NO TROUBLE LINE was shown in the FORM, it is obvious that W.C.S. was impeded in the second fraction of race of June 12.

We come now to a TANDEM RACE where finding the winner requires digging a little deeper into the win energy pattern of the track - in this case Hollywood Park- AND doing a little home work in the area of statistics regarding repeat winners by class level at the track(s) you play. \$10,00 claiming is the low end at HOLL. At this level very FEW horses repeat a winning effort. Tandem winners almost never repeat. Hence, winning this race becomes almost automatic if one has the nerve to actually eliminate from WIN contention both EMMET KAY and ZAPALLAR. However, if you take the trouble to follow these two, you will get some big win prices down the line.

Under any circumstance. the WINNER, Chevo, was our third choice BEFORE eliminations. Had you thrown out EMMET KAY, the Tandem Race winner of June 30, Chevo would have been a choice regardless of your treatment of Zapallar.

Further, Chevo and the ultimate place horse in this match-up, NIGHT COMMAND, had the 2 best SUSTAINED PACE Ratings. The HOLL Track Profile for this period showed that Sustained Pace was of paramount importance in the Brohamer Regression Model. This was not an Exacta race at the track but the Las Vegas \$2 Quinella paid \$53.90 Note that what class there was in this race belonged first to Night Command. While it appeared on the surface to be OLD class, review the time of its June 29th race. 1:09:4 for 6 furlongs. A considerably faster pace than that encountered by any of the other contenders. Even beaten 7 lengths NIGHT COMMAND managed a 1:11:2, two fifths off Emmet Kay's 1:10:4. Today Night Command is dropping AGAIN. Take a long look at Night Command's 7 furlong race of June 2nd. Even beaten by  $5\frac{1}{2}$  lengths at the SIX FUR. portion of that race gives it a time of 1:10:2 against a pace of 1:09:4. That 1:10:2 six furlongs is the Key to using the horse as a contender. Do not be fooled by lengths beaten alone. Look at the Pace of the Winner. Long shot winners seldom come out of the blue. There is usually a reason. In this case Night Command's Place finish should have been no surprise to any of us.

TANDEM RACE #4

I make no claim to having the WINNER of this race. I did, however have the EXACTA which paid \$267. I used the three horse box of Al's Big Time, Costume Belle and Mind Storm. Yampa was easy to eliminate because it DID NOT COME within .72 of the total energy required for this race. The problem was Danish. Using Richard Quigley's class-elimination factor, (Chicago Seminar Workbook) Danish would have been immediately eliminated since it had never done well at anywhere NEAR to-day's level. Still, it had the BEST Pace figures. It took a lot of soul searching to throw it out. The alternative would mean playing a FOUR HORSE BOX, or, doing what Glenn Smock did, Key Boxing Costume Belle, who seemed destined to Place, with the other three.

### TANDEM RACE #5

To WIN this race one would have to believe the Pace figures and ignore eliminating by CLASS. It would also require some imaginative pace line selection to go back to Keep On Strumming's Maiden win. I personally did neither so I DID NOT HAVE the winner OR the Exacta/Quinella in this race played in Las Vegas. However, thanks to Glenn Smock reminding me of my own injunctions, I got out of the race with a \$12 Place Payoff on Bronzed Emperor. In the Tandem with PAMS McALLISTER, Bronzed becomes the key horse in today's race. I played it that way. Just before post time Glenn asked me to reaffirm my conclusion that BRONZED was the Key horse to the Quinella in this race. Based on the precepts of this manual I did so. Then he asked, "Have you looked at the odds?" Since this race was on TV we were able to see the odds board and ascertain that Bronzed Emperor would pay as high as \$14 to place. Having already made our three horse Quinella wager we immediately put a place bet on Bronzed Emperor. He came through, paying \$12 to place. So, for an \$8 investment (Based on \$2 bets) we lost ON THE QUINELLA BUT ACTUALLY MADE \$4 PROFIT.(based on \$2 bets)

\*\*\*\*\*

The object lesson here is to remember our money management study in the basic manuals. Horses going off at 9-2 or better are excellent PLACE opportunities if they are your top ranked contenders. Not following this procedure is no sin and losing this race would be no disaster. We had already won 4 straight Q's at Pimlico. If you have trouble deciding WHEN to make a place bet when the odds are right, I would suggest using the key contender in Tandem Races as the basis for backup wagers - But ONLY when the odds on that horse warrant. In the five races we have done so far, three of them, - This race, Chevo and Mind Storm, all payed VERY WELL to Place.

Bowie horses going to Pimlico receive a .61 PLUS adjustment. Using Phase III, this adjustment would go onto all three fractions. With ULTRASCAN, the BOWIE horse would get a .61 OPEN ADJUSTMENT and a 205 THIRD FRACTION ADJUSTMENT; or one/half the the third fraction energy variation (.41) between the two tracks.

But alas, this now becomes an exercise in futility. After 71 glorious years BOWIE has done shut down. I have a memento given me by PIRCO'S Tom Buell: a vial of dirt from the finish line. Bowie is no longer. A melancholy shadow hangs over the land of the Black-Eyed Susan.

The 3rd at HAWTHORNE is both a Tandem Race and an example of TRIP HANDICAPPING via the Racing Form. It is a study in Second Fraction Moves, which Sam Sedgwick called TURN TIME. Even allowing for GET THE SILVER'S trouble line in its last race, the horse never failed to make a positive move between the first & second fractions in seven of the ten races showing. In order to win the Q in this race some judicious Class pareing would be required. BETTERBARACEHORSE would be eliminated because of its \$3,500 APV. Royal Majesty would be the KEY horse because it is 140% of purse. It would take some nerve at first, but TWO good efforts in a row by Sir Silent Sam, usually portend an off-form effort next out, especially in three year olds at THIS level. By eliminating Sir Silent, and Better-etc, the true contenders left are ULYSSES RULER, ROYAL MAJESTY AND GET THE SILVER. You're only looking at a \$21 Quinella, but the race is an excellent example of Turn Time and brutal surgery on contenders by class and form. 'No-class' horses will bite you badly once in a while, as did Keep On Strumming at Pimlico. But most of the time class factors will win out. Ironically, Class is especially important at LOWER CLASS tracks.

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The 9th at Hollywood is a good example of a DOUBLE TANDEM Race. Explosive Passer, Paskanell and Bare Minimum came out of one Tandem. Sovereign Star and Donner Party out of another, with Royal Councillor being the non-Tandem threat.





Lotsa Honey, the Tandem Winner of the latter group, is not in today's race. This leaves the race wide open for either Royal Councillor or Donner Party, since none of the horses in the first Tandem are truly competitive. Adding fuel to Donner Party's claim is the fact that it ran the seven furlong portion of the June 26th Mile in 122:2, a half length better than Royal Councillor. Since today's race IS at 7 furlongs, we used the stretch call as the final time in rating both these horses. We could have gone back to Donner Party's actual seven furlong race of June 14th when it ran the distance in 121:4. That would be using antibiotics where aspirin would do.

(For using stretch call as final time see Chicago Seminar Workbook, pgs. 19-20-21)

Regardless of what we did Donner Party and Royal Councillor would emerge as our top two. They won and placed for a \$125.50 Exacta or a \$2 Quinella paying \$ 21.90.

Just HOW did the public let Donner Party go off at 6.30 to 1? Well they made Bare Minimum the favorite off a six furlong 2nd place finish where it lost ground between the 2nd Call and the Finish. With an EXTRA furlong to go today this would seem less than wise. And it proved to be in fact. Bare Minimum finished last. Or perhaps the public was counting on 2nd leading rider Chris McCarron. He, too, finished last, right along with his horse.

DONNER PARTY, in close contention outside the early leaders, took command in the upper stretch and drew off in the final furlong. ROYAL COUNCILLOR vied for the lead between rivals to the stretch and could not finish with the winner. PASKANELL lacked early speed, saved ground around the turn and finished strongly. SOVEREIGN STAR, awkward gaining stride and shuffled back after the start, recovered quickly but failed to seriously menace. EXPLOSIVE PASSER showed little. BARE MINIMUM vied for the lead to the stretch and was finished.

The snow-ball effect of a Tandem Race and of Tandem Races within Tandem Races is clearly demonstrated by observing just the past performance lines of only a few races.

- 1: W.C. Shecky emerges from a 2 length defeat
- 2: by Hot Drums to win next out. Apoxonu leaves Tandem
- 3: company and wins at 22 to 1.\*The Tandem of Costume Belle, Al's Big time and Mind Storm come home in an order entirely different from the original Tandem Race.
- 4: Emmet Kay, 2½ lengths out in the Hot Drums Tandem Race, leaves the Tandem to win 18 days later and then to lose next out to Chevo from the same Tandem in which Chevo was ¾ lengths back.
- 5: Bronzed Emperor, out of contention in its first Tandem Race with Pams McAllister, qualifies in the next Tandem Race and becomes the key horse in a lucrative Exacta-Quinella.

And so it goes. Examine just the few races we have reprinted here and you'll see races within races in which a Tandem winner can be thrown out of win contention and where lucrative win and Exacta-Quinella prices can be had by properly boxing the remaining contention.

Note that in only ONE past performance line showing did a Tandem winner REPEAT. That was CHEVO, July 12 and 20, 1984. There is always the exception that proves the rule.

\* In case you're wondering about APOXONU'S win on June 27, we quite naturally used the pace-line of its May 30th race - the one we would have logically used to make her a contender in the Tandem Race of June 9. But THAT figure was derived from a Tandem Race with the winner of the June 9th Race, Hot Drums, so APOXONU was out of Win Contention, by the precepts of this Manual, against Hot Drums on June 12



Thus we can observe a snow-flake becoming a blizzard; an echoed yodel causing an avalanche, a prairie wind resulting in a tornado; a sea-breeze escalating into a hurricane.

The key-word is escalation.

It is a lay-term that has become one of psychiatry's favorite buzz-words. A mental health practitioner looks at a relatively normal individual and projects that person's behavior into a potential for the particular psychosis he/she would develop under given environmental stimuli. Handicappers should observe a horse's potential in the same manner. Stimulus, stimuli, stimulate are common words not exclusive to the psychiatric community. Their ultimate definition is to goad, to give incentive; to rouse to activity; to provide an agent that causes (temporary) increase in the organic structure producing heightened ability.

If you refuse to believe that horses are only human then you will be immune to the lessons of this Manual. If you fail to heed our injunction to become a race-horse psychiatrist analyzing the past-performance charts of all the contenders in the races you handicap, you are depriving yourself of the handicapping success that is clearly within your grasp. Your equine patient is far more predictable than a human patient because it will not lie to you. Human patients invariably do - even at \$50+ an hour.

Those of you who object to our psychological commentaries as the "crap" you have to wade through to get to the meat of the methodology are denying yourself the main entree in the feast of victory over the game - even as a child may eschew the meat course in order to have double-portions of dessert.

Our friend of the ULTRASCAN Manual, Dr. Al X, a prominent psychiatrist, initially felt this way, probably as a result of the messianic status that accompanies the acquiring of an M.D. But he is the physician who promptly healed himself when he accepted the underlying,

counterpunctual theme that makes the Methodology a symphony rather than an easily hummable pop tune. This has resulted in him becoming one of our most prolific users.

Your own win proficiency will rise in direct proportion to your digestion of the materials in the manuals as a holistic process rather than as a pharmaceutical prescription for a specific ailment. When you begin to accept the Methodology as YOURS rather than as mine, you will utilize its full potential - and not before. That which we embrace as our own will always serve us to the degree that we serve unto it.

Even as our own children are just a little better than anyone else's, so will be our OWN method.

You did not subscribe to a recipe book with step-by-step instructions for making a souffle. You DID subscribe to a condensation of the sum total of knowlege of a group of accomplished chefs who share with you the insights and techniques that led to their success. In addition you receive a dozen grade AA eggs and a packet of herbs and spices.

Now you make the souffle.

The alternative is to turn to the advertisements in the Daily Racing Form and pick out the first system that appeals to you.

You are sure to get a recipe book in return for a given sum of money.

The problem is that if your souffle falls you won't have had any say in the matter; nor will you know why. If it turns out to be a momentary culinary delight you still won't know why, nor will you be able to promise your table guests the same result next time.

Better to be the beneficiary of your own skills and insights than a supplicant at the altar of a foreign diety. Moses ascended the mount and gave out the contents of the tablets. But he stayed across the river, leaving the tribe to practice the ten commandments on their own in the promised land he never entered.

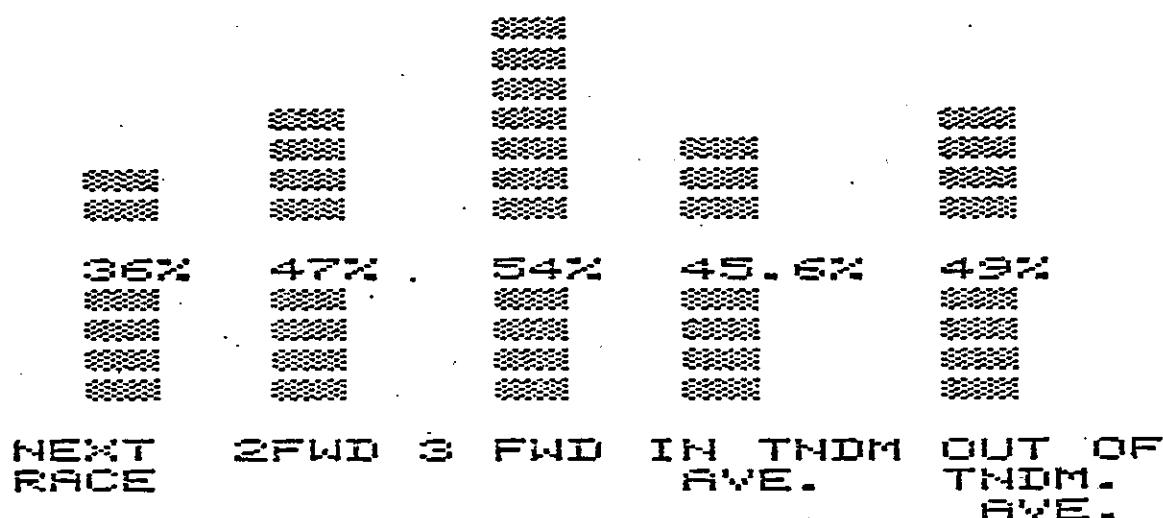

The striking example presented by APOXONU, repeated many times during every meet at each track we studied, leads us to the conclusion that a mythical stable(see STABLE METHOD, Yellow Manual) composed of horses that finished within four lengths of the winner in one or more Tandem Races, would be an optimal investment base. To expand on this potential we charted such candidates for the next three races after the first Tandem Race showing in their past performance charts.

Here is the near-spectacular result:

# HORSES TO WATCH. TANDEM QUALIFIERS NEXT THREE RACES

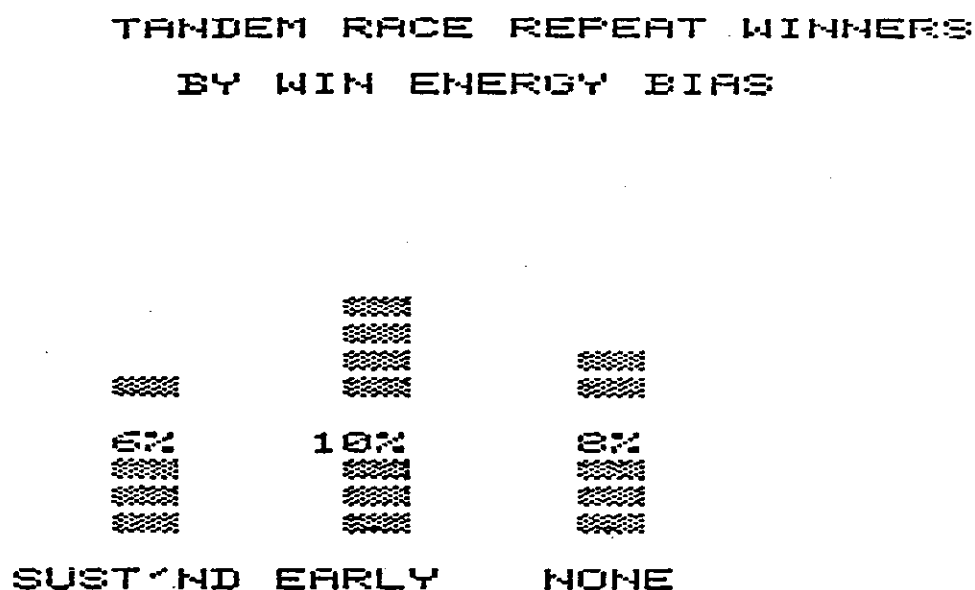
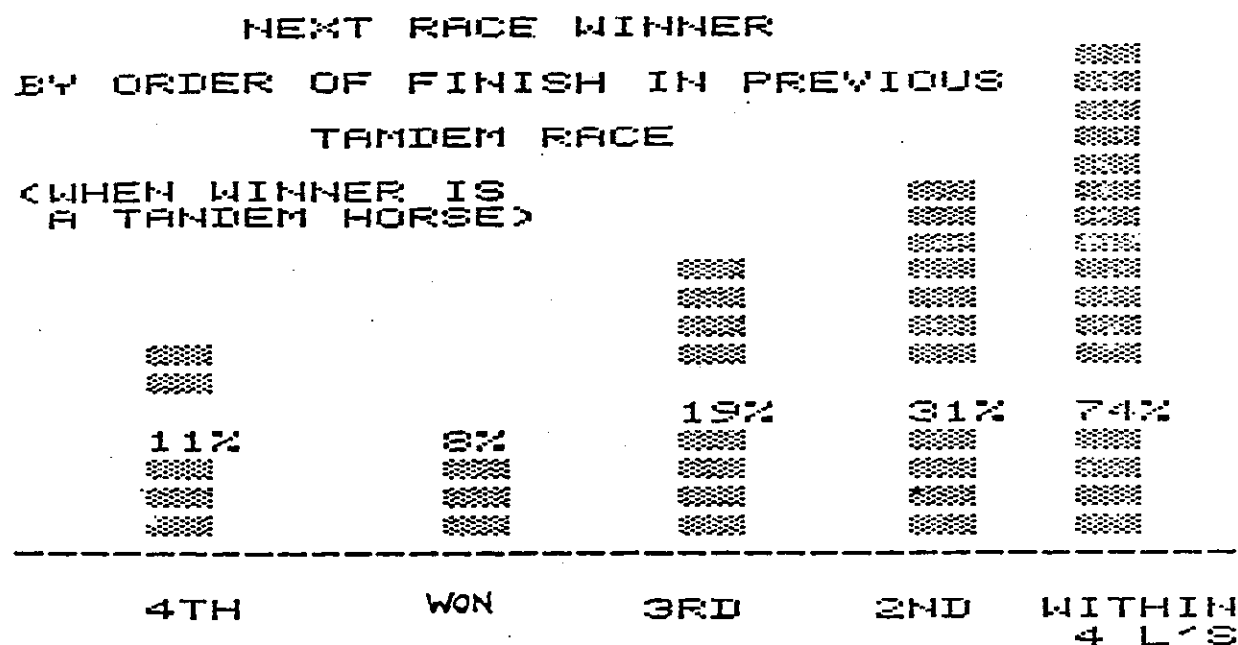


## WIN POTENTIAL-NEXT 3 RACES

As you can see, 36% won their next race and 54% won within the next three races for an average of 45.6% winners for EACH of the top THREE tandem qualifiers within three races of the initial Tandem Race.

Further, as in the case of Apoxonu, Tandem Race Horses

That WON a race within two back of the Tandem Race, WON within the next three starts when they DID NOT face any of the Tandem contenders. Their In-The-Money average is even more significant: an average of 67%!



## S U M M A R Y

### I

Following the top finishers (or within four lengths of the winner) in a Tandem Race produces an optimal number of BEST BET situations.

### II

Since Tandem Race winners seldom (only 8% of the time) repeat next Tandem Race we have virtually a text-book handicapping situation that is easily evaluated using the procedures in this Manual.

### III

We have but two foreign entities to evaluate:

- a: A superior horse that was not in the Tandem
- b: A Tandem Horse with Chronic seconditis-a perennial FOLLOWER. Both are easy to spot. Both are prime candidates to be a wheel horse in an Exacta or Quinella Box.

### IV

Tandem Race winners-and placers who finished within less than one length are the least likely to win:

- a: BECAUSE their handlers will instruct their jockeys to run the SAME KIND of race as last.
- b: But the handlers of the two following horses will try a new strategy.
- c: This is ESPECIALLY significant if the Tandem Race was won with an ENERGY PATTERN contrary to the current Win Energy bias of the track.

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JOE E. LEWIS had a night-club-act One-Liner that went:

"People say I follow the horses. That's a lie!  
I don't follow horses. I follow horses that  
follow horses..."

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Joe may have been a better handicapper than he thought. In light of what we have learned from our Tandem Race research, following horses that follow horses may well be the best Spot Play in Thoroughbred Handicapping.





# THE TANDEM RACE AS A BASIS FOR TRIP HANDICAPPING VIA THE RACING FORM

TRIP HANDICAPPING, as introduced to the State of the Art of Handicapping by Paul Mellos, and described by Andy Beyer and Dr. William Quirin, is a tedious, time consuming effort which, if properly done, can be most beneficial. For those of us who are unable or unwilling to develop this skill under actual race-track conditions, there is a viable alternative which we will now introduce. First, take a hard look at the following blow-ups and see what can be deduced from looking at the internal fractions shown in the Racing Form:

TANDEM RACES PROVIDE A PERFECT Training ground for the development of our skills as Trip Handicappers via the Racing Form. Once acquired this skill can then be applied to ALL races.

Our brand of Trip Handicapping merely requires that we mentally Enlarge the PP chart of the horse in question and then recreate the race fraction by fraction. To assist you in learning this process we have provided some mechanical blow-ups of some of the past performance lines we have used in the body of this manual.

Morry's Champ is our first case in point. This horse shows ONE WIN in the ten races reproduced. The win was at a mile and one-quarter, but more important, the animal won the mile and one-eighth portion of that race which was on the TURF. If this is not immediately perceivable to you, bone up on your basics: The stretch call is ONE-EIGHTH of a mile from the finish line at ALL DISTANCES. By using the stretch conversion program as out-lined in the CHICAGO SEMINAR WORKBOOK, we can assign a time of 1:49:4 to Morry's Champ's mile and one-eighth. The variant that day was 20. Poly Test, on Nov. 5, 1984 ran the same distance on the turf in 1:50. The variant was also 20. Poly Test's BEST mi-1/8th was run on January 3rd, 1985 in a time of 1:48, but the variant was only ten. Match winner shows mi-1/8th times of 1:48 with a 14 daily variant, and 1:48:1 against an 11 variant. In seven of its ten races MORRY gains between the first and second fraction. This is a good sign. Its in-the-money record of 33.3% reflects both its ability to make that move and its

inability to finish with sufficient velocity to be a win threat against either Poly Test or Match Winner whose records show an in-the-money percentage of 72 and 59.2 respectively. Further, MORRY has won but 11.11% of its Turf races while Poly Test has won 27.2% and Match Winner 22.7%. Poly Test made a gain between the first and second fraction in half the races showing exactly the same as Match Winner. (we include races in which no ground was lost) Each time both Poly Test and Match Winner made their traditional second fraction move they finished in-the-money. Not so Morry who lacks the sustained pace power so necessary to win on the turf. Thus, our first lesson in this aspect of Trip Handicapping is to evaluate a contender's capacity to make a move (or maintain velocity/position) between the first and second calls. The second step is to determine a horse's capacity between the second call and finish. Practice.

CHEVO offers another example of this procedure. In its two wins it negotiated only ONE of the moves: gaining from the second call to finish. In its last race, despite a trouble line "pinched back start," It was even between the first and second fraction and made almost a ten length gain from second call to finish. Both readings are indicative of top form. Coupled with a speed rating of 90 in a losing effort, CHEVO emerges a top contender in today's race because it is on the IMPROVE, whereas the two horses which, on the surface, show superior rankings, Emmet Kay and Zapallar may have already peaked as demonstrated by their recent wins which at this claiming level are not likely to be repeated.

Emmet Kay's win is an excellent example of a Tandem Race in itself.

Witness its performance in the Tandem of Hot Drums, et al.

This race portended the win next out at a \$23 mutuel.

Our focus here is on the race of June 12. It is a \$10,000 claimer, same as the race Emmet wins. He is 14 lengths off at the first call. We don't need a trouble line to tell us that this was too far back for the horse to win. The fact that EK closes almost 12 lengths from the 2nd Call to the finish confirms that the animal is coming into TOP FORM. It did not close on tiring speed since it earned a 90 speed rating. The move portending the \$23 win on June 30 was legitimate. This marked the first time the horse ever put together TWO good efforts in a row. So, it was no surprise when the horse failed in the CHEVO race next out.

THE TRIP NARRATIVE OF ZAPALLAR AS TOLD by the Racing Form, presents an entirely different scenario. This horse only had ONE BAD performance in the nine races displayed. That being the route (1-1/16th) on Feb 2nd, the first race after the horse was claimed by Mike Mitchell. Since the animal shows no evidence of being a router we can discount this race completely. If we go back to the 6 1/2 furlong trip of January 18th we can see ample evidence that it is ready for a win. Raising the horse to \$20,000 and putting it in a route was a maneuver to get it out of the claiming jail and to cloud its potential. On February 7th it fulfilled its promise. Because the horse has previously put together several good efforts in a row - all be they at a lower class track- we were reluctant to discount its chances in the Chevo race.

Zapallar is NOT the kind of horse to include in a profitable stable. Its abilities are too clear cut and, barring injuries, it should win more than a fair share of its future races at fairly LOW mutuels.

It is interesting to note that ZAP is also one of the few horses we've seen that has never been in a Tandem Race.

Pace-line selection and adjustment dilemmas will disappear; class distinctions will become self-evident and the all-important concept of match-ups will be firmly implanted in your mind.

Try thinking of a field of horses as a therapy group; yourself as the therapist. How will each animal react in intercommunicating with the others? In conducting human groups one can soon predict almost to the word what each patient will say under a given circumstance. You are about to be surprised at how well you are going to be able to do the same thing in predicting the behavior of your horses.

## It's Chief's Crown and Cordero on Top in Travers Stakes

There was little early speed in this Travers, and Cordero resisted the temptation to gun Chief's Crown to the lead when none of the seven starters wanted it.

"Those horses were walking at the start," Cordero said. "If it had been up to me, I would have gone on early, but I had my orders (from Laurin, who visited the rider in the jockeys' room Saturday afternoon to make sure there was no misreading of the plan)."

I have blown up the small section of the ensuing article on the Chief's Crown triumph because it capsulizes much of what we have been saying about Pace and Match-ups for a number of years. The key phrases are: "-resisted the temptation to gun Chief's Crown to the lead—", and "-had my orders from Laurin —to make sure there was no misreading of the plan."

This was a TANDEM RACE. The Tandem was Chief's Crown and Stephan's Odyssey—who had bested Chief's Crown twice before. Odyssey needed a horse of Chief's Crown calibre to do exactly what Laurin told Corero NOT TO DO: Rush to the lead, in order to win. This time Chief's Crown was not suckered. It stayed off the pace affording no opportunity for Stephan's Odyssey to close on tiring early speed

Since the front runners in this race had little sustaining power, Chief's Crown's even pace running style was tailor-made for a victory. While most Stakes Races are less than optimal betting prospects pricewise, they present excellent examples of the importance of pace and the perception of match-ups. This race and the 1984 Belmont (Swale on the lead but winning with SUSTAINED pace) are Text-Book examples.)

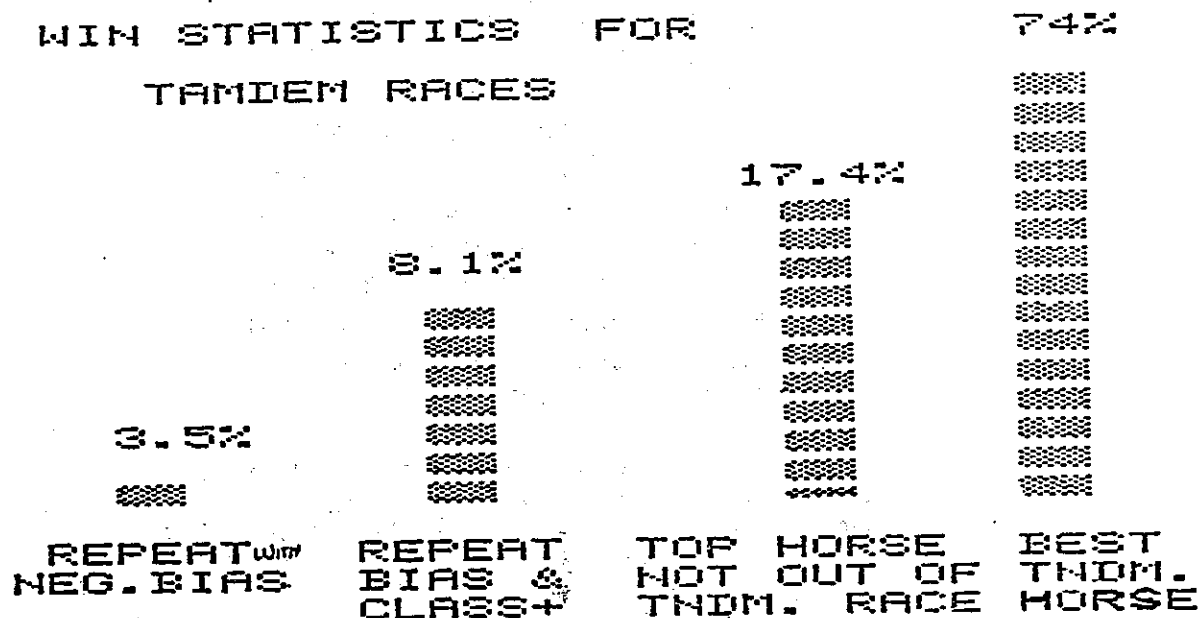
Turkoman, who had never had the lead in his life, went to the front, followed by Don's Choice and Skip Trial, with Chief's Crown and 8-5 second choice Stephan's Odyssey taking up positions in the second file.

Darrel McHargue, riding Turkoman, regretted that his mount took the early lead. "I didn't expect to be there," McHargue said, "but nobody else wanted the lead. They ran the first quarter in :24 1/5. in California, that would be like galloping."
